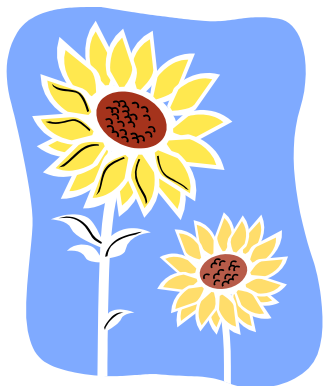

- 03/55 AA's Three Legacies of Recovery, Unity and Service are turned over to the Fellowship of AA-at-large by its old-timers at 20th Int'l. AA Conv. in St Louis, Missouri.
- 04/35 **Akron**, Ohio—Bill D., a lawyer, leaves the hospital and becomes AA #3.
- 07/43 **1st** summer session of Yale Univ. School of Alcohol Studies begins with Bill W. and 6 other AA's attending.
- 08/40 **The** first AA groups are founded in Dayton, Ohio and Richmond, Virginia.
- 10/41 **Fort** Worth Press publishes an anonymous letter from a founding member of the Texas AA group.
- 11/79 Ernest Kurtz's, NOT-GOD: A History of Alcoholics Anonymous is published.
- 12/55 **AIS.**, writes the Responsibility Pledge and 10,000 at the AA Int'l. Convention in Toronto, Canada, take it for the first time.

# COR MEETING MINUTES

June 21, 2004

Patrisha W. chaired meeting. She opened the meeting with a moment of silence, followed by the Serenity Prayer. Chairman read May 2004 minutes, motion made to accept May's minutes, seconded, none opposed. May's minutes were approved.

CSO Liaison Report: Mary E., distributed customary literature and gave her report, and here are some of the highlights: The CSO table at the 2004 State Convention did well and the revenues will help to offset the group contributions which were somewhat down this month. The CSO manager is looking into E-Commerce as a way to increase revenue for CSO, this is just in the investigative stage and the CSO board will monitor the progress prior to making any final decision. Also, CSO is looking into the use of the new digital yellow pages which will enable the user to click on the CSO number and bring up the WEB page for CSO. The financial advisor of the CSO board (Paul B.) will be giving a quarterly report from CSO's balance sheet and convey information to COR's about the assets and liabilities, and answer any questions. The first quarterly report is due September 2004. The CSO liaison went on to report that CSO's prudent reserve has increased to \$20,000 dollars and the goal is \$36,000 which is expected to be reached in another 2-3 years. Weekend in S.A. brought in \$23,323.57 dollars. A complete financial report of the conference will be given to the Board next month. Mary E. also noted that many safety measures have been incorporated concerning finances at CSO in the recent 1 ½ years. An example is having two signatures on any transactions over \$250.00 dollars. Certificate of Deposits are being used to build up the prudent reserve, despite the current low interest rate, and is not readily available for use. The accounting program being used at CSO (Quick Books Pro) has also incorporated action such as entering all sales at the time of the sale, and there are no longer hand written receipts at the CSO office. A member of the fellowship is helping to keep accounting on the right track and is available to the staff to answer any questions when they arise.

CSO office manager report: Char announced that due to contributions from groups, and Weekend in S.A. she was able to hire an office assistant. Her name is Emily and she has great organizational skills. She started June 21, 2004 and Char would like to thank everyone for supporting this endeavor at CSO. There was some discussion on fundraisers for continued support of CSO such as Pot Luck dinners, dances, and, or, other traditional means. Some not so traditional but creative, members have donated personally made items such as hand made pillows with the Serenity Prayer which did well in sales, and, hand made stained glass items. All of which go to help support CSO and their activities, which in turn serve the local and surrounding groups. Other methods are as simple as to announce that Nightcap subscriptions are available at group meetings, and using the CSO contribution envelopes at sobriety birthday meetings.

