## The Care and Training of One Alcoholic

Every morning I have to feed my ego something, and luckily my first sponsor taught me how to put out a bowl of humility the very first moment that I get out of bed. I go to my knees and pray for guidance and help. The beginning of the day wakes up this contrary spirit inside me and unless I get a firm grip on it's collar immediately I get carried off for a wild ride, hanging on to the beast that is fear-ridden Self. So, it's on my knees the instant I get out of bed. Every morning. Every morning for something like more than 3,000 mornings in a row now.

A sponsee asked me 'why on my knees?'— he didn't say this, but I think he finds it childish or humiliating. He says it's difficult for him. Yeah, I understand. In my earliest days of sobriety my faith in God consisted of my anger at Him, so the idea of getting on my knees was embarrassing. But I did it. I am one of those who were fortunate enough not to know that you didn't have to do everything your sponsor said!

This brings up willingness. At the end of the First Step in the Twelve and Twelve it says 'driven by the lash of alcoholism, then and only then are we as willing to listen as only the dying can be.' That took care of many of the 'whys?' I had. My first sponsor had my undivided attention and I did exactly what he told me to do — maybe I did it poorly, but whatever he said, I did, eventually. But I am no poster child for AA. I'm embarrassed now by some of the things I said and did in my early days. My friends are kind enough to pretend to have forgotten some of my early antics!

My day is built around the classic five things I was told to do in the beginning. 1. Get on my knees to pray for guidance during the day, 2. Read some AA literature and meditate on it, 3. Talk to another alcoholic in recovery, 4. Make plans to attend a meeting today, 5. End the day on my knees to express gratitude. That's my minimum maintenance routine, not to exclude a lot of other things I may do in or for the program. This simple list of actions are the stable pivot in my life, no matter what else is going on.

Today it is my willingness to do what I am told, my enthusiasm for the Program, and my forgiveness of my flawed self and others that create my happiness. Today is sufficient for all my needs, and even though I struggle with unfulfilled wants and can easily slip into fear of the future, I have those simple five things to fall back on. They are the strong reliable ribs of my ship when I sail through stormy seas in life.

**Through the Years...** Though the years have been a struggle cuz at first it was hard to let go of my good friend, "the bottle." I have learned to rely on my Higher Power, God. This month I'm celebrating six (6) glorious years of sobriety. I owe my thanks to all my A.A. friends and my sponsor, but especially to God, who has seen me thru. I ran across this passage that seems to speak exactly what I'm trying to get across to all you other recovering people and I want to share it with you.

*Relying on God for guidance to deal with our problems seems much too simple. We probably spent decades looking to alcohol, other drugs, and relationships for the solution to the ache that never left. We didn't know then that God was waiting in the wings for our prayers. Even knowing it as we do now, hasn't prevented us from looking for help elsewhere, time and again. It has never been our nature to keep our lives simple. However, we are getting more practice at the simpler life since becoming a part of this recovery program.*

We may need to choose daily to believe that God can, will, and does provide for our every need. Because most of us have not had a life-changing spiritual experience, we must decide every day to look to God. Fortunately, a moment of quiet and a tiny prayer is all that we need to know God is never more than a thought away.

In closing I wanted to tell you what has worked for me for the last six months. I have been praying to God every day and reading my spiritual literature. In addition to reading the Big Book and Twelve and Twelve, I have been doing some daily meditations (both spiritual and recovery).

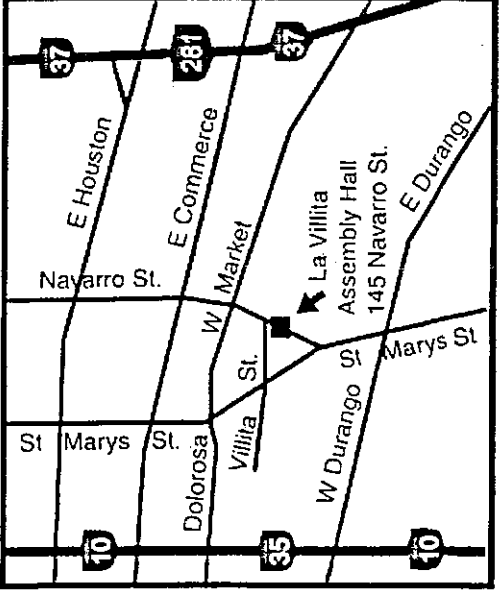

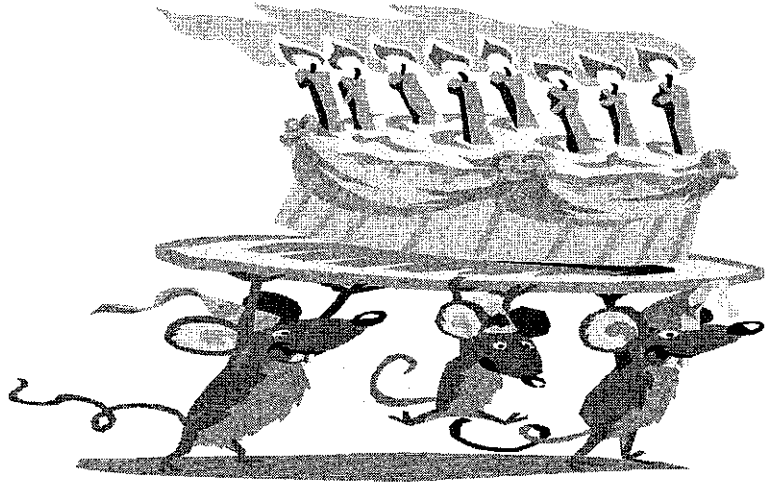
