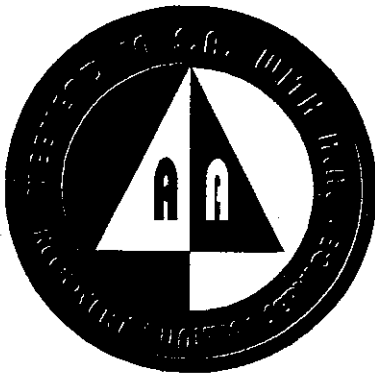

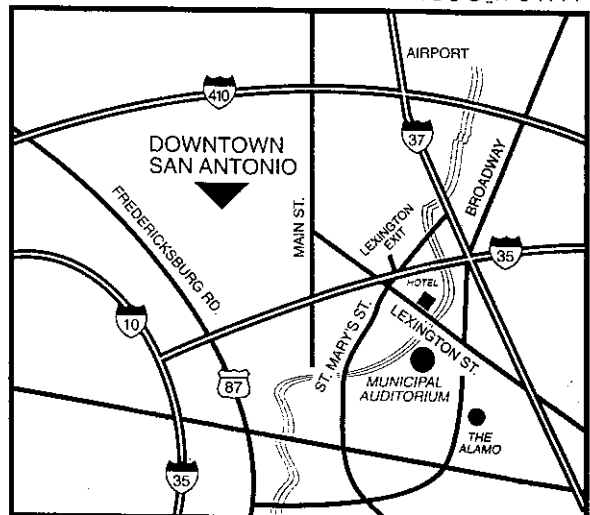

**Rituals at the Close of Meetings**  
 (Reprinted from Box 459 Feb-Mar 1996)

A recent letter from a member of the Fellowship brought up the question of what often follows the closing prayer at some A.A. meetings. The tag "Keep coming back, it works" has been used, in some areas, for years, but now the phrase "if you work it" has been added in many places. And that has progressed to "so work it you're worth it." The A.A. member theorizes that the longer version originated outside the Fellowship. He thinks the idea "it works if you work it" places the emphasis on an individual's own power to stay sober. "Please remember," he writes, "that Doctor Bob said that he never took credit for his sobriety, but gave credit to God. For myself, I believe I do the footwork but God is the one who 'works it' for me."

He also pointed out that in the A.A. Fellowship and in the Twelve Steps, we use "we" rather than "you" and we make suggestions only. The Steps describe what other A.A. members have found effective; they don't prescribe what an A.A. member should do. As the Big Book says, "Here are the Steps we took." But, the A.A. continued, when we say "you" we are preaching. The phrase "So work it!" is an injunction to someone else to do something. He further comments, "This encourages a holier-than-thou attitude and is an attempt to moralize to the newcomer."

Some people--especially newer members--may believe that this longer tag is an A.A. custom. But in some places, old-timers have decided to reverse the trend. At one group on the west side of Manhattan, member Jim W. and others shared spontaneously during

the regular Wednesday meeting that they didn't believe the longer tag was in the best interests of Alcoholics Anonymous. A number of the group's longtime members stopped saying the longer tag that night. No formal action was taken, and no announcement is made, but gradually the longer tag is phasing itself out at this group.

Jim explains why he doesn't like the longer tag "so work it you're worth it": "Its not an invitation, it's a directive. When I came into the Fellowship, I was simply asked to keep coming back. I was told that if I just kept coming to A.A., everything would be all right. I felt a hand in each of mine and a warm squeeze--I was offered a gentle invitation."

Jim said, "I've had the experience of stopping after "it works" and dropping my hands, only to have someone hold on tighter and refuse to let go. It's like i was being punished for not knowing the secret handshake. But other people have said, 'Oh good, you don't say it either!' A lot of people are glad that we're not saying the whole tag.

"I don't like the idea of magic formulas. It's like some secret we all have to know. This is a life and death situation. I don't like it when people get cute with A.A."

Of course, many groups are happy with the longer tag, while others in the same area are not. Ultimately we should remember that our Fourth Tradition guarantees the autonomy of every A.A. group, and the General Service Office offers no opinions on this matter.

