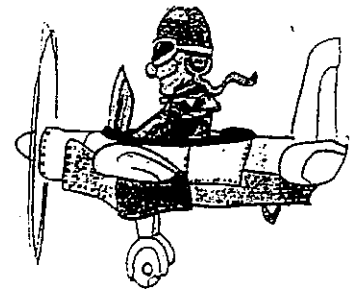

The answer was "yes" there is a paper trail of all items sold by means of a written receipt given to the customer and a copy kept at CSO, normal written bills from public works, etc, and bank statements. All business information is given to a CPA. That is a Certified Public Account, who does the financial statement provided by CSO each month. The financial data maintained on a computer at CSO is backed on a regular basis. The office no longer uses a custom written accounting program. the current program is off the shelf, which provides technical support if needed.

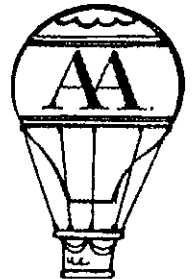

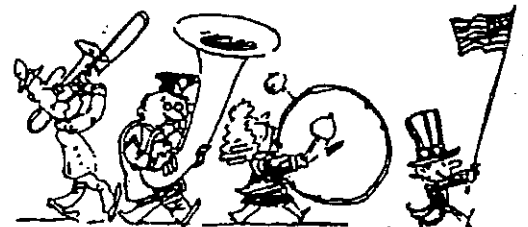

HOW DID YOU FIRST HEAR ABOUT AA? (Before you ever attended your first meeting)

God's work is mysterious. I was in a bar I frequented lamenting yet another DWI and trip to jail. A woman I've never seen walked up, she introduced me to a friend in AA I went to my first meeting. I never saw either of them again after that meeting.

Terri...Group 12...10/31

Before I ever attended by first AA meeting, my knowledge of AA was nothing. My first encounter or knowing the meaning of AA was through a client. I had to take a client to a meeting and sit through it with him. After the meeting, I knew less about AA.

Linda S...Woodlake Group

An AA member on a visit from California got physically ill, he went to my family doctor. He told the Doc that he was an alcoholic. The Doc told him of a drunk he was unable to keep sober, that drunk was me. The visitor told him about AA and left his Big Book. After reading the Big Book the Doc called me. He told me never to call him again for anything unless I was ready for something that would really work. The morning of Feb. 6, 1957 I remembered what the Doc said, I was ready, alcohol had quit working. I made the call. This was the result of the Doc reading the Big Book and talking to the visiting AA member. The visitor took his book to the hospital and the Big Book was read to me (I could not read then). Later he took me to my first meeting. That was over 41 years ago.

Jim W....Group 12...Feb. 6, 1957

I first heard about AA when I went to my first treatment center. I was told if I wanted to salvage what was left of my life, AA would show me the way.

Thomas Mc...Group 12...12-27-93

While I probably *heard* of (but *learned* nothing of) Alcoholics Anonymous ten years before I sobered up, I had absolutely no understanding of AA. I can't even remember who told me of AA, but it was not passed along with any suggestion that I could benefit from AA. The only thing I could figure out was that AA was where one *had* to go if one was an alcoholic. Sort of like prison, I guessed. In late 1986, when my wife started in Al-Anon, she began strongly suggesting that I talk to someone from AA, bringing me a Big Book to read. I flatly refused; you see, I really wasn't an alcoholic. In early 1987, giving in to her strongly worded suggestion (threats), I talked with a representative of a treatment center, but I don't remember if AA was discussed. It wasn't until May, 1987, when the "wheels fell off," that I sought the treatment center's help in putting them back on. It was then that I began to *learn* of AA.

Joe C...Stahl Rd Group...May 6, 1987

I first heard about AA from a drinking buddy who felt "I" really needed some help. The AA seed was really planted from the Oprah Winfrey Show. Oprah was doing a 2 week series on alcoholism and families of alcoholics. After watching a few episodes, I knew I needed help. (and I went to Club 12 the next day).

Meeting called to order by Ed D at 6 pm with a moment of silence and the Serenity Prayer. SWTA delegate, Roger L was introduced; he made a very interesting and thorough report as to the actions of the General Service Conference.

Kimberly read the Concepts. There were no new GSRs or DCMs present.

