COR MEETING MINUTES - NOVEMBER 15, 1998

Call to Order - Moment of Silence - Serenity Prayer: Dewey S

COR Guidelines: Micheal S

Functions & Services of CSO: Dewey S

New CORs: Chuck - Windcrest Group

Financial Report: Wayne D - explained the financial statement and the format change. It has been simplified with only the current month shown. All other months are available at any time from CSO and will be accumulated over the year by the groups with each monthly statement. Liddy suggested adding a budget column, this will be considered. Noel said if added, it should be on a separate page. Kim also requested a budget column be added for comparisons. The CSO as a business is doing well. We are within 5-8% of our annual budget and that's pretty accurate for any business. We maintain a three month prudent reserve. We are non-profit, so any annual profit is adjusted for by ordering more or less inventory (literature, gift items, etc.) It was pointed out that CSO, unlike many businesses, owns all its inventory outright. So, our inventory shows up as an asset on the balance sheet. We also own all our own fixtures and furnishings, which are also assets. The CPA has recommended taking some depreciation on our furnishings, which will probably be figured in soon. There were five pay periods, so salaries are up this month. Group contributions are down. We received \$2000. in proceeds from the Texas State AA Convention. We expected more, but it was split with SAMSO. Burt C commented that recent problems arose when the CORs voted to leave the budget format alone, then the next month we were told about a new format. Wayne said his goal is to give the groups the financial information in as concise and meaningful a way as possible. His intent in changing the format is, making it easier to read. This is based on the recent questions from Burt and others. he repeated his willingness to provide the groups with whatever information they want. Past confusion about the financial report seems to have focused more on the format than the numbers. Noel commented that whatever format is used, it must be consistent for comparisons. Wayne emphasized that any AA member is welcome to attend the CSO board meetings and become better informed as the finances and operation of CSO. Also, he and other Board members and CSO staff will sit down and go over the CSO records with any concerned member or help them understand the financial statement.

Phone Service Committee: Kim C reported the November calendar filled in spite of the cancellation of the October COR meeting. About half the calendar is filled at this meeting, so this month operated only by word of mouth. There have been requests for an update of the Twelfth Step Volunteer list. We will be reactivating the call-down again to update. We will probably do that once or twice a year. Anyone who wants to help; call Kim. Those currently doing phone duty and find a bad number were asked to make a note of it and give it to Bonnie at CSO or Kim. The phone calendar for December was passed around. December has extra holidays, so there is an urgent need for volunteers to answer the after-hours phone this month. CSO will be closed December 24-25, also New Year's Eve. Call Kim - 522-0488 to volunteer or for more information.

Old Business: Elections were held for three new CSO board members to replace the three rotating out. Leaving are Ed E, John S, and Stewart S. Dewey read the experience of each candidate and let the CORs know that all candidates met the qualifications. Each candidate told briefly why he would like to serve on the board and gave a synopsis of his service history. The election was held and the new board members are: Bill H, Virginia B and Kim C.

New Business: Announcement - Club 12 is having a Casino Night on Saturday, Nov 21st at 9 pm to midnight.

The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.

