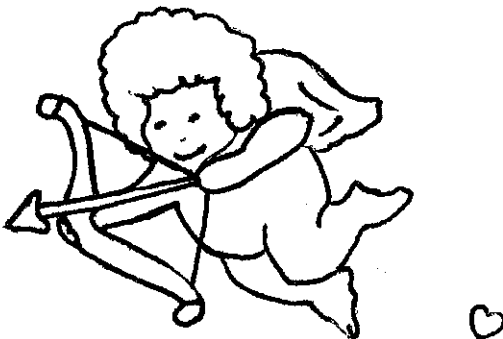

GSR Meeting Minutes

CENTRAL SERVICE OFFICE COMMITTEE MEETING
Club 12, January 17, 1988

The meeting was opened at 7 p.m. by Charlie C., Chairman, with the Serenity Prayer. The sign-in book was passed around. Fifty-six persons were present. CSO Guidelines were read by Paul, followed by the 12 Traditions read by Richard. New GSRs were recognized and asked to contact their DCMs. Literature on the table was pointed out to be taken. The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as printed in THE NIGHTCAP. The meeting was then turned over to Gary L., Administrative Board Chairman, who asked for reports from the committee chairmen.

Financial Chairman, Wayne B., presented the financial statement, explaining and reviewing the report. H&I Chairman, James H., asked for volunteers to take meetings to participating hospitals and institutions (see list below). He presented a table that he had prepared, showing the H&Is and the groups taking meetings to H&Is since he took over the Chairmanship in June 1987. He conveyed the H&I administrators thanks to the groups. CPC Chairman, Lila S., was absent but sent her report--she has two committee persons and will have something to report next month. Editorial Chairman, Dee S., reminded everyone to get their news in by the 20th of each month. Mailing Chairman, Jack S., reported that 1,080 NIGHTCAPS went out last month and conveyed his thanks to those who helped. Penal Chairman, John R., reported they will be going to Huntsville on the 24th. Announced that a barbecue will be held at the Southside Group on Feb 20 at 6 p.m. Members interested in the Penal Committee, please be there. He hopes that at least one person from each group will attend. He needs financial support to pay for transportation, from the groups. Jail Chairman, Tom B., introduced Lynn, who has been taking the women's meeting to the jail. She has been the only woman going since November and NEEDS help. The response of AA women to carry the message to the jail has been zero! There are about 20 women in jail who are very positive about AA, want and need the message. The meetings are on Tuesday at 7:30 p.m.--please call Tom B. at 525-1932 for details. Public Information Chairman, Jerri McC., was absent.

OLD BUSINESS: Letter received from AAWS regarding reimbursement for prison trips with no solution. GSRs were asked to see if their groups would be willing to contribute to a Penal Travel Fund (this will be separate from the literature fund). It was announced that all 1987 Committee Chairmen were reappointed for 1988.

NEW BUSINESS: After-hour phone duty was assigned (see list below). GSRs were asked to please return phone duty folders to CSO. They were also asked to let CSO know when a new group is formed in their district.

DCM REPORTS: 1-A: No report. 1-B: Present, no report. 1-C: Present and reported that he is trying to get the district active in helping CSO with committees. 1-D: Absent, no report. 1-E: No report. 1-F: Jose announced a February 17 District meeting.

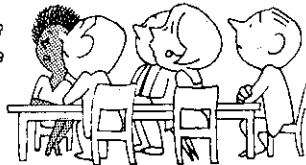

 Our leaders are but trusted servants . . . they do not govern.

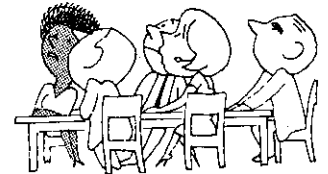

A.A. is both a democracy and, in Bill W.'s words, "a benign anarchy." A group elects its own officers—who have no power to *order* anybody to do anything. In most groups, most of the slate rotates out of office at the end of six months, and new officers are elected.

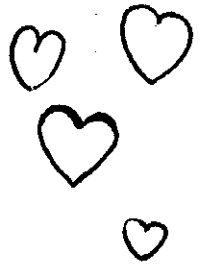
If a group wants to be a part of the whole A.A. service structure, it elects a G.S.R. (general service representative, with a two-year term). G.S.R.'s elect area committee members and then join them in electing a delegate from their area to the annual General Service Conference. The Conference is about the closest approximation of a government that A.A. has; it produces opinions on important matters of policy; it approves the choice of some trustee nominees for the General Service Board and directly elects others. But neither the Conference nor the board can give

orders to any A.A. group or member.

Then who's in charge around here? A.A. is a spiritual movement, and so the "ultimate authority" is the spiritual concept of the "group conscience." Its voice is heard when a well-informed group gathers to arrive at a decision. The result rests on more than arithmetic, a "yes" and "no" count. Minority ideas get thoughtful attention. What about that annoying character who's always sure she's right? Better listen—maybe, just this once, she's right. If she's wrong, then she will—if she remembers the First Tradition as well as the Second—go along with the decision of the group conscience. Does this notion seem too cloudy? Let's think back to our first meetings. The presence we newcomers felt in those rooms was the same as the group conscience. And it was *real*—welcoming us in, setting up no barriers of rules. . . .


