



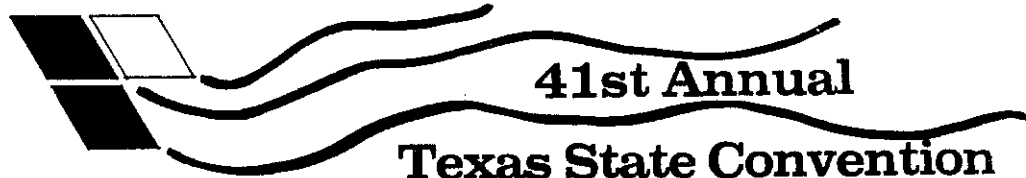

NEWS FLASH! NEWS FLASH!

Our Southwest Texas Area Delegate, Edell E., has passed along to us the following news from the 36th General Service Conference held in New York City in April. For the "juicy" details, come and hear Edell give her report--check with your DCM to learn when she will give the report in this area.

The future of the Big Book was one of grave concern. Through a misunderstanding of copyright law, all material contained in the first edition and also new material in the second edition has gone into public domain. Our future possibilities for the Big Book include a softcover edition, a gift edition, and a pocket edition.

Big Book sales during 1985 totaled 696,300! GSO literature sales rose 21 per cent during 1985. Projected 1986 Big Book sales are set at 780,000.

It was recommended that AA members be surveyed as to the need for an AA daily meditation book (Advisory Action).

The AA Grapevine finally broke even during 1985. Three new AA television public service announcements have been approved.

AA membership in the US and Canada grew 7 per cent to 750,000 during 1985--Texas has 30,663 members; New York has 44,969 members; California has 130,487 members. The SWT Area Conference (Austin, San Antonio, Corpus Christi, Rio Grande Valley) has a reported 6,651 members.

Contributions to GSO from the SWT Area Conference, at \$3.17 per capita, are higher than the national average of \$2.80, and are considerably higher than the per capita contributions from any other Texas area. The 1986 GSO budget is barely at the break-even point. Income from literature sales will contribute \$1,087,770 toward budgeted deficits. The recommended ceiling on individual AA member contributions was raised from \$500 to \$1,000.

The three finalists for sites of the 1990 International AA Convention are Houston, Seattle, and Vancouver.

"YOU CAN'T BE AN ALCOHOLIC BECAUSE ALL YOU EVER DRINK IS BEER..."

Right! That had to be a fact because my best friend, who was also my best drinking buddy, said so. So, I hoisted another Bud and drank to that comforting assurance.

I was a past-middle-age lady living in the Washington, DC, area, otherwise known as the per capita alcohol consumption capital of the world. I was a prodigious beer drinker, and had been for a long time. Also, for a long time, I had realized that I was in trouble with my drinking, but refused to put a label on it that would identify the magnitude of the problem. I clung to the faint hope that beer was safe.

In the last 3 years of my drinking I ate less and drank more and more. As might be expected, I began to have serious physical symptoms. I bruised easily; the smallest scrape or cut would bleed profusely and be slow to heal. My liver was grossly enlarged and I could not lie on my side without pain. By this time, my last hold on denial evaporated in the face of the evidence, and I knew that I continued to drink because I HAD to. Further, I realized, beyond any doubt, that I could not quit, and that only death could end my pain.

Admission of my helplessness and hopelessness culminated in total surrender on March 3, 1979, when I signed myself into a comprehensive treatment facility, fully expecting that I was going there to die. My epitaph would read, "Died by her own hand, the weapon being a pop-top."

Hey, people, I'm going to tell you something you already know--THERE ARE MIRACLES! And there is life after Lone Star--and laughs without Lowenbrau!

Somewhere I have an H. P. with a fine sense of humor--one who continually reminds me that the miracle of my recovery was not my doing. It was a group effort by a legion of folks who had walked my path before me, who loved me back to health, and asked in return only that I extend my hand and my hope to those still to come. I believe that we belong to a divinely inspired Program. I also believe that I have a sacred obligation to keep that Program healthy by observing the Traditions and practicing the Steps. It is a small payment on a very large debt.
