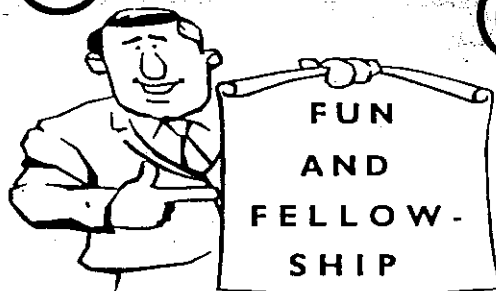
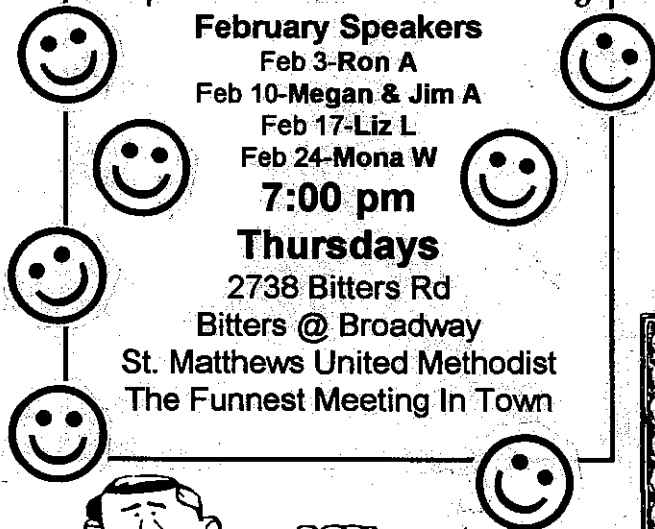

Opening: Virginia B opened the meeting at 5:35pm with a moment of silence followed by the Serenity Prayer. Mike G read the Twelve Traditions. Madonna read the COR Guidelines. We introduced ourselves. The sign-in and attendance sheets were passed around. Three new CORs present: Mike S (Valley Hi), Michelle G (Acceptance) and Lauren C (SA North Women's). Mike S made motion to accept the minutes from the last COR meeting as printed in the Nightcap. Seconded by Virginia F. Motion carried.

Financial Report: Louie not present, so Randy gave the financial report. Board members just received the "year to date" report. It will be discussed at the next Board meeting. Louie is still getting up to speed with the CSO books and will be talking to our accountant next month. Randy pointed out that wage-related and miscellaneous expenses were both increased. There was a loss of \$4,127.48 for the year. Virginia noted that Nightcap expenses were also up. Randy discussed his and his group's concerns about the Financial Report as it has been incomplete the last several months. He and the other Board members present agreed that we will do our best to provide a better and more accurate accounting of our finances. We discussed the need for the Financial Officer to attend COR meetings to answer questions. Madonna asked about the large difference in individual contributions and what was budgeted for it. Kim explained that the budget was figured by taking the year end totals for 1998 and dividing by 12. So, although some months appear greatly under budget, they might be over budget the next month, and some items might represent large sums that come in only once or twice a year. Mike S asked about next year's budget. Board members have not considered it yet, but it would be based on last year. Mike S asked the results of the CSO inventory. The Board members explained that we were off by -\$158.28. Kim said \$56 of that were directories used for phone packets. Louie suggested at the last Board meeting that we fill out an invoice for items used in-house so they can be accounted for. We have begun doing that. We had 5 missing Big Books, but that was all that could not be accounted for in the inventory. Randy asked if the CORs needed a year-to-date financial statement. Mike S said "no" and Charles expanded on that saying that if the Board gives a good Financial Report each month, the CORs do not need the detailed reports.

The Nightcap Committee Report: Mary S gave the report and introduced herself as the new Nightcap Committee Chairperson to replace Bill H as of the last Board meeting. No report, but next month she plans on presenting ideas as to how to boost Nightcap subscriptions. She asked how it had been handled in the past. Virginia B said mainly by selling subscriptions at events and by word of mouth. Kim suggested she can also contact Bill H for advice. Mike S commented at the end of the meeting that the recent Nightcap article about the Washingtonians made it the most interesting Nightcap issue he had seen. Consensus was that we would like to see more such articles and see the Nightcap used to its full potential. Kim asked CORs to remind their groups that the Nightcap is the group's newsletter. It can be anything we want it to be. Group members who would like to contribute articles or have suggestions can contact the CSO.

Telephone Service Committee (TSC) Report: Kim passed around both the January and February calendars. She explained how telephone service works since there were several new people present. CSO will be getting a new, high-volume copier in the next couple of weeks, so there will soon be new phone packets which will have the new meeting directories and updated 12th Step Volunteer List. Anyone wishing to participate in the TSC as a volunteer to answer the phones, act as a generic backup, or help monitor the phones to see that they are covered, can call Kim at 522-0488. You can also volunteer for the 12th Step Volunteer List. We always need help. The importance of answering the AA telephone was discussed as front-line 12th Step Work and is often the very first contact a newcomer has with AA. Kim or another TSC member will be glad to come to any group's business meeting to explain how the phones are answered. Beginning next month, we will be printing a short article in the Nightcap, every month written by current or former TSC volunteer about their experiences while on "phone duty." CORs were asked to tell their groups that we will be needing such articles. Madonna will write the first one. More information will be provided next month. Please call Kim or CSO to submit an article.

