

## A MESSAGE FROM YOUR DCM

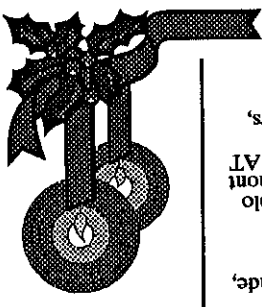

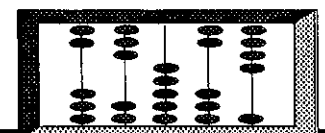