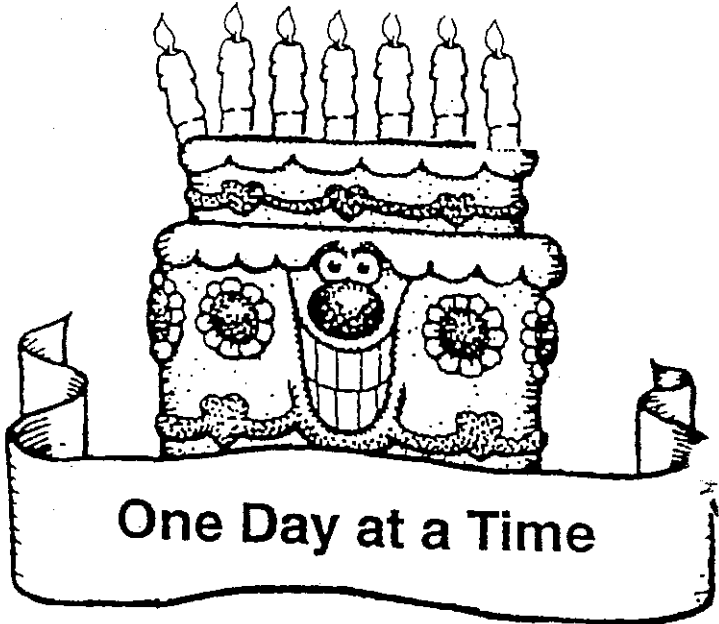

2 *Don't sit around brooding. Catch up on those books, museums, walks, and letters.*



3 *Skip any drinking occasion you are nervous about. Remember how clever you were at excuses when drinking? Now put the talent to good use. No office party is as important as saving your life.*



4 *Don't start now getting worked up about all those holiday temptations. Remember—"one day at a time."*



5 *Be host to A.A. friends, especially newcomers. If you don't have a place where you can throw a formal party, take one person to a diner and spring for the coffee.*



6 *If you have to go to a drinking party and can't take an A.A. with you, keep some candy handy.*



7 *Enjoy the true beauty of holiday love and joy. Maybe you cannot give material gifts—but this year, you can give love.*



8 *Keep your A.A. telephone list with you all the time. If a drinking urge or panic comes—postpone everything else until you've called an A.A.*



9 *Don't think you have to stay late. Plan in advance an "important date" you have to keep.*



10 *"Having had a . . ." No need to spell out the Twelfth Step here, since you already know it.*

12 *Go to church. Any church.*

Meeting called to order by Ed D at 6:45 pm with a moment of silence and the Serenity Prayer. Liddy S read the Traditions. New GSR: Jan of the Freedom Group.

CSO Liaison to SAMS0-David W- The CORs just held their elections for the three rotating positions on the board. They had seven nominees, and elected three to serve 1999 to 2000. They are: Virginia B, Bill H and Kim C. Kim passed around the service slots sign-up sheet for phone duty to the GSRs. Barbi H, GSR of Colonies North, stated she was concerned as to the report that the COR had made. He reported that board member had made a comment which indicated that the board was not responsible to the groups. David said he could not accurately respond to the report as he was not at the meeting, nor did he hear the comment. Later in the meeting, to clarify, David said he did not want to seem unresponsive to the question. He explained the board is responsible for the day to day operations of CSO, and make the decisions which can and do affect this. He read the purposes and functions of CSO. He said at times there seems to be confusion on the part of some as to the relationship between SAMS0 and CSO, and he stands willing to clarify this relationship to anyone.

SAMS0 Liaison to CSO - Bill T - not present - no report

Chairman's Report: SWTA Winter Workshop will be held in McAllen and we will have fliers available at the next SAMS0 meeting. The two agenda items which were to be voted on were passed in Kerrville.

Secretary's Report: Glenn C - Showed a 12 month calendar of events which is being compiled to show when events within the Southwest Area of Texas and within the local SAMS0 area are occurring. He asked that all those GSRs present to indicate on the calendar when their group celebrates their anniversaries. If they did not know the exact date, or if they knew of any GSR who is not present, please call him at 342-2330 and let him know so that this information can be entered into the calendar prior to publication at the end of December. This calendar will be used by the groups and districts for the planning of events and workshops in the San Antonio Community next year. As there was no regular SAMS0 meeting last month due to flooding, there are no minutes to be approved. Bill T was to have brought the copies of the Steering Committee Minutes from last month, but he is not present. Minutes of this month's steering committee are on the table. Will have copies of the SWTA Winter Workshop with maps to McAllen on the back available for the GSRs at the next SAMS0 meeting.

Treasurer's Report: Lin P-Copies of the Treasurer's report through November were made available on table. Donations: \$2186.59 - Expenses: \$427.30 - Balance: \$3793.36. Motion made by Mary Lynn H to approve report and seconded by Shawn S. All approved. Brought forward that coffee has not been made for the meetings although she had issued checks for same in June. This item was tabled to be discussed at the next steering committee meeting.

