John Donne, an English poet, once wrote that no man is an island, separate and independent from the rest of the world, but that all of us are part of the same large body of mankind. 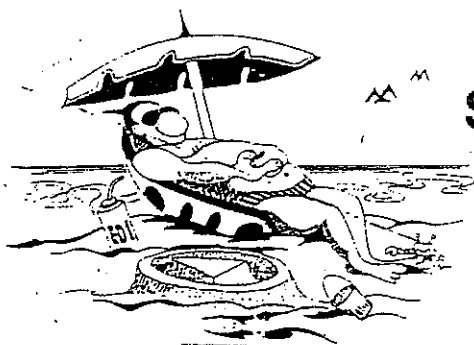
