EDITORIAL PAGE

Growing up I went to an Episcopal church pretty regularly. But neither my mother nor father attended. I learned that adults didn't have to go. The rule was that I had to go, until I got confirmed - then I could make my own decision.

Church was very boring to me. They spoke a funny language like "Thou art this and thou art that". I really didn't know what they were talking about. I spent most of the time trying to keep up with the correct body positions: sit; kneel; stand - sit; kneel; stand (I guess it had some exercise value). Anyway, I memorized a bunch of prayers, got confirmed and basically stopped going - except for special days like Christmas and Easter.

In high school and college I learned a lot about evolution. It seemed to make more sense than Adam & Eve and Noah's ark and that kind of stuff. For a long time, I figured God was right up there with Santa, the Tooth Fairy, and the Easter bunny: just a bunch of made-up stuff to make kids feel better.

Later on, I read a book that said that early man, frightened of his environment, created God to explain the unexplainable. Now this really made a lot of sense to me. And since I was so "educated," I certainly didn't need a God - after all I had science.

I remained with this belief most of my life but always the question kept coming back, "Is there a God?" And every time the question came up, I would ponder it, sometimes for days, always coming up with the same conclusion - I just don't know.

Finally, I came up with my own philosophy by which to live. It basically went like this: I'm going to live my life to the fullest. I'm going to have as much fun as possible - anything goes as long as I don't hurt anybody. That last part was a safety clause. Just in case there was a God I wanted to make sure I didn't burn in hell for eternity!!

After working the 12 Steps of Alcoholics Anonymous, I know now, without a doubt, that there exists a living and loving God. That is now the most important fact of my life. Today, I am a "grateful alcoholic." I used to get upset when I heard people say that. But I am grateful. The life I have today would not exist if booze hadn't driven me into AA.

Today I have a life far better than the one I used to have: less fear, less anger and no guilt. I have more "true" friends than ever before. Today, I have a God that watches over me and takes care of all my needs. It is an absolutely wonderful way to live. This may be the only disease that you can emerge from better off than before you got it!!

If you're an Agnostic or Atheistic, or know someone who is - please don't give up on AA. The process of the Steps will produce the belief. This program works for everyone who earnestly seeks it. Like our Big Book says, all you need is the willingness, honesty and open-mindedness - God will do the rest.

COR MEETING

April 19, 2004

Patricia W. chaired meeting. Patricia opened the meeting with a moment of silence, followed by the Serenity Prayer. Chairman read the 12-Traditions.

Chairman read March 04 minutes, motion made to accept March minutes, seconded, none opposed, March minutes approved.

CSO Liaison, Mary E., distributed customary literature and gave her report. CSO secretary, Char was unavailable for tonight's meeting and Mary E. delivered Char's report via-office memo; Char sends her apologies to COR representatives but she had a scheduled meeting to attend concerning activities for the upcoming State Convention in June 2004. Char recognizes her responsibility for being financially accountable for CSO but is asking for groups to make a stronger effort to conduct fundraisers. This is in response to 1) building a prudent reserve and 2) to hire a part-time office assistant for 4 hours, 5 days a week. CSO is being manned by a skeleton crew and the current salary being paid is for one secretary. Lloyd has been putting in a lot of time at CSO, but he has other endeavors to pursue, and his time is limited. Char notes that volunteers are helping at CSO, but she feels that certain duties should not be left to volunteers and needs the help of a part-time assistant. There are no current funds to sustain a part-time assistant which is estimated at \$9,600 a year. The Board of Trustees is scheduled to look into the matter later in the year to decide a course of action. She reminds everyone that CSO use to have three paid employees, but she is sure CSO can be manned with herself and a part-time assistant, if given the opportunity with a paid part-time assistant. Lloyd will be gracious enough to cover for her at times. Char also noted that new literature in large print is out such as "As Bill Sees It," "Living Sober," and "Came To Believe." Also, Char is reminding everyone that the new AA meeting directory is coming out soon. If any groups have changes to report, please call CSO ASAP so they can be noted and included in the next printing.

This year's A.A. in S.A. went well considering the weather, but attendance was somewhat low.

COR's were notified the new phone service representative is Kim C. The telephone report was given by Lloyd via memorandum. Kim C. apologized for not attending this month's COR meeting, but she will be able to start her attendance in May 2004. She mentioned that March is a transition month for her. Not all of the time slots are filled yet but she is expecting to achieve this by the end of May 2004. She is notifying all interested parties that the TSC (Telephone Service Committee) will meet at CSO on the first Monday of the month @ 6:00pm beginning in May 2004. The monthly meeting will consist of: 1) To sign up interested parties for phone service; 2) Technical training for new volunteers on how to use call notes, and call forwarding; 3) Discuss how to handle various types of calls; 4) To generally share stories and provide support for one another. To contact Kim C. if interested in signing up for phone service, or, if you are a current volunteer with questions: Kim C. @ (210)885-1383 or email Kim @ kcrawf27@yahoo.com. Kim is requesting help with night-time slots such as weekdays from 9:00pm to 9:00am and weekends. Also Kim is setting up written instructions for volunteers, chairpersons, etc., and is looking for a web site for TSC calendar and will present these to the CSO Board members in May 2004 for approval.

CSO is also reminding everyone Group 12 is having an area wide fund raiser on May 22, 2004 for the upcoming State Convention in June on the 18th, 19th, and 20th.

Old Business: Chairman, Patricia W. asked for additional volunteers for outreach of AA groups to encourage groups to select COR representatives to attend COR meetings and get involved in CSO related activities. Three additional COR reps. graciously volunteered to help with outreach. Also, under old business, was the scope of COR representatives duties. The current standards from GSO are, a COR should have at least 2 years sobriety. A discussion ensued and a motion was made to set guidelines for elected COR reps. for acceptance of individual groups. The motion consisted of COR reps. having at least 90 days sobriety and should sign up for COR with guidance from a sponsor. The motion was seconded, none opposed, motion passed. Current COR reps will deliver this issue to their respective groups with hope of acceptance but as always, autonomy reigns at the group level.

New Business: Chairman, Patricia W. brought an issue to light regarding SAMSO's recent changes. SAMSO has been in the process of changing its structure, but in the process the monthly sign up for hospitals and institutions has lost support and or otherwise there has not been enough volunteers present at the monthly meetings to sign up to chair these meetings. Apologies go out to all that have worked hard and been present or willing to attend these meetings. A discussion ensued and a motion was made to approach GSR's, and DCM's to take on the responsibility to select monthly chair persons (GSR's) for hospitals and institutions at their monthly meetings. Motion seconded, none opposed, motion passed. GSR and DCM's will be approached by CSO liaison, Mary E., and Patricia W. to discuss the possibilities for their acceptance.

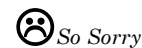

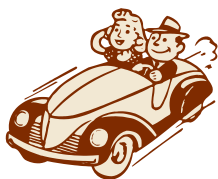