# WHAT IF YOU WERE OUT OF TOWN AND REALLY - REALLY NEEDED A MEETING?

The chilling winds of the changing seasons in December seemed to cut so ever sharply into that deep inner emptiness and ever present loneliness that I felt. Within the first six months of being in the program I was quite "shaky" spiritually, emotionally, and physically. Try as best I could, I just could not hide it, or make it go away. It was the midst of the Holiday time of year, and by God's loving grace, a lot of prayer and meetings, and by unyielding sponsorship I had somehow been able to walk through Thanksgiving. Now the Christmas season was present, and I longed to be with family, but separation and pending divorce were the realities of the situation at that time. Getting out of the car, I hurriedly walked inside the Club seeking its warmth and safety, and looked around the room to see if my "friend" was there with whom I could share an idea.

There he was as usual happily talking with some others at a table over coffee. Bill H. was a crusty, street smart kind of a guy with a heart of gold, and eighteen years of sobriety. Over and above the Book, he knew how it worked on a very practical and realistic level. "Bill," I said as I came up to the table, "I need to ask you about something." He excused himself from the others, and we moved to another table. "Bill," I said as we sat down, "I've been thinking about going to Dallas to see my aunt and other kin folks over the Christmas holidays." He leaned forward with an apprehensive look about him, and questioned my intentions. I shared my thoughts and feelings as openly as I could, and he could see that I was intent on going. I still remember the one thing that he stressed. "Just remember, if it be there, or most anywhere you go, if you need to find out where there is a meeting in the area, you can drop a quarter in any pay telephone, call the operator, and they will connect you with a Central Service Office Hot Line for AA, and they will help you. They will even come and get you, and take you to a meeting and take you back. Just remember Central Service Office Hot Line for AA." (My memory being what it was at the time, I wrote it down on some scrap piece of paper and stuck it into my wallet.)

The week flew by spent in preparation, and after a short one hour flight I was there. It was great to see them all, and to experience the joy of some of that 'homey' feeling of being surrounded by those who love you just because you are you. But something was missing, and given a couple of days it seemed to grow. Deep inside I knew what it was. Since the beginning, I had been making at least two meetings a day, and here I had not made one in two days. I missed the sharing and caring of the Fellowship. Bill's words came to mind, "Call the Central Service." I picked up the telephone and called, and the answering service took the telephone number from which I was calling. In a very short time someone from the area called me back. Honestly, I cannot recall the name of the person I spoke to, but we talked for about ten minutes. It was a great relief. And yes, just as Bill had said, they even arranged for someone to come to my Aunt's house in Garland, just outside Dallas, to take me to a meeting, and to bring me back afterward. While I was there they asked how long I was going to be in town, and gave me a booklet directory showing where and when other meetings were held. They said that this directory was compiled, and provided by their Central Service Office for just such occasions as this. They also shared that this was also the place where they obtained all of their literature and birthday chips, and suggested that upon my return home I might want to go by and see what all the San Antonio Central Service provided. Mentally, I made note to check it out.

Now it is over five years later, and I am grateful to say that there have been many opportunities to return what was so freely given to me at that time. I was introduced to 'phone duty', and this service work has allowed me to meet numerous visitors to our area, and to direct them to meetings. It has also allowed the referral of many 'Twelve Step' calls for those who are reaching out for help. Yes -- Upon my return I did visit our Central Service Office, and found there a vast array of pamphlets, books, tapes, and other literature, or as Bill called them, tools, but I found more. I found warm caring people who firmly believe that CSO is a vital link in the chain of recovery. Bill brought the point home when he said, "What might have happened if they had not been there? Who would you have called?"

Or as another Bill (W.) said, *"When anyone, anywhere reaches out for help, I want the hand of AA always to be there and for that: I am responsible."*

"When reflecting on these things, why should not each of us tell himself : "Yes, we A.A.'s were once a burden on everybody. We were "takers". Now that we are sober, and by the grace of God, have become responsible citizens of the world, why shouldn't we now about-face and become "thankful givers"! Yes, it's high time we did!"



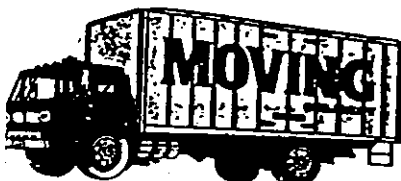
