A.A. is both a democracy and, in Bill W.'s words, "a benign anarchy." A group elects its own officers—who have no power to *order* anybody to do anything. In most groups, most of the slate rotates out of office at the end of six months, and new officers are elected.

If a group wants to be a part of the whole A.A. service structure, it elects a G.S.R. (general service representative, with a two-year term). G.S.R.'s elect area committee members and then join them in electing a delegate from their area to the annual General Service Conference. The Conference is about the closest approximation of a government that A.A. has; it produces opinions on important matters of policy; it approves the choice of some trustee nominees for the General Service Board and directly elects others. But neither the Conference nor the board can give

orders to any A.A. group or member.

Then who's in charge around here? A.A. is a spiritual movement, and so the "ultimate authority" is the spiritual concept of the "group conscience." Its voice is heard when a well-informed group gathers to arrive at a decision. The result rests on more than arithmetic, a "yes" and "no" count. Minority ideas get thoughtful attention. What about that annoying character who's always sure she's right? Better listen—maybe, just this once, she *is* right. If she's wrong, then she will—if she remembers the First Tradition as well as the Second—go along with the decision of the group conscience. Does this notion seem too cloudy? Let's think back to our first meetings. The presence we newcomers felt in those rooms was the same as the group conscience. And it was *real*—welcoming us in, setting up no barriers of rules. . . .

# CONTRIBUTING ACCORDING TO TRADITIONS

WHY---In accordance with the Seventh Tradition, every A.A. group ought to be fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions. In A.A., each group is really part of a wider **group** effort which seeks to carry the A.A. message of recovery to the still suffering alcoholic who cannot be reached by the individual A.A. group. All **groups**, however, every level of the service structure, are composed, and express the collective conscience, of individual members. To be fully self-supporting, then, requires a commitment on the part of each member to support, through his/her home group, the services provided by the local intergroup or central office, by the area and district and by G.S.O., so that these entities might continue to carry out their invaluable Twelfth Step work beyond the group level.

Ultimately, it is your **individual commitment** to sustain these essential efforts through your contributions that ensures that: (1) Newcomers get literature (2) Phones get answered (3) Professionals get answers about A.A. (4) Loner A.A.'s get letters (5) Alcoholics around the world find hope.

HOW...To support A.A.'s essential service, the General Service Conference suggests individual groups adopt a specific contribution plan suitable to their particular situation. Such a commitment might work like this: First, take care of basic group expenses (rent, refreshments, A.A. literature and a prudent reserve emergency fund). Divide the remaining funds according to what-ever division suits your local needs. A Regular Contribution Plan (contributing on a monthly, bimonthly, or quarterly basis) can be especially convenient for both your group and G.S.O.

She also reported that the 12 Step List for SW General Hospital is a list compiled of volunteers for that facility only, and is NOT the CSO 12 Step List.

**CFC:** Syd T. reported that their treasurer has changed and that is why there was no report. She said they need volunteers for all facilities. The CFC Committee meets on the first Wednesday of the month at Club 12. at 7pm.. All are invited and encouraged to attend. There are 9 units in the San Antonio area and many service opportunities available. Jim D. gave a report on the State prison on Hwy 90 and 1604 which now has three meetings a week. Clearance is required, but you can go on a one time visit. Call Jim at 490-1235 if you want to go. Virginia asked if women can go and the answer was YES! The SW Tx area CFC Conference "Freedom from Bondage" is Feb 2-4 in Austin at the Texas State Capital Annex.

**PI:** Wayne announced a workshop on getting involved with Public Information/CPC, Feb. 18th from 2-4pm at Stahl Road.

**GRAPEVINE:** Robin S. reported the upcoming "GRAPESHOP" Feb. 10th at Winners Club. Some topics will be using the Grapevine on 12 Step Calls, history of Grapevine..

**ARCHIVES:** Mark C. announced that the committee is looking for a new chairperson. Everything is set-up for the new Chair to take over. Rachel asked if there was a requirement for length of sobriety. Virginia stated that interest in the history of AA would be more important than length of sobriety.

**OLD BUSINESS:** (1) Discussion of downtown meeting for Saturday nights to fill the needs of visitors to the city. Reminded of Blue Door at 11:30am Sat. and Spirit Trail on Fri. nights. Dick, Spirit Trail, GSR will talk to his group and the church where meeting is held. (2) SAMSO statement of purpose is being looked into by a GSR in District 1A to see if changes should be made. (3) Quarterly ID workshops are not going to be held as long as the districts are holding their own. Support is needed for all workshops. (4) Question on ID funds brought up by Virginia.. Bill suggested Grapevine commit to the new Hispanic Grapevine. Yolanda asked if funds would be available for the Grapevine Jamboree. Steering Committee said yes. ID is also making funds available to CFC to cover costs of mailing, copying, phone calls etc. Ali asked if her group should decrease contributions to ID because of the large balance. 



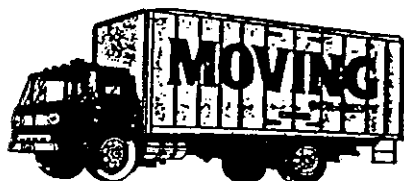
