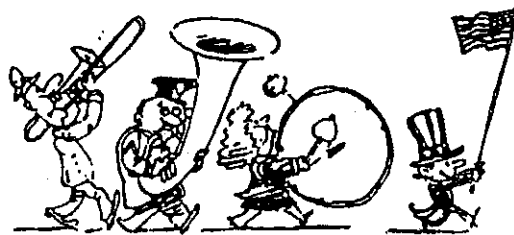

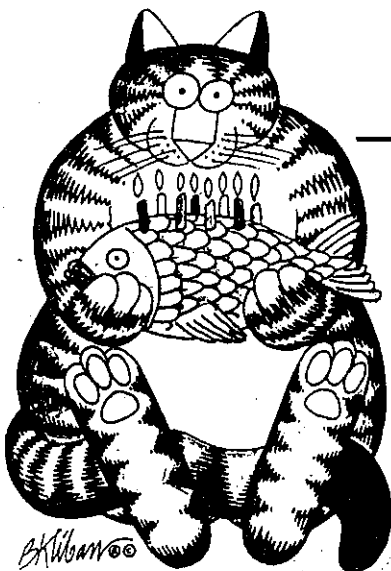

## Anonymity?

### From The American Heritage Dictionary

**an·o·nym·i·ty** (ə-nŏn'ə-mə-tī) **a.** 1. Having an unknown or unacknowledged name. 2. Having an unknown or withheld authorship or agency. 3. Having no distinctive character or recognition factor.

### From Alcoholics Anonymous (The Big Book)

PG. 564 *Eleven*--Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio and films.

PG. 567 11.--Our relations with the general public should be characterized by personal anonymity. We think A.A. ought to avoid sensational advertising. Our names and pictures as A.A. members ought not be ***broadcast, filmed, or publicly printed***. Our public relations should be guided by the principle of attraction rather than promotion. There is never need to praise ourselves. We feel it better to let our friends recommend us.

PG. 568 12.--And finally, we of Alcoholics Anonymous believe that the principle of anonymity has an immense spiritual significance. It reminds us that we are to place principles before personalities; that we are actually to practice a genuine humility. This to the end that our great blessings may never spoil us; that we shall forever live in thankful contemplation of Him who presides over us all.

PG. XIX -- It was decided that all members ought to be anonymous at the level of *press, radio, TV and films*.

### From UNDERSTANDING ANONYMITY

(AA Approved Pamphlet)

PG. 5

**W**hat is the purpose of anonymity to Alcoholics Anonymous? Why is it often referred to as the greatest single protection the fellowship has to assure its continued existence and growth?

If we look at the history of A.A., from its beginning in 1935 until now, it is clear that anonymity serves two different yet equally vital functions:

- At the personal level, anonymity provides protection for all members from identification as alcoholics, a safeguard often of special importance to newcomers.
- At the level of press, radio, TV, and films, anonymity stresses the equality in the Fellowship of all members by putting the brake on those who might otherwise exploit their A.A. affiliation to achieve recognition, power, or personal gain.

#### *Anonymity on a person-to-person basis*

(PG. 6) Such a disclosure, however, is always their own choice: A.A. as a whole seeks to ensure that individual members stay as private and protected as they wish, or as open as they wish, about belonging to the Fellowship; but always with the understanding that anonymity at the level of the press, radio, TV, and films is crucial to our continuing sobriety and growth - at both the personal and group levels.

(PG. 10) **Facts about anonymity in A.A.**

- When speaking as A.A. members at non-A.A. meetings, usually use first names only.
- Use last names within the Fellowship, especially for election of group officers and other service jobs.

### From the February 1969 Grapevine

#### **Dr. Bob on Tradition Eleven**

Dr. Bob, co-founder of AA, commented on Tradition Eleven as follows: "Since our Tradition on anonymity designates the exact level where the line should be held, it must be obvious to everyone who can read and understand the English language that to maintain anonymity at any other level is definitely a violation of this Tradition.

"The AA who hides his identity from his fellow AA by using only a given name violates the Tradition just as much as the AA who permits his name to appear in the press in connection with matters pertaining to AA.

"The former is maintaining his anonymity *above* the level of press, radio, and films, and the latter is maintaining his anonymity *below* the level of press, radio, and films -- whereas the Tradition states that we should maintain our anonymity *at* the level of press, radio, and films."

Note: Some quotes are italicized, bolded, or underlined to draw attention to a specific area.
