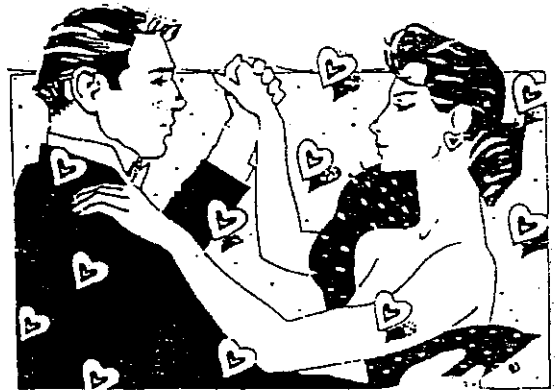

Opening: Dewey opened the meeting at 5:30pm with a moment of silence followed by the Serenity Prayer. Kim read the Twelve Traditions. Dewey read the COR Guidelines. The sign-in sheet was passed around. Three new CORs present: Virginia from the SW Loop Group, Ken from the Fresh Start Group, and Mary from the Oblate Group. Steve made motion to accept the minutes from the last COR meeting as printed in the Nightcap. Seconded. Motion carried.

Financial Report: Our new Financial Officer, Louie R., was introduced. He has been appointed by the Board to fill Wayne's unexpired term to the end of the year. The report looks good. According to the income statement, there was a \$2,295.69 loss last month. However, if you look at the first page, the year-to-date figure is only a \$259.36 loss. So, we are about on track for a non-profit business. The losses are most likely due to seasonal fluctuations in income. Format and content look ok. There was no further discussion over the financial statement.

The Nightcap Committee Report: Bill H gave the report. He said that Nightcap subscriptions are up about 75-80 subscriptions from the first of the year. He requested that all CORs present tell their groups about the importance of subscribing to the Nightcap as source of information on local AA, such as upcoming events, meeting changes, etc. They make great holiday or sobriety birthday gifts for sponsees or any local AA member. The cost of a subscription is only \$3/year.

Telephone Service Committee (TSC) Report: Kim reported that there was one timeslot left in November, which was filled by the end of the meeting. The December calendar was passed around. No one has volunteered to take over as TSC chairperson. So, until someone steps forward, we will be moving more towards a true "committee" approach. Kim will still keep the main calendar, but there will be more of a division of labor among those who really care about telephone service work and want to get more involved. Kim, David W, Ed E, and a few others are monitoring the phones and doing the work of a full committee at this time, but they need help. So, another list was passed around for volunteers to sign up as "back-ups." This group will help monitor the timeslots to see that they are covered, act as back-ups when needed, talk about telephone service work at business meetings, etc. and help find volunteers. At the end of the COR meeting, no one had signed up as a Telephone Service Committee member.

Old Business: Election of four new CSO Board members - Jim B, Chairperson of the Nominating Committee, led the election, which was by paper ballot. Jim began by thanking the other members of the Nominating Committee, Liz L, Lynne G, and David B for their hard work. CORs were asked to write four names from the nine candidates; seven of whom were present and gave a brief speech about their service history and their reasons for wanting to be on the Board. The nine candidates were: Andy L, Freedom Group; Ed D, SW Loop Group; Louie R, Oblate; Madonna M, Highlands; Margaret C (not present); Mary E, Goliad; Mary S, New Life Group; Randy S, Colonies North; and Paul G, Serendipity (not present). Only one ballot was needed. The new Board members are Louie R, Madonna M, Mary S, and Randy S. Dewey reminded the new Board members that they need to attend the December Board meeting on the Wednesday before the December COR meeting, at 5:30pm at the CSO. Their term of office will begin on January 1, 2000, as David, Dewey, and Ronnie rotate off the Board. Dewey thanked Jim and the other Nominating Committee member for their hard work.

New Business: None.

Announcements: None.

Closing: Dewey passed the hat. Motion to close made and seconded. Motion carried. Closed at 6pm with the Lord's Prayer.

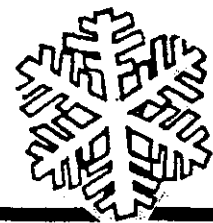

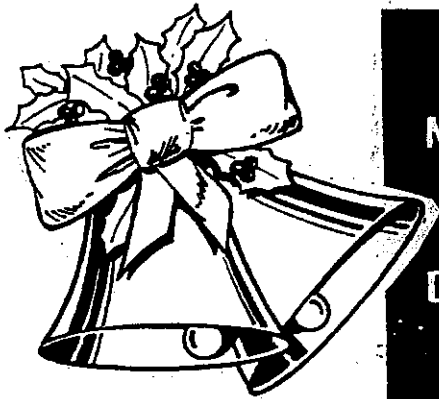
Grupo 3 Legados has added three meetings for women. Monday, Thursday and Saturday at 11 a.m. Open discussion.

