Recently, I had the opportunity to listen to Dr. Bob's last message given to the First International A.A. Convention in Cleveland, Ohio on Sunday, July 30, 1950. While his message was brief, the importance of his distilled wisdom rings true today. I can't imagine what joy would well up in him were he to know that we can double our attendance and accessibility by meeting virtually and in person. I'm also including a link where you may listen to him.

Dr. Bob's Farewell Talk

My good friends in A.A. and of A.A.,

... I get a big thrill out of looking over a vast sea of faces like this with a feeling that possibly some small thing I did a number of years ago played an infinitely small part in making this meeting possible. I also get quite a thrill when I think that we all had the same problem. We all did the same thing. We all get the same results in proportion to our zeal and enthusiasm and stick-to-itiveness. If you will pardon the injection of a personal note at this time, let me say that I have been in bed five of the last seven months and my strength hasn't returned as I would like, so my remarks of necessity will be very brief.

There are two or three things that flashed into my mind on which it would be fitting to lay a little emphasis. One is the simplicity of our program. Let's not louse it all up with Freudian complexes and things that are interesting to the scientific mind but have very little to do with our actual A.A. work. Our Twelve Steps, when simmered down to the last, resolve themselves into the word's "love" and "service." We understand what love is, and we understand what service is. So let's bear those two things in mind.

Let us also remember to guard that erring member the tongue, and if we must use it, let's use it with kindness and consideration and tolerance.

And one more thing: None of us would be here today if somebody hadn't taken time to explain things to us, to give us a little pat on the back, to take us to a meeting or two, to do numerous little kind and thoughtful acts in our behalf. So let us never get such a degree of smug complacency that we're not willing to extend, or attempt to extend, to our less fortunate brothers that help which has been so beneficial to us.

We, the General Service Board, want to thank you for your patience and support as we navigate our way forward after the unanimous decision by the Board that a change in leadership would be in the best interest of AA going forward. The decision was a painful and difficult one for each of us to make, and we acknowledge how deeply it affects the Fellowship. We also recognize how unprecedented this was and that the Fellowship wants answers. Within the bounds of maintaining the confidentiality of Board deliberations and protecting the reputations of all involved the Board would like to take the opportunity to inform and communicate with the General Service Conference and the Fellowship to continue to foster trust, cooperation, transparency, and accountability.

In a General Service Board trustees' planning and sharing session, numerous accounts of conduct by the Board Chair, Linda Chezem, that were concerning and creating disharmony, were brought to the attention of the Board. The concerns included:

- operating independently of the Board, Board policies, committees, and corporate Board structures,
- micromanagement of trustees and employees, and
- making unprofessional and inappropriate remarks about past and current trustees and employees.

A number of Board members witnessed this behavior, which violated the organization's code of conduct policy and was a detriment to our unity and ability to conduct business. Linda Chezem denied any wrongdoing and offered to resign if the Board asked. After deliberating, the Board unanimously voted to accept her resignation as Board Chair and Class A Trustee on January 29, 2023.

Given this unprecedented situation, the Board is currently reviewing its code of conduct, so there is a transparent way and process in the future for Board members to address code of conduct concerns in a way that is in keeping with AA principles, including Concept V – which states in part, "The traditional "Right of Appeal" should also permit any person in our service structure, whether paid or unpaid, to petition for the redress of a personal grievance, carrying his complaint, if he so desires, directly to the General Service Board. He or she should be able to do this without prejudice or fear of reprisal."

While the vehement response to such an unusual and traumatic event is understandable, what we wish to emphasize is that this reaction from the minority is not informed. We as a Board wish to reiterate in the strongest possible terms that this decision was taken as a collective body and based on irrefutable patterns of behavior that were proving to be detrimental to the functioning of the General Service Board and the Fellowship of Alcoholics Anonymous.

Karen M introduced Trustees Present

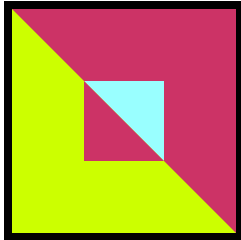
Motion to approve minutes from February. Minutes accepted with provision that content of Archives Committee report be included.
