## MINUTES - COR Meeting - January 17, 1999

Dewey S opened the meeting with a moment of silence followed by the Serenity Prayer. Linda U read the Twelve Traditions. Dewey read the COR guidelines. The sign-in sheet was passed around. Three new CORs were present: Linda U.-Group 12, Greg Q.-New Downtown Group and Mike G. from the Oakhills Group. The minutes from the last COR meeting were accepted as printed in the Nightcap.

**Convention Report:** Tomi is the AA in SA Convention chairperson this year, but was unable to attend the COR meeting so Virginia gave the report for her. The date for this year's annual CSO fund-raiser will be April 30-May 2 and the location is at the Scottish Rite Auditorium, downtown, across the Express News. Ample parking and excellent speakers. Flyers are available and the first mass mailing has begun. All are encouraged to participate and attend.

**Financial Report:** The financial statement had not been available at the board meeting and Wayne D was unable to attend the COR meeting, so none of the board members present could explain the large loss in the December bottom line. CORs were told they could call Bonnie or Dewey for more information later in the week after we consult with Wayne and the CPA.

**Telephone Service Committee Report:** Kim C reported the 12th Step List call is in progress and asked for volunteers to help. The February calendar was passed around. More volunteers for after hours telephone service work are urgently needed. New phone packets should be available by next month. Anyone who wants to be added to the 12th Step Volunteer List is asked to call Kim at 522-0488 or call CSO at 821-6325. Veteran telephone volunteers are still available to attend group conscience or business meetings for any group that wants to learn more about telephone service work.

**Old Business:** The vote on proposed changes in the CSO bylaws. Discussed what constituted a quorum for the ratification vote. It was first thought we could not vote because there were nine CORs present and we needed eleven for a quorum. Burt pointed out that the new quorum rule did not apply until it was voted in, so we referred to the current bylaws which stated: *2/3 of the CORs present* were needed for ratification. Dewey read each proposal and CORs had a written copy of the proposed changes. We voted on each of the three amendments separately. All three passed with a count of eight for, one against. The dissenting voice was heard. Sheri H from Group 12 said that her group felt the changes were unnecessary. Dewey explained that these were not so much changes as clarifications of the language in the bylaws to bring them more into legal agreement with the Articles of Incorporation, after consultation with the attorney that helped write those Articles. Victor asked how the new quorum rule would affect future votes if fewer than 10% of the groups were represented at a COR meeting. Ronnie R said that board members count as part of the quorum in regular votes, but not in ratification votes to make changes in the bylaws. Dewey said we still need 2/3 majority in ratification votes, but only a simple majority in regular votes.

**New Business:** Discussed the Nightcap. The board has formed a committee chaired by Bill H to help increase subscriptions to the Nightcap. The cost is only \$3. per year, so the board and CSO are concerned as to why our AA newsletter is not reaching everyone. Kim mentioned that subscriptions were at about 1700 when the Nightcap was free, but now are down to about 350. Ron stated that the biggest problem with the Nightcap is the delay in receiving it. If it is not received before the first of a month, it is useless as an announcement tool for upcoming events since many have already occurred. This complaint was backed up by several others and appeared to be the problem with the Nightcap. Ron proposed that since there is a cut off date to submit material for the Nightcap there should be a cut off date for mailing to that the Nightcap is received in time to be of value. Kim said that the CSO waits for the minutes to both COR and GSR meetings before going to the printer. That might be as late as the 21st some months. Beth and others said that they haven't been receiving a free Nightcap for their groups, even though their addresses are correct on the sign-in list. Noel asked how up to date are the addresses in the computer versus the sign in list. Board members said they would check. Virginia suggested that the Nightcap be made to cover from the middle of one month to the next, so that events in the first couple of weeks are published sooner than they currently are. Lucian also asked about the reminder cards for the COR/GSR meetings, since he and several others present did not receive them. The board will check into all these concerns and consider how to correct them at the next board meeting.

Announcements: None, except Ron asked if CSO is still a non-smoking facility. The answer was yes.

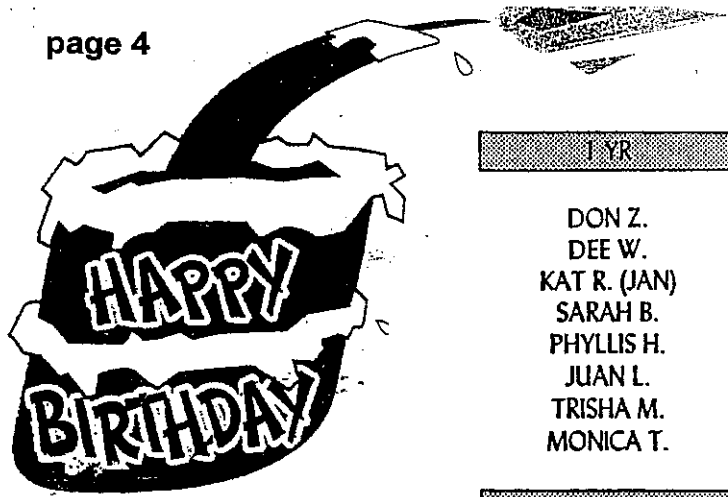

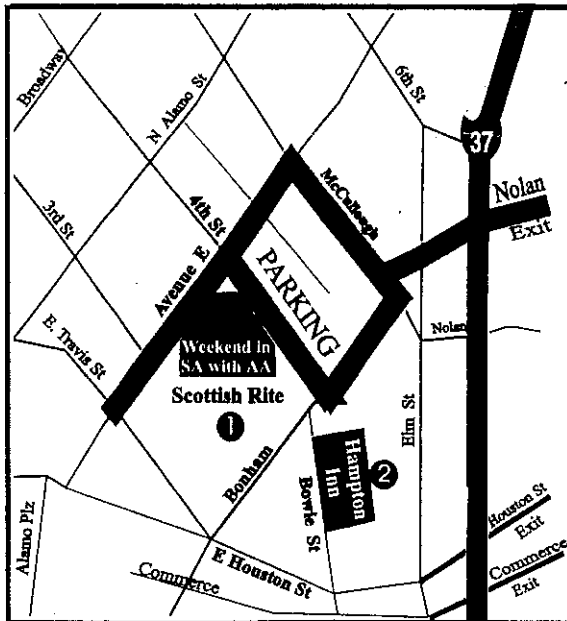

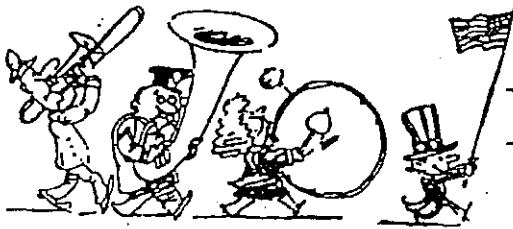
Every one in attendance then viewed the informative twelve minute AA approved video, HOPE: Alcoholics Anonymous.
