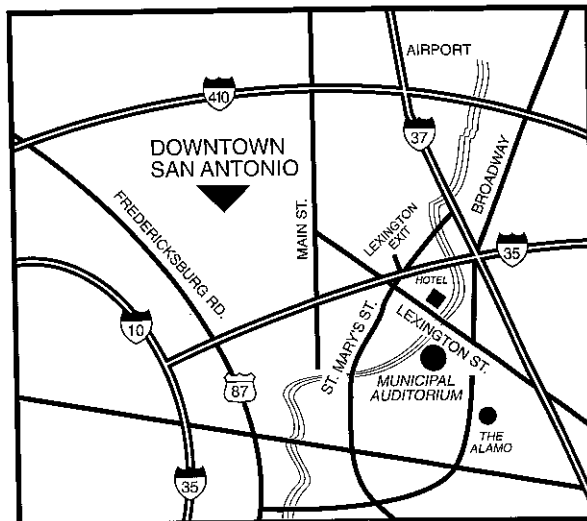

GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING  
MINUTES

March 20, 1994

The meeting was called to order at 5:30 p.m. by Dee S., Chairman, with the Serenity Prayer. Louanne S. read the Twelve Traditions. There were 26 persons in attendance including all CSO Board members. The sign-in sheet was circulated and attention was called to all the literature on the front table.

New CORs were invited to introduce themselves. The only one recognized was Chris representing the Schertz-Cibolo Group. Betty Z. read the Central Office Representative Guidelines to remind the CORs of their respective duties. The new Board Member, Susan B., appointed to serve out the remainder of Russ B.'s term, was introduced and welcomed. The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as printed in the NIGHTCAP so were not read.

Joe C., Finance Officer, presented the financial report in a thorough and concise manner. The only question from the membership was how CSO could generate more income. Joe suggested that the AA groups increase their contributions since originally, group contributions were CSO's only source of income. In the absence of Bonnie R., Erik C., Vice Chairman, gave the monthly CSO Report. This was followed by Renee Z., Convention Chairman, giving her progress report and Denise explaining the raffle and encouraging all CORs to sell the tickets. Erik C., Interdistrict Liaison, had no report.

Raymond F., trustee in charge of after-hour telephone volunteers, asked for and got volunteers for the month of April (see below).

Old Business: Dee S., announced that CSO will no longer be open on Saturdays because of lack of interest and that this service was not being used. She also explained the mail order service that CSO has to handle any group's needs who cannot get into the office during regular business hours.

She also reminded everyone that we need to find a new meeting place. Club 12 was suggested as a good location.

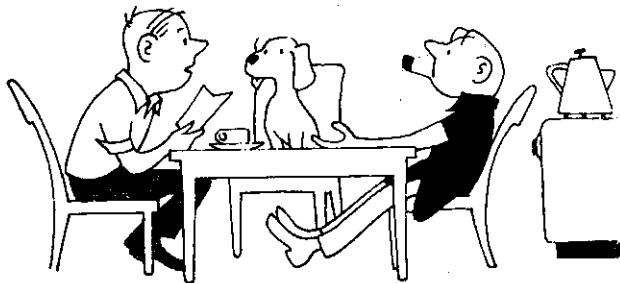
EACH GROUP SHOULD BE AUTONOMOUS EXCEPT IN MATTERS AFFECTING OTHER GROUPS AS A WHOLE.

A member who does any amount of traveling finds the A.A. spirit much the same everywhere. But apart from this inward kinship, there are vast differences among groups. Here, the traveler finds three members discussing the Steps in somebody's living room; there, 300 listening to speakers in a church auditorium. In one part of the U.S., respectful silence greet the speaker who begins, "My name is Ann and I am an alcoholic." In another, everybody happily shouts, "Hi Ann!" And in many other places, she may introduce herself with her full name - at a one-hour meeting or a 90-minute meeting. In each neighborhood in every part of the world reached by A.A., the local group is free to work out its own customs.

As always, freedom brings responsibility. Because each group is autonomous, it's up to each group to avoid any action that might harm A.A. And there have been such actions -- or this Tradition would be unnecessary. "Implicit throughout A.A.'s Traditions," Bill W. wrote, "is the confession that our Fellowship has its sins. We admit that we have character defects as a society and these defects threaten us continually."

Blown up to multiple size, the Big Ego may inspire one group to take over all the public information work for its area, without consulting any of the other groups. Once the group has decided, "We have all the answers," the lid's off. The group may then decide that, let's say, the Eleventh Tradition is an outdated technicality "This is a competitive age! We're going to come right out and give A.A. some good, vigorous

promoting!" To the general public, this one conspicuous group is A.A. It's antics reflect, not only on the ignored neighboring groups, but on the entire Fellowship.

In a way, the Fourth Tradition is like the Fourth Step: It suggests that the A.A. group should take honest inventory of itself, asking about each of its independently planned actions, "Would this break any Tradition?" Like the individual member who chooses to make the Steps his or her guide toward happy sobriety, the wise group recognizes that the Traditions are not hindering technicalities -- they are proved guides toward the chief objective of all A.A. groups.



**DAVID B.** died March 3. His sobriety date was January 21, 1986. He was a member of
