Glenn C. announced that CSO will be closed all day on Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, New Years Eve and New Years Day.

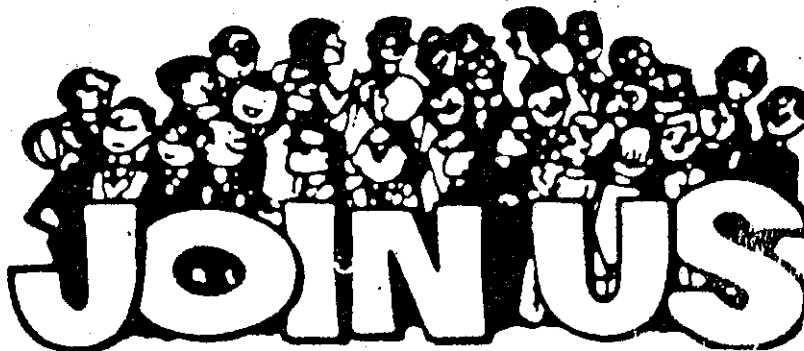
Milton G. welcomed the newly elected Board Members, Ed E., Elaine M. and Judikay L.

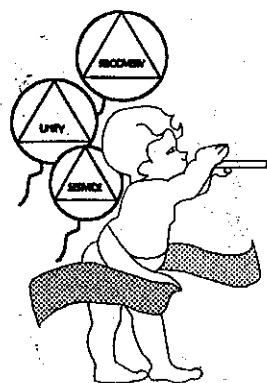

PROTECTION FOR ALL

At the personal level, anonymity provides protection for all members from identification as alcoholics, a safeguard often of special importance to newcomers. At the level of press, radio, TV, and films, anonymity stresses the equality in the Fellowship of all members by putting the brake on those who might otherwise exploit their A.A. affiliation to achieve recognition, power or personal gain.

Attraction is the main force in the Fellowship of A.A. The miracle of continuous sobriety of alcoholics within A.A. confirms this fact every day. It would be harmful if the Fellowship promoted itself by publicizing, through the media of radio and TV, the sobriety of well-known public personalities who became members of A.A. If these personalities happen to have slips, outsiders would think our movement is not strong and they might question the veracity of the miracle of the century. Alcoholics Anonymous is not anonymous, but its members should be.

THE BOTTOM LINE

Early in my A.A. life, I used to hear people with some years of sobriety tell me that as long as I didn't take a drink that day, I was a winner. In my glorious self-righteousness---which I didn't even know I had until some time later---I would think, "But that's not enough. I want to grow---reach great spiritual heights. Certainly, these folks must not be working their programs!"

I couldn't understand their loving smiles when, after I lamented how hard the struggle to contented sobriety was, how I would never reach that state of serenity, they would just say, "But you didn't take a drink today."

Well, after about five and a half years trying to fix myself---many emotional bottoms and lots of Fourth and Fifth Steps later---I believe I understand what they were all trying to tell me. It seems that today all I can do is notice my defects, turn them over, and "keep on keeping on." As long as I work the A.A. principles in my life and don't take a drink, I've got another chance to be that better person. It's when I embrace those defects, believe that I am those defects, that I'm stuck with them. I dealt in the negative for so long in my drinking career, and prior to that as well. I had to be either the perfect being or the worst being that ever lived.

I came into A.A. knowing that alcohol was destroying me, that I wanted to live, that there had to be more. My back was against the wall, and I surrendered. And that's what I have to do with every old idea that threatens my hard-won sobriety as a gift. When I get hung-up on not growing, I have to return to the bottom line of the program for me: I didn't take a drink today. I spent so many years putting myself down---I was my own worst enemy--that I had to learn to have compassion for myself, to appreciate the kind simplicity this program has to offer.

- Cita C. Make a calendar for the whole year. The most important thing now is to get group responses.

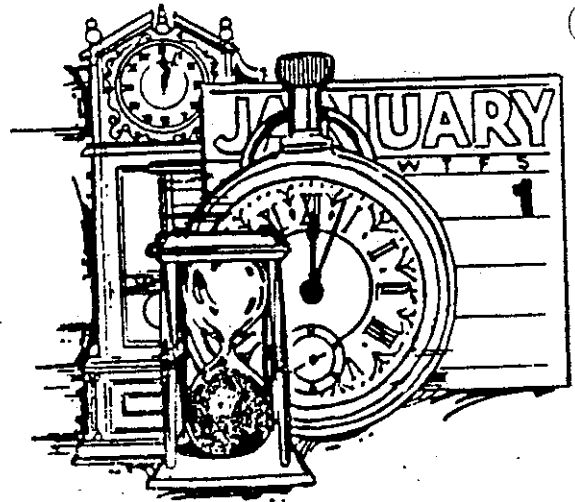
Frank- The dates can be set ahead of time so that at the first "unity meeting" the location for the next one or two could be announced.