Archives: Mike J - not present - no report. Due to inactivity and non-attendance of the Archives Committee Chairman for some time, Mary Lynn H made a presentation as to what is entailed by being an Archives Committee Chairperson. All the GSRs were asked to take this back to their groups and ask if any member of the fellowship might be interested in serving in this capacity.

Grapevine: Mary S-The Grapevine Fall Fest at the Winner's Club went very well. The three speakers, dinner and a dance followed. She has returned \$100. of the seed money, and will be turning over the proceeds from the Fall Fest as soon as all the bills are paid. She has spoken with the staff of Grapevine, and our thoughts as to the purchase of bulk issues of the Grapevine would not work out as we thought. She said that if we would purchase 20 issues of La Vina they would add 20 issues of the Grapevine. Mary suggested we purchase 30 issues of La Vina. Motion by Lynn G, seconded by Mike, all were in favor.

Correctional Facilities: Liddy S - They had elections for committee officers for 1999, Oscar L was elected chairman and Joe McS as alternate chairman. There are many forms of CFC work such as "Sponsorship by Mail" and helping with the committee workings. Please take CFC fliers back to the groups, announce the meeting time and location, and ask if someone would be willing to serve the group by being their CFC representative. Next committee meeting December 2nd at Club 12. Please attend.

Hospitals & Institutions: Shawn S-He has been elected by the committee as their new chairman. Committee meetings are held on the second Saturday of each month at the Serendipity Group at 10929 Nacogdoches, #5 at 2 pm. Fliers are available on table. Next meeting December 12th, please attend. The committee is working on an H & I contact program, and looking into how to supply the facilities with Big Books and other literature to be used on a library basis. Shawn announced the H & I service opportunities, and the majority were filled from those present. The remainder will be filled from the list of GSRs and calling them individually. The completed list will be printed in the Nightcap.

PI / CPC: Lin P-District 16 had a great workshop with Brent B, SWTA PI/CPC Chairman. The committee may put our literature racks at the VA and Community Hospitals. They will do a mass mailing using a form letter obtained from GSO. They have been holding their committee meetings at the Winners Club on the first Tuesday of each month, but will be changing to the first Wednesday of the month, effective January 1st.

Dist 1A: Ed D-Held the district meeting, and are looking into holding a workshop on the 3rd of April, more details later.

Dist 1E: Ed K-Glad to be present-no report at this time.

Dist 1F: Joe G-not present

Dist 17: John S-The district Traditions Workshop at Stahl Road on November 7th, with Larry Y, went very well. The Serendipity Group will begin holding a Spanish speaking meeting on Saturday afternoons as is announced in the Nightcap.

Dist 16: Glenn C-Group 12 and District 16 workshops went very well and much information was exchanged. There was also good food and fellowship. All came away filled with both. District is doing well also. The DCMs at the steering committee meeting discussed and will ask the groups what direction(s) they want SAMS0 to pursue. Please take it back to your group and seek their input on how to better carry the message. It is the groups through the voice of the GSRs that run and make this thing work.

Dist 18: Wayne B-Not present

Dist 19: Mary Lynn H-The Ft Sam Houston Group has a new GSR, Rocky. The Alamo Heights 43rd Anniversary went very well. The Foxhall and Saturday Nite Live Groups will be moving to a new location, to be announced.

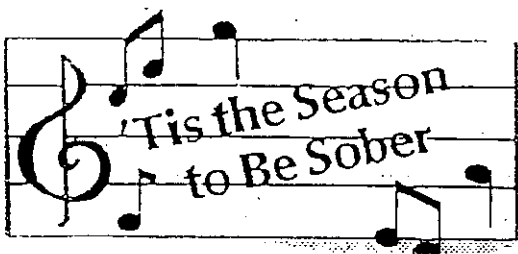
