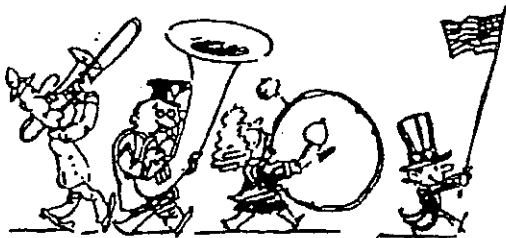

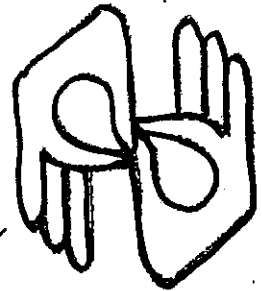

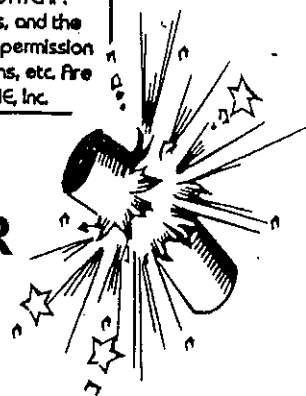

**COR Meeting -- Minutes (06/20/99)**

**Opening:** Dewey opened with a moment of silence followed by the Serenity Prayer. Lucian read the Twelve Traditions. Dewey read the COR Guidelines. The sign-in sheet was passed around. No new CORs present. Lucian made motion to accept minutes from the last COR meeting as printed in the Nightcap. Seconded by Ed. Motion carried

**Financial Report:** Wayne not present, so report given by Virginia. She noted that the column in the income statement labeled "4/30/99" should read the end of May and not April. The net income/loss was \$-191.89, but that does not reflect the AA in SA profit which has not yet been received by CSO. The convention committee is waiting to close out the account because although all convention bills have been paid, some checks from the groups are still coming in. The net income/loss figure will change dramatically next month. The net profit from the convention was reported to be \$11,393.57 in cash and another \$1,567.09 in cap inventory for a total of \$12,960.66 net profit. Any questions regarding the financial statement can be directed to the CSO or any Board member. Questions from Sheryl regarding money raised for Big Books were directed to Oscar of the CFC committee. Question from Sheryl about how group contributions are going. Dewey said this month they were up when compared to the budget, but they are still down a bit from normal, probably because of the convention. He also noted that there is an Area Conference this month, so some groups may be holding money back to pay for their representatives to attend. Sheryl commented that groups don't seem to be contributing regularly as indicated by a week last month at Club 12 where contributions were monitored and 27 groups failed to contribute at all.

**The Nightcap Committee Report:** Bill not present, no report.

**Telephone Service Committee (TSC) Report:** Kim reported that we desperately need help this summer. Volunteerism for "phone duty" was at an all-time low in June. There are still some June time slots available (the last weekend). The July calendar was passed around. A new flyer was passed out for CORs to take to their groups. With increased vacations and travel during the summer, there are fewer of the usual backup volunteers to cover unclaimed time slots. The AA phone went completely uncovered earlier this month for a few hours. CORs were asked to help spread the word about how badly we need volunteers. The TTY machine for the hearing-impaired announced last month has not been fully installed because it needs a part that will switch it between the TTY and the fax machine. More information on its status will be available next month. CORs were reminded how the "phone duty" calendar works. Both groups and individuals can sign up for any number of time slots. That does not mean you have to TAKE all time slots you sign up for -- you can dele them out to others. You are just agreeing to see that those time slots are covered. However, time slots are the responsibility of the person who signed up for them and should one of their people fail to show up, the time slot will fall back to the person who said they would be responsible for it when they signed up for it. Anyone wishing to volunteer for telephone service work, please call Kim C at 522-0488.

**COR Participation Committee:** Not present, no report.

**Old Business:** Nightcap subscription forms were made available on the table. If a Nightcap is returned because of a bad address, it will be dropped from the mailing list, so please be sure your name and address are correct on the sign-in sheet.