Old Business: The results of the Nightcap subscription contest were announced. The final tally was: Northwest Group (7), Valley Hi (4), Highland (4), Ft Sam (2), Sunrise (1), Grupo Doce Pasos (1), First One Today (1). So, the winner of a gift certificate at CSO is the COR from the Northwest Group.

New Business: (1) The SW Texas Area Workshop will be in San Antonio next weekend. Virginia B said there are new AA Service Manuals available from GSO, but that our CSO is currently sold out. We all marveled at that for a while, and concluded it was a good thing, if not a bit unusual. Virginia apologized to all those she told that there was no way the Service Manual could be sold out. More are on order by CSO. Nancy asked if the Workshop was over budget since there had been requests for donations. Virginia B explained that the donations were needed for the hospitality room. The Area is picking up the bill for the conference itself. (2) The CSO By-Laws have been amended as voted on by the CORs a few months ago. They were discussed at the last Board meeting and have been proofread. Copies will be available at the next COR meeting. (3) Virginia asked if postcard reminders would be helpful in reminding everyone of the COR meeting each month. Beth said "no", since meeting notices were posted in every Nightcap and anyone who is a COR should be able to remember "the third Sunday" is always a COR meeting day. The "COR Participation Committee" was discussed. Burt was co-chair with Beth, but he is no longer a COR, so Virginia asked if anyone would like to help Beth make phone call reminders to groups and CORs about next month's meeting. Vicki and Madonna will help. New COR lists will be mailed to them.

Announcements: None.

Closing: Virginia passed the hat. Closed at 6:25pm with the Lord's Prayer.

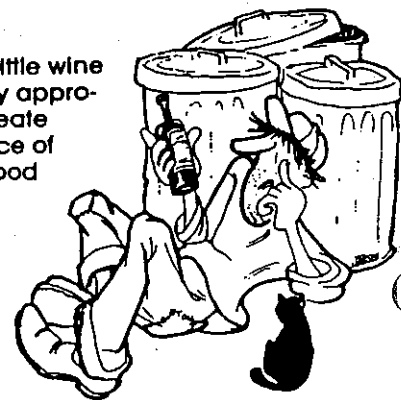

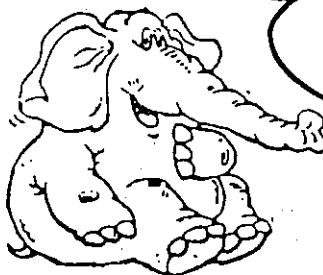

A.A. is for people that want the pain to stop. It is for people who are sick and tired of doing the same things again and again and staying miserable, beaten, lost, alone and scared. A.A. is for people who are tired of self-destruction. We are men and women who have experienced all the pain necessary to make us willing enough to try something different. We are not laughing; we are not playing a game. We realized, though hard as it was to accept, that we had been beaten by our best thinking and actions.

Our lives had to change, because the pace going down hill was getting faster and faster. We had to surrender to our innermost self that we could no longer survive on the journey we had mapped for ourselves. Our lives had become unmanageable!

Willingness was the key—the key to our escape from the depths of our self-made hell. Surrender to win. God—we had to give up our way of life—our way of life that to the point of our surrender had brought us an awful lot of pain to both ourselves and everyone around us. The false laughter had to be gone. The lying to ourselves and everyone else had to be gone. The deep down honesty that we were whipped had to surface.

We had come into A.A. with the willingness to try a different way of life. We had to come into A.A. with the willingness to *listen* to those who had come before us. We had to come into A.A. with the willingness to be willing to do the thing suggested to us that had worked for those before us. We had to come into A.A. to find the willingness to seek a power greater than ourselves that could help us get out of our insane thoughts and actions. We had come into A.A. with the willingness to admit and *accept* our way did not work and that we were willing to try your way.

Each of us has done this, and basically to do this each day in order to stay sober and live each day to the best of our ability putting one foot in front of the other. Life has its ups and downs, but each of us has found we can walk through those hills and valleys without having to take a drink. We can do this because we have come to believe in a power greater than ourselves and that A.A. is a *we* program. Join us as we each trudge the road to happy destiny.

Mike Y. once told me that our purpose in life was to do or say something that would have such an impact on another person that it would make a dramatic difference in their life, but we would never even know it happened. I agree with Mike and I also believe God sometimes gives us the very special gift of learning it happened.

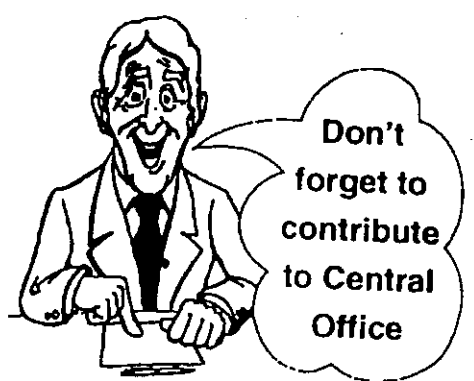
