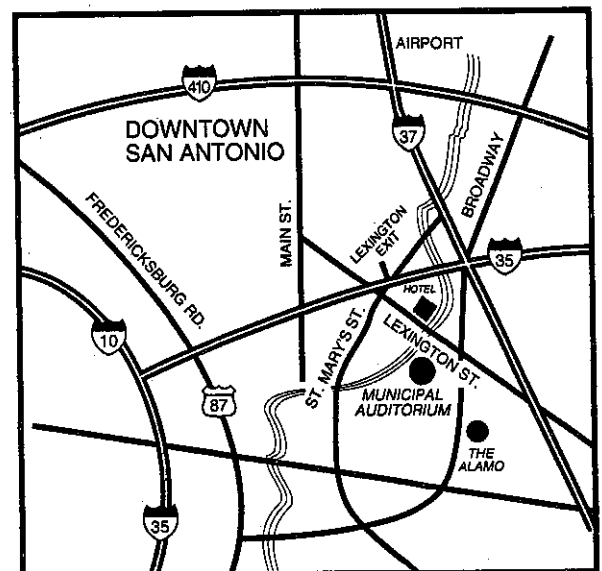

GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING MINUTES
March 15, 1992

The meeting was called to order at 6:35 p.m. by Jan T., Chairman, with the Serenity Prayer. Linda K. read the 12 Traditions. Five new General Service Representatives (GSR) were introduced. There were 58 persons present. The previous meeting minutes were accepted as printed in the March issue of the NIGHTCAP.

The Financial report was presented by Genny G. After-hour telephone duty volunteers were obtained (see list below).

Committee reports were as follows: Hospitals & Institutions: Charlie R. asked for volunteers to carry the message to various H&Is (see list below). Public Information: No report given. Jail Committee: Flynn J., Chairman, expressed the need for more volunteers to help carry the message to the jail meetings.

Old Business: Debbie G., Weekend in SA with AA Convention Chairman, reported that 353 people have registered so far. Sandy requested all GSRs to sell door prize tickets at their meetings for the Convention; food donations are still needed for the hospitality room at the Convention.

The Nominating Committee had five candidates nominated, who were presented by Richard G., for the CSO Board vacancy. Vote was taken and Knut H. won the election. He will serve through December 1993.

There was no new business.

CSO Report: Anley H. reported that 821 telephone calls were received at CSO in February; 613 at the office and 208 after hours. He also reported that 79 postcards were mailed to GSRs as a reminder for the GMM. Also 1526 copies of the March issue of THE NIGHTCAP were mailed on February 26.

SA Interdistrict Report: Richard G. said that if any group wants a workshop to please contact their DCM.

Announcements: Pilo announced the anniversary of the Santa Fe group to be held on May 2 and said more information will be forthcoming. John P. announced two upcoming conventions that need volunteers--AARP and the American Connectional convention. Julie announced that District 1-A is having a picnic on April 26 in honor of Mac McC. The pre-General Service Conference will be held in Victoria April 11 and 12. The next General Membership Meeting will be held on Sunday, April 26 because Easter Sunday falls on the third Sunday.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 7:20 p.m. with The Lord's Prayer.

FELLOWSHIP OF THE SPIRIT

The meaning of "Fellowship of the Spirit" was exemplified in a Houston, Texas, funeral home on an October, Monday evening.

We gathered together on that occasion to pay our respects to our friend Avery who was taken from us 3 nights earlier. The night he died he had spoken at an AA meeting and afterwards had dinner with his sponsor. He was killed in a traffic accident on his way home. The accident caused by an individual who was arrested for DWI.

Had he not been killed, Avery would have celebrated 21 years of continuous sobriety on November 14th.

Nearly 400 AA's, Alanon's, and other friends came together to say their goodbys. We were filled with anger and frustration and yes, some of us, hatred for the individual responsible for Avery's death. We were shocked and stunned. But most of all, we were heartbroken over the loss of our Avery. Words cannot express the sadness that prevailed over us that night.

A "Bill W." type service was conducted for Avery. For those who are not familiar with this type service, it is much like a "Podium Participation" meeting, which is structured to allow the grieved an opportunity to express their feelings about his or her departed friend.

It was during this meeting that I witnessed the real meaning of "Fellowship of the Spirit." While we were sharing our remembrances of Avery, an abatement of the negative feelings of anger, frustration, and hatred seemed to enter us. It was as if our "Higher Power" came to us with a spiritual washcloth that cleansed the hearts and souls of every one in that funeral home chapel. During the service there arose from the gathering, the healing sounds of chuckles and laughter as we shared personal instances about our relationships with Avery.