**New Business:** Ed asked if the Board of Trustees are elected by the CORs. Dewey said yes. Ed then asked why they are not all present at the monthly COR meetings. Dewey noted that the by-laws do not require all Board members to attend the COR meeting. Dewey, Virginia and Kim all stated that they felt personally that all Board members should attend and noted that most current Board members do try and attend whenever possible. Lucian brought up the historical reasons why many Board members stopped attending in the past. Historically, there had been much input from past CORs that when all seven Board members show up at the COR meeting, the CORs were often intimidated and sometimes even hostile in that they felt dictated to by the Board. So many Board members chose to stop attending to be less intimidating to the CORs. Question from Ed as to how groups can convey their wishes to the Board if Board members are not at the COR meeting. He was assured by Dewey that at least one Board member had to attend, since it is in the by-laws that the chairperson or vice-chairperson must attend. So, groups only have to show up at the COR meeting to get their messages to the CSO Board members, since anything brought up in the COR meeting is on the agenda for the CSO Board meeting the next month. Kim emphasized that all AA members and group representatives are more than welcome to attend the CSO Board meeting each month and discuss concerns with the Board directly. These meetings are held the Wednesday before the third Sunday each month at the CSO at 5.30pm. Burton commented that he has attended the Board meeting with concerns from his group and was given ample time to discuss those concerns, but he suggested that if a COR wants to address specific issues, they should probably notify the CSO a week in advance so their concerns can be put on the agenda for the Board meeting and time allotted for discussion in advance. Lastly, Dewey noted that we have an election coming up next November for new Board members. There is a nominating committee in place and they can be contacted if anyone is interested in running for the Board. Nominations should be in by October. We need at least eight names on the ballot, since we will be replacing four out-going Board members.

**Announcements:** New meeting directories will be available this week. The CSO will be closed one afternoon in July for an inventory, but the date is not yet known.

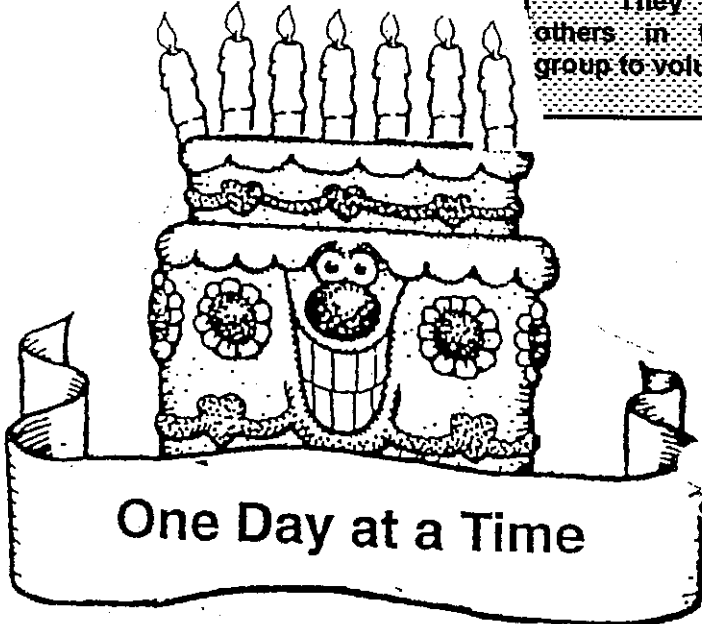

**New Business -**

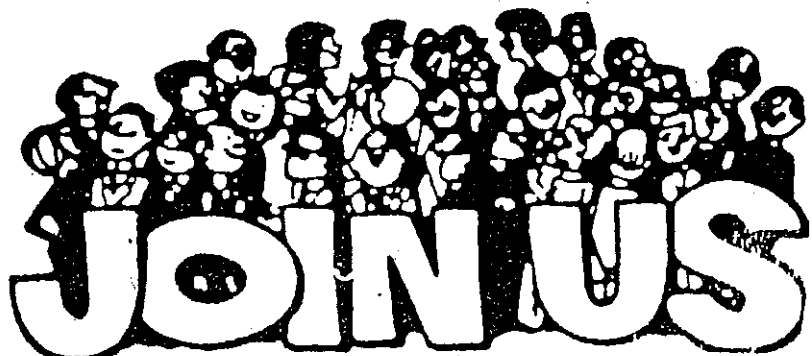

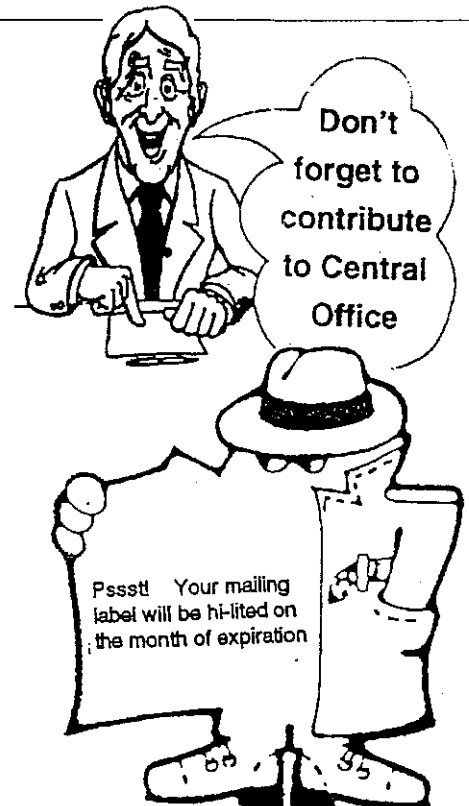