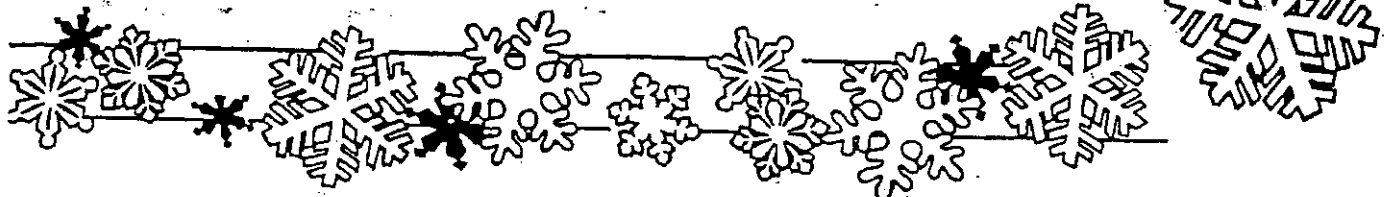
Frank was a very colorful character, about whom many stories have been told. He will be missed by his many friends.

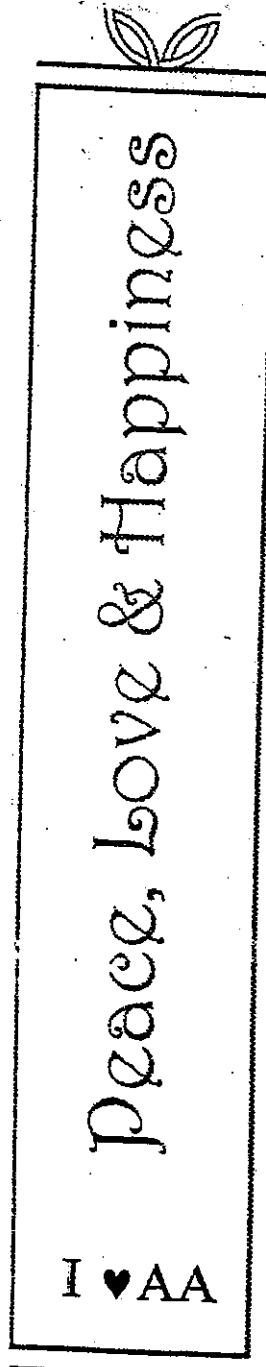

2 Don't sit around brooding. Catch up on those books, museums, walks, and letters.



3 Be host to A.A. friends, especially newcomers. If you don't have a place where you can throw a formal party, take one person to a diner and spring for the coffee.



4 Skip any drinking occasion you are nervous about. Remember how clever you were at excuses when drinking? Now put the talent to good use. No office party is as important as saving your life.



5 Don't start now getting worked up about all those holiday temptations. Remember—"one day at a time."



6 If you have to go to a drinking party and can't take an A.A. with you, keep some candy handy.



7 Enjoy the true beauty of holiday love and joy. Maybe you cannot give material gifts—but this year, you can give love.



8 Keep your A.A. telephone list with you all the time. If a drinking urge or panic comes—postpone everything else until you've called an A.A.



9 Don't think you have to stay late. Plan in advance an "important date" you have to keep.



10 "Having had a . . ." No need to spell out the Twelfth Step here, since you already know it.



11 Find out about the special holiday



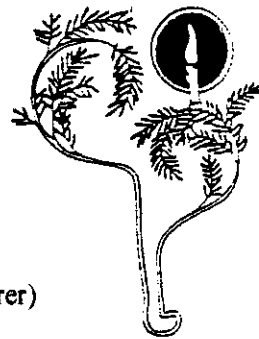
12 Go to church. Any church.



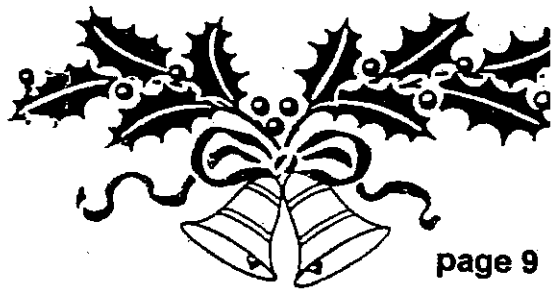

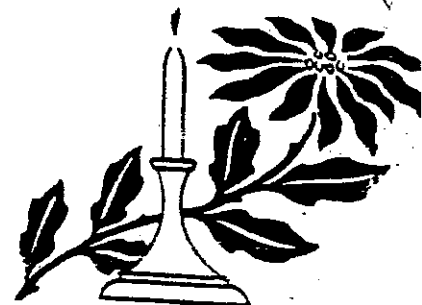
