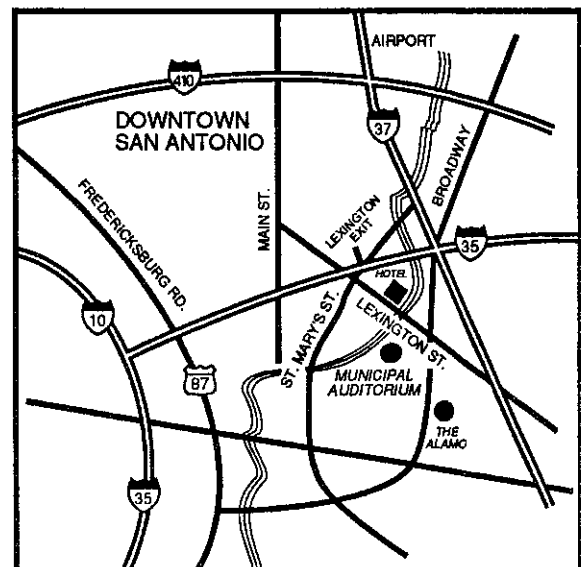

GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING MINUTES

January 20, 1991

The meeting was opened with the Serenity Prayer by Lalo A., Chairman, at 6:30 p.m. The Twelve Traditions were read by Tom. The check-in sheet was circulated. There were 62 persons present including 8 new GSRs, 1 alternate GSR, and 1 new DCM. After the Statement of Participation was read, the minutes of the previous meeting were accepted as printed in the January issue of THE NIGHTCAP. The financial report was presented by Al D. with 1990 showing a profit. Volunteers for after-hour phone duty were obtained (see list below).

Committee reports were as follows: H&I Chairman, Eileen, requested groups to carry the message to various hospitals and institutions (see list below). Don N., Chairman, PI, reported that the Young, Sober, and Free Group made a presentation at the First Baptist Church before Christmas that was very well received; on January 19, two AA speakers went to the Parent-Child, Inc., Child Abuse Conference where there was standing room only; he needs help in getting an Al-Ateen to speak at Ed White Middle School on February 15th. Jail Chairman, Flynn J., reported his committee had their first meeting last week and had a good turn out. The women's jail meeting is going well. The men's meetings need more volunteers. He had attended the CFC meeting and it was very informative. The men meet from 7 to 8 p.m. on Monday at the jail and from 8 to 9 on Tuesday at Wackenhut; women meet on Tuesday from 7 to 8 p.m. at the jail. This committee needs volunteers to assist new ex-cons in finding AA meetings. Convention Chairman, Bill T., reported that the flyer for the convention should be ready for mailing by Saturday; Jim B. has volunteered to handle registration this year and Jack L. will do the taping.

OLD BUSINESS: Ratification of recommended amendments to the CSO Policies and Procedures: Amend Article VI, paragraph A., to change length of sobriety from 2 years to 5 years, for qualifications of Officers and Trustees. This was ratified. Add paragraph C. under Article VI., "Nominees for the Board of Trustees shall not be serving as an Officer of a Club where AA meetings are held. Nominees are limited to one per family and one per AA group." Ratification of first sentence only--last sentence was stricken. Amendment to Article VII., paragraph B and G was ratified as recommended.

NO NEW BUSINESS. CSO REPORT: 1530 copies of the January issue of THE NIGHTCAP were mailed with 26 returned due to subscriber moving and failing to notify CSO; 102 reminder cards were mailed on 1-15-91 for the General Membership Meeting. CSO received 702 phone calls during the month of December and 388 reported by the answering service = 1,090.

DCM REPORT: Mac McL., reported the San Antonio Interdistrict will have a workshop at 2300 W. Commerce on March 2, 1991, from 1 to 5 p.m.--Theme: Behind the Walls. The Spanish Workshop will be held on March 10, 1991, at St. James Catholic Church, 907 W. Theo, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.--Theme: Grupos Hispanas in Action.

There were no announcements. The meeting adjourned at 7:45 p.m. with The Lord's Prayer.

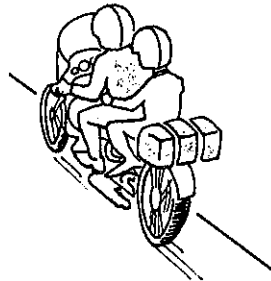
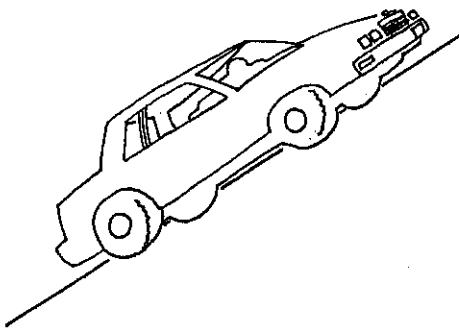
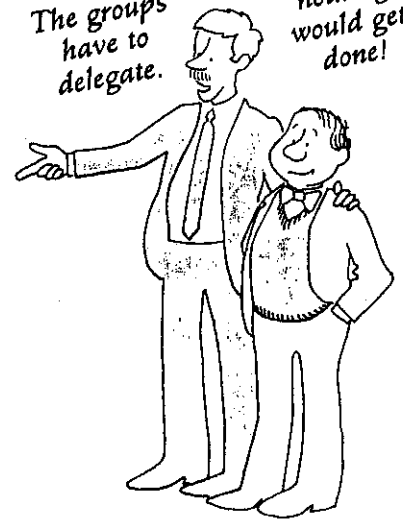
Concept II

When, in 1955, the A.A. groups confirmed the permanent charter for their General Service Conference, they thereby delegated to the Conference complete authority for the active maintenance of our world services and thereby made the Conference—excepting for any change in the Twelve Traditions or in Article 12 of the Conference Charter—the actual voice and the effective conscience for our whole Society.

Concept I establishes the "final responsibility and ultimate authority" of the A.A. groups; but, in actual practice, how are they to manage A.A.'s service affairs? By *delegation*, Concept II declares.

Bill and Dr. Bob, entrusted by the early groups to get the program going and to spread the message, found nonalcoholic friends to help them. They formed a trusteeship and delegated to it the responsibility for finances, the Big Book and other literature, public information, the service office and the A.A. Grapevine. However, as the trustees constantly looked to the co-founders for advice and guidance and the groups also continued to hold them accountable, it was evident that the leadership should be transferred

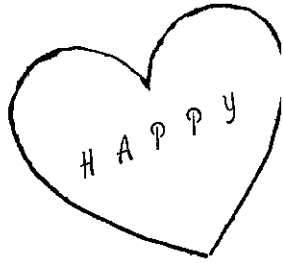
to the A.A. groups as a whole. But if the groups were to carry on their primary purpose, they would have to delegate their leadership role to a General Service Conference. They do this by electing a General Service Representative for each group. These G.S.R.s meet regularly in area assemblies and every two years elect a *delegate* from among their number. Every April, the delegates from the 91 areas in the U.S. and Canada meet for six days with the trustees of the General Service Board, the staffs of the General Service Office and the A.A. Grapevine and certain other service workers. Thus, this General Service Conference of A.A. is "the actual voice and effective conscience of our whole Society in its world affairs."

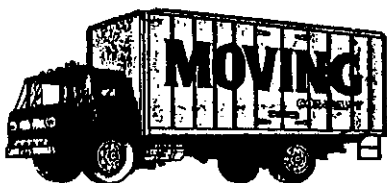