During the evening it became apparent that our memories of Avery left no room in our hearts for anger, frustration, and hatred. Our memories of Avery were of his love of life and unique display of friendliness for everyone, especially newcomers to AA. He will always be remembered by the way he welcomed newcomers or when he met anyone for the first time. He would say, "Hello, my name is Avery, I don't believe we've met"!

By the end of the service we were mostly at peace with our Higher Power regarding Avery's death. Our hearts were still heavy with grief and sorrow but the previously held negative feelings had vanished.

We gave Avery his 21 year sobriety chip that night even though it was a month early. The "Fellowship of the Spirit" was with everyone of us when we said our

final goodbye to Avery.

I came away from that "Fellowship of the Spirit" not only with a cleansed heart, but a prayer that if the individual responsible for Avery's death ever reaches out for AA help, I would like for him to be met by someone like Avery who would say, "Hello, my name is Avery, I don't believe we've met."

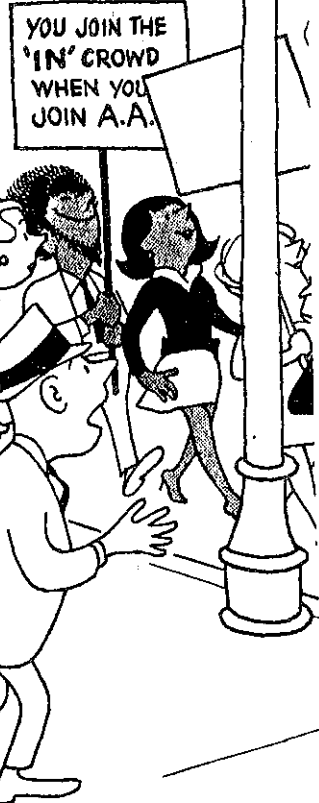
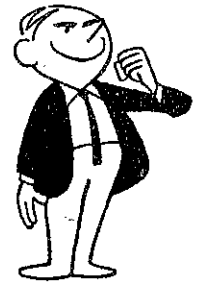
The Fourth Tradition

Each group should be autonomous except in matters affecting other groups or A.A. as a whole.

But wherever two or more alcoholics are gathered together to practice A.A. principles, it is an A.A. group if they say it is.



And you are a member if you say you are!



A member who does any amount of traveling finds the A.A. spirit much the same everywhere. But part from this inward kinship, there are vast differences among groups. Here, the traveler finds three members discussing the Steps in somebody's living room; there, 300 listening to speakers in a church auditorium. In one part of the U.S., respectful silence greets the speaker who begins, "My name is Ann, and I am an alcoholic." In another, everybody happily shouts, "Hi, Ann!" And in many other places, she may introduce herself with her full name—at a one-hour meeting or a 90-minute meeting. In each neighborhood in every part of the world reached by A.A., the local group is free to work out its own customs.

As always, freedom brings responsibility. Because each group is autonomous, it's up to each group to avoid any action that might harm A.A. And there *have* been such actions—or this Tradition would be unnecessary. "Implicit throughout A.A.'s Traditions," Bill W. wrote, "is the confession that our Fellowship has its sins. We admit that we have character defects as a society and these defects threaten us continually."

Blown up to multiple size, the Big Ego may inspire one group to take over all the public information work for its area, without consulting any of the other local groups. Once the group has decided, "We have all the answers," the lid's off. The group may then decide that, let's say, the Eleventh Tradition is an outdated technicality: "This is a competitive age! We're going to come right out and give A.A. some good, vigorous promoting!" To the general public, this one conspicuous group is A.A. Its antics reflect, not only on the ignored neighboring groups, but on the entire Fellowship.

In a way, the Fourth Tradition is like the Fourth Step: It suggests that the A.A. group should take an inventory of itself, asking about each of its independently planned actions, "Would this break any tradition?" Like the individual member who chooses to make the Steps his or her guide toward happy sobriety, the wise group recognizes that the Traditions are not hindering technicalities—they are proved guides toward the chief objective of all A.A. groups. . . .

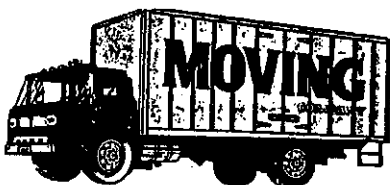