Telephone Service Report: (TSC) Kim C. noted that volunteers are needed to fill vacant slots. She deferred any further reporting until the TSC meeting set for on 6/28/04 at 6:00pm at CSO office. She is requesting that groups appoint a telephone liaison to represent each group and urged any interested to attend the upcoming meeting. Her contact number is (210) 885-1383. Again as in previous Nightcaps the Telephone Service Committee is for:

- 1) The sign up of interested parties for phone service
- 2) Technical training for new volunteers on how to use call notes, and call forwarding
- 3) Discuss how to handle various types of calls
- 4) To generally share stories and provide support for one another

Old Business: There was some discussion on the outreach program generated some time back in November 2003. This facet of COR was used to stimulate groups to appoint COR's and involvement with CSO. There has been ongoing activity to gather and update group information so that CSO may be kept informed of group activity and new contact numbers. The second item was to discuss COR's scope of duties.

New Business: The financial audit that Char requested in 2003 was donated to CSO. An audit is normally quite expensive, a big thanks goes out to Wayne B. for providing this service to CSO in 2003. The Board of Trustees decided to not pursue any action for further audits because of the enormous expense. Patrisha W. is stepping down as chairman of COR meeting. Secretary, Don G. will fill in as chairman as per previous COR meeting being designated alternate chairman. COR members would like to thank Patrisha W. for hard work and dedication as past acting chairman of the CORs. Leon also announced that he is stepping down as the COR of Goliad Group and introduced Joe L. as the new acting COR representative of Goliad Group.

Basket was passed.

There will be a sharing session quarterly and a new format to H and I committee. All interested are asked to attend at Serendipity on June 13 at 1:30. DCMs need to get the committee a list of GSRs to enhance communication. Alt. Chair, Tomi A., (in attendance) will participate in the Delegate's report workshop, as Mary Ellen will be at work. Mary Ellen will be assisting at the TX State Convention with Treatment Workshop.

## District Reports

**1-A Todd H**—1-A is preparing a district wide speaker list. Sign up lists were distributed for SAMSO H&I committee's back up meeting list. Sign ups for bridging the gap and CFC temporary contacts at the Area level were also distributed. They have been approached about doing a workshop on chairing meetings and how to be a good group servant. 1-A will be selling tickets to a dinner at the October conference, hopefully to offset room costs by all attending.

**1-F Laura G** – 1-F will be hosting the delegate on the 26<sup>th</sup> at Grupo Pasos, 1305 N. Flores. Translation equipment will be available. Laura attended the Hispanic State assembly in Fort Worth.

**16 Chris E.** 16 discussed contributions for the Area assembly in October. Groups are selecting members for service committees in group conscience. Members have asked about communication with other SAMSO districts (flyers, etc.)

**17 Ed. E.** 17 will do hospitality at the October Area conference. Flyers are being distributed to GSRs present.

**19 Kris S.** DCM is helping getting groups service work connections. The Frontier Group will no longer be affiliated as H&I.

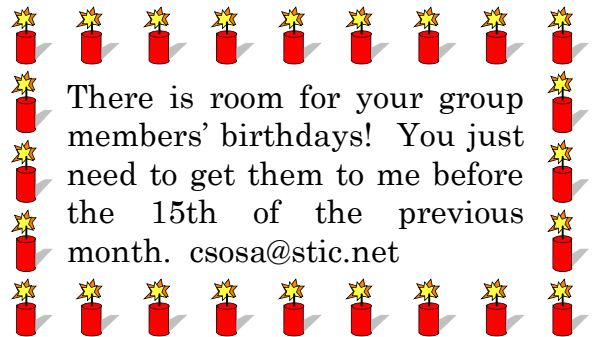
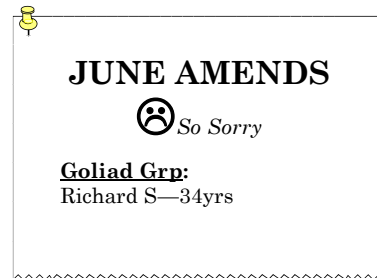
