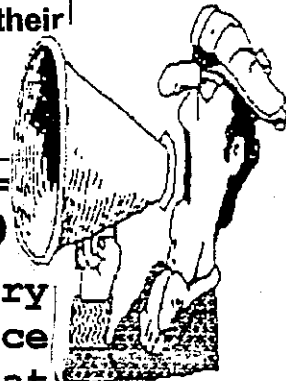

Kim C called for the after hours phone duty volunteers.

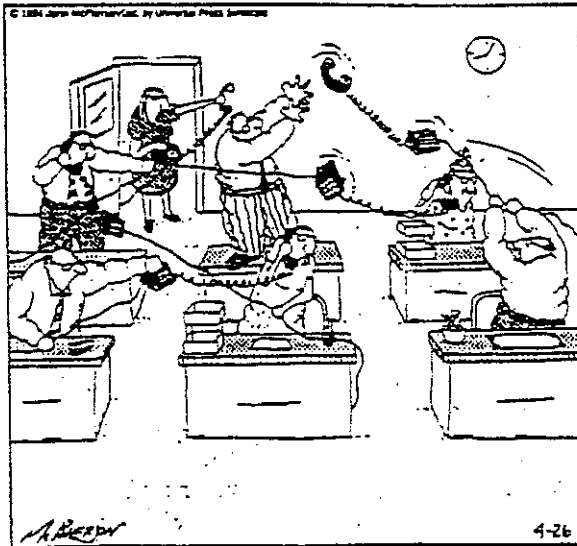
No new business was brought up

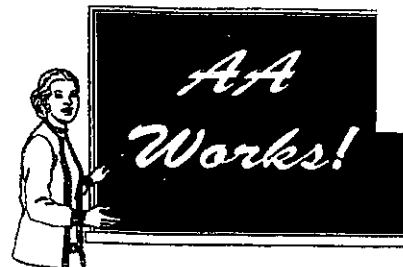

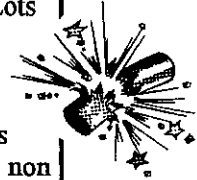

Sometime in those agonizing first 6 few month I asked my sponsor what I should do at 5 pm every day since that is when I did my heaviest drinking. His no non-sense response to my brilliant question was to not drink, go to an AA meeting at 5:30 and another at 8:15 and then it would be time to go to sleep. Why didn't I think of that? The insanity of my question and my thinking at that time did not hit me until several months later, when I recalled that it had been years since I waited until 5 pm to drink. I had not worked in those last 2 or 3 years and was drinking 24 hours a day. It was then that I realized my on going need of someone that has what I want and has been where I am, to help this alcoholic learn to live this odd new life of sobriety and guide me in my search for GOD as I understand HIM.

Louie R. - Group 12

No, The only sponsor I've ever had has long since passed away. Wherever I live I have certain people whom I trust to share with and who will tell me how I'm doing, (take my inventory) or suggest maybe I need to go in a certain direction.

Jerry S. - Universal City (Sunday) Group

I have two sponsors. Both have a lot of experience from which I can draw strength and hope. They taught me that the elimination of drinking was only a beginning. Now, I must change my thought patterns and behaviors.

J.T. - Ft. Sam Group

I was taught these two things I was never allowed to say to my sponsor (beside "no"). One was "yes, but" and the other "I know." There were times I did not like what

she said or I did not want to do what she suggested. She always says it's alright not to like it, just do it anyway. I wanted what she had, so I never question her, even if I think

she's wrong. She has always been generous with her time and I have benefited greatly from her guidance through the 36 principles of Alcoholics Anonymous.

Char - Foxy Ladies

Sponsorship is important to me. Without it, I doubt I'd have stayed sober. Since I joined AA, I've had 4 sponsors who loved me "back to health." Through sponsorship, I learned to work the steps, ultimately changing my life for the better. Sponsors are one of God's many sober blessings.

Mary D. - La Vernia - 9-30-83

No, my sponsor of 12 years died recently. He had been sober about 18 years and died drunk. I loved him and he gave me a lot during our time together. He also showed me how I don't want to die. Everyone needs a sponsor, so I must find a new one.

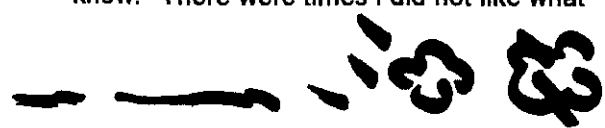
Tim S. - Acceptance Group - 4-6-96

MINUTES OF THE JUNE 21, 1998 MEETING

Central Service Office Liaison to SAMSO-David W (not present) Kim-Telephone Service Committee Chairman related the need for more volunteers for July. Call her at 522-0488.

SAMSO Liaison to Central Service Office-John S-the board is looking at the bylaws and Charter to update and bring them into line with the changes that have occurred since they were originally written. Due to Cleo T's resignation, Ed E. is the new board chairman and Dewey S. is the alternate. John S has been appointed by the board to serve the remainder of Cleo's term on the board. Trying to attract more volunteers for phone duty.

OFFICERS REPORTS:

SAMSO Chairman: Mary Lynn D-Reminded everyone that on July 19th the meeting time will change to 6 pm as Roger L. SWTA delegate will give his report.

Secretary's Report: Glenn C-Motion made by Lynn P, seconded by Shawn S, and approved to accept the secretary's report as published in the Nightcap. Handed out a map of the Llano area for those who will be attending the SWTA workshop in July.

Treasurer's Report: Lin P-Read the published report. We have \$1074.11. June donations \$106.67. Expenses \$150.46. Projected expenses of sending SAMSO chairmen to the July Workshop is \$750.00 which will leave us a balance of \$324.11. To date this year only 13 groups have made contributions SAMSO. The new "Partners Program" has started where past offenders with AA sponsors can carry the message into the facilities. Currently negotiating with the Wackenhut facility management to again begin to take the meetings there. The information table at the State Convention went well and made approximately \$540. for the literature fund.

Grapevine: Mary S (called and could not be present) Glenn C-The "ANNUAL GRAPEVINE FEST" has been rescheduled to the weekend of November 14th-location pending. Proposal brought forward as to whether we wished to renew the 25 Grapevine subscriptions which are divided between Corrections Committee, and Hospitals and Institutions Committees. This item will be placed on the agenda for next month for a vote by the groups represented at that meeting. There will be a health Fair in August, and she is working on radio spots for some radio stations that have inquired. They meet the first Tuesday of the month at 6:30 pm at Winners Club.