Announcements: (A) Ed D: SWTA Summer Workshop will be held in Llano.

(B) Glenn C: Passed on from Ronnie S, SWTA alt. delegate, an announcement as to the Southwest Regional AA Service Assembly which will be held October 16-18 in Amarillo, Texas. Related that Linda S, who works for a travel agency, and who is the GSR for the Oblate Group, has discovered that due to competitive air fare discounts, those wishing to attend may obtain round trip tickets from San Antonio for \$109.00. This would be approximately one half of what it would cost for driving reimbursements, and would result in substantial savings for the groups sending GSRs. These flights must be booked as soon as possible, it is currently unknown how long these discounts will be available. CSO Liaison to SAMSO- David W: Several slots for telephone service work are open for the month of August, and especially on weekends. Kim, Phone Service Committee Chairman, can be reached at 522-0488 for groups or members wishing to fill these slots. There will be a workshop at the Goliad Group on Sunday, Aug 16, which will cover telephone service and other topics. It should begin after 1 pm. They will have a BBQ at 6 pm.

SAMSO Liaison to CSO-John S: Board looked into City ordinance laws as to smoking, and the decision to have CSO as a non-smoking facility will stand. The attorney for CSO went over the charter and by-laws, and it was decided to allow them to stand as they are currently written. Nominating committee will begin to look for (6) candidates with over (5) years sobriety to stand for election to the board in November.

THE PI/CPC COMMITTEE does health fairs and conventions, speaks to at-risk middle school children, professional groups, does mail-outs to doctors, institutions, and the clergy, contacts local radio and TV stations.

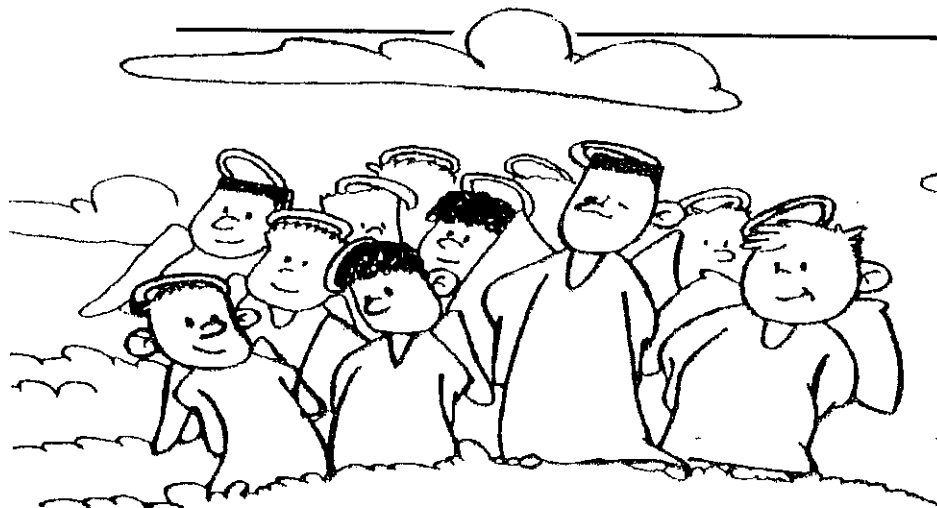
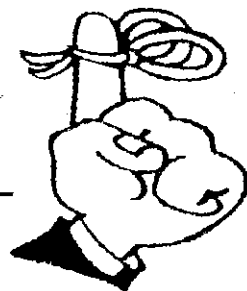
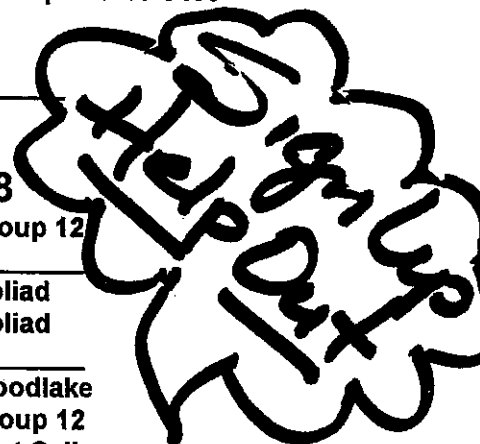
