MINUTES OF THE GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING
JANUARY 17, 1993

The meeting was opened by Knut H., Chairman, CSO Board of Trustees, at 5:30 p.m. with the Serenity Prayer. This meeting was held in the driveway of St. Patrick's Catholic Church because the church had over-booked. Russ B. read the Twelve Traditions. All members of the Board of Trustees were present and 26 others--CORs and visitors. Knut introduced the board members and encouraged the Central Office Representatives present to discuss CSO business with them. He also mentioned the information and forms on the front table to be taken back to the groups. He then asked for new CORs to be recognized. They were: Sonny of the Goliad Group, Mickey of the Foxhall Group, and Kathy of the San Antonio North Group.

A motion was made, seconded, and passed that the minutes of the last meeting be accepted as printed in the January issue of THE NIGHTCAP, so were not read.

The CSO Report and the financial report were presented by Bonnie R. as follows: 1496 copies of THE NIGHTCAP were mailed on 12-31-92 with only 20 being returned; GMM reminders were mailed on 1-12-93; there was a total of 837 telephone calls received in December which made a total of 2453 for the last quarter 1992. A physical inventory was taken the first week in January and the results showed 276.90 more merchandise than was recorded. A new catalog is planned to be produced this month. The new meeting directory will be published in February. The financial report showed a deficit of approximately \$1500.

OLD BUSINESS: The Board is working on new bylaws and they will be presented to the general membership as soon as they are completed. 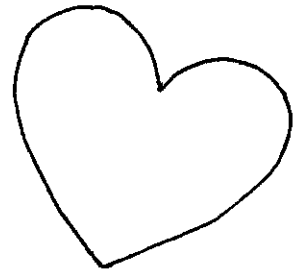

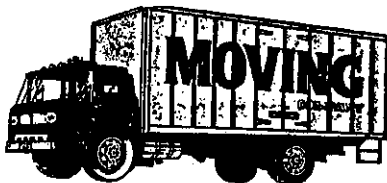