Children from ages eight to eleven were asked this question by the Question Man for his column in the San Francisco Chronicle.

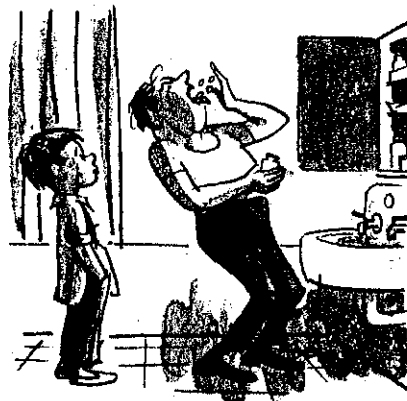
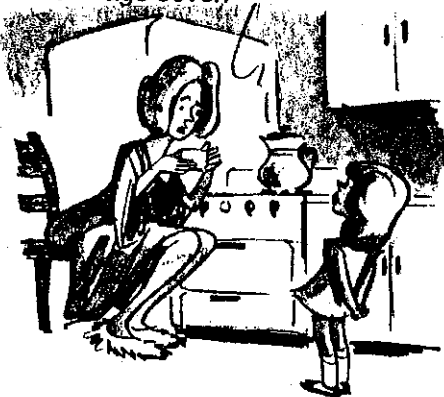
Names and pictures were omitted but the answers are for real, and if we get the message, nobody is getting away with a thing...



"You have to be grown-up to get one. A hangover, it's, well, it's kind of like a quarrel. But you don't have to have two people to have a hangover. Just one person can get a hangover. I don't know how you get a hangover, but you have to be very quite when you have one." age 8

"A hangover is something that doesn't make grown-ups feel good. It's like when they get sick. Hangovers make them feel bad for a while---about an hour. I think you get them from drinking beer. Usually they happen to people in the morning. You can walk around with one, but it's better if you lie down." age eleven

"It's something like a problem. When you grow up it's a problem you get sometimes. It has something to do with their life. It happens to people in the morning. When you grow up and in the morning when you wake up if you have a problem, it's called a hangover. I think that's what it is, anyway. I don't know anyone that has had one." age seven



"It's really something bad to have happen to you. It usually happens to people when they wake up. It's like a headache. It's something people try to get rid of. They drink black coffee when they're got one and they take aspirin. Usually you know ahead of time you're going to get one but sometimes they get it accidentally".-age eleven

"It's something that happens to people after they go to bed. After they've been having fun, about a couple of hours later it happens. They get a headache and feel terrible. There's a medicine they take for it. It's called Chasers. I've got a friend and his father's always taking Chasers. It's supposed to relieve you."---age ten

"A hangover is a bad feeling people get sometimes. It Doesn't last very long. Just about an hour or so. People only have hangovers in the morning. They go away after a little while but it's a bad feeling when they have one. People take aspirin for them and rest. They have to be very quite when they've got one."---age eleven

"It's when people get sick after they have been someplace. After they drink something it happens. They get sick to their stomach and they have to take things so they'll get over it as soon as they can. They try to rest a lot. They can still walk around, but they hardly ever want to go to work when they have one."---age nine

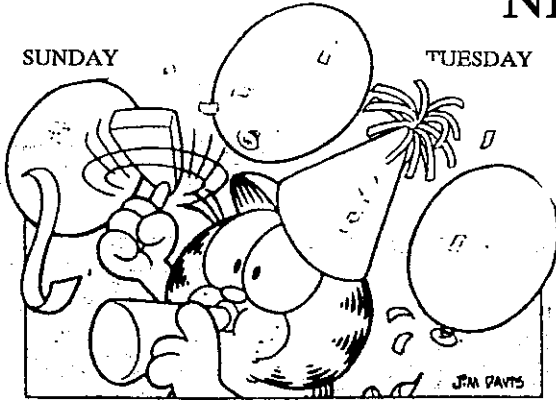

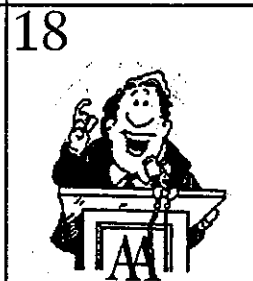

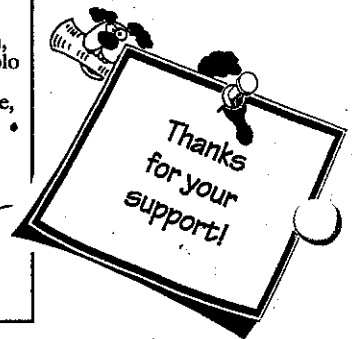
