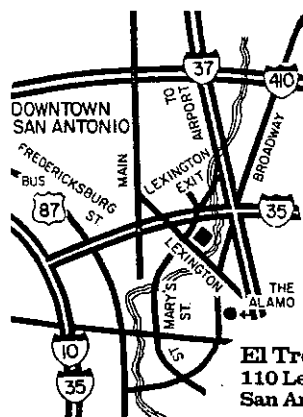

GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING

FEBRUARY 19, 1989

MINUTES

The meeting was opened at 6:30 p.m. with the Serenity Prayer by Wilson P., Chairman. The Traditions were read by Don C. "Supporting the AA Support System" pamphlets with copies of Western Directory listings enclosed were handed out for changes, etc., for GSO. Jim B. asked that all changes be given to him to make to GSO. The Sign-In sheet was sent around and approximately 60 persons were present; however, only 52 signed in. After the "Statement of Participation" was read, the minutes of the last meeting were read and approved without corrections or additions. After-Hour Telephone Volunteers were obtained (see list).

Committee reports were as follows: Wayne B., Finance, presented the financial report for the month of January. Hoyt S., H&I, obtained commitments for carrying the message in March (see list, below). Tom B., Public Information, reported that about 15 volunteers spoke to over 300 students at Gus Garcia Jr. High on Feb 2 covering 7 classroom hours. Also, four other volunteers spoke to 18 future Air Force drug counselors at Lackland on Feb 16 and Don N. spoke to a CCD class Feb 13. Other PI engagements soon to happen are at Holy Cross High School, Trinity Univ., UTSA, Ft. Sam, a parole office, John F. Kennedy HS, San Antonio College of Medical & Dental Assistants, and Forbes Elementary. PI meeting monthly is 2nd Wednesday, 6:30 to 7:30 p.m. at Club 12 in the Hope Room--we can always use more volunteers. Also a prison volunteer meeting on Mar 13 at St. Matthews Methodist Church, 2738 Bitters Rd, 2 blocks E. of Broadway. Jack S., from Jail Committee, reported that they need more volunteers; the old jail will be opened and they want meetings brought there tentatively on Tuesday nights. Please check with John B. if interested. Jim W., Convention, reported very few pre-registrations have come in; asked for groups to lead marathon meetings--there will be about 24 to cover. GSRs are requested to bring a list of hosts & hostesses for Convention meeting. \$3.00 charge for coffee for entire weekend was considered and will be decided at next meeting. Registration charges will be decided at next meeting--pre-registration is \$15.00. Jack S., Mailing, absent but report is in Board Meeting Minutes.

RE-DISTRICTING DISTRICTS 1-A, 1-B, 1-C, 1-D, 1-E, AND 1-F FOR  
SAN ANTONIO AND THE IMMEDIATE SURROUNDING AREA

The following highways will determine the boundaries of the indicated Districts:

- A. District 1-A will originate in the inner city of San Antonio with the South (or West, as appropriate) side of West Bound I-10 and where it joins with and intersects the North side of West Bound Highway 90. The District will extend outward in a pie slice shape.
- B. District 1-B will originate in the inner city of San Antonio with the North (or East, as appropriate) side of West Bound I-10 and where it joins with and intersects with the West side of Highway 281 North. The District will extend outward in a pie slice shape.
- C. District 1-C will originate in the inner city of San Antonio with the East side of Highway 281 North and where it joins with and intersects with the West side of I-35 North. The District will extend outward in a pie slice shape.
- D. District 1-D will originate in the inner city of San Antonio with the East side of I-35 North and where it would join with and intersect with the East side of South Flores Road eventually becoming Highway 281 South. The District will extend outward in an elongated pie slice shape.
- E. District 1-E will originate in the inner city of San Antonio with the West side of South Flores Road eventually becoming Highway 281 South where it would join and intersect with the South side of West Bound Highway 90. The District will extend outward in an elongated pie slice shape.
- F. District 1-F will be the Bilingual District, and it will represent all meetings so designated without reference to their geographic location.

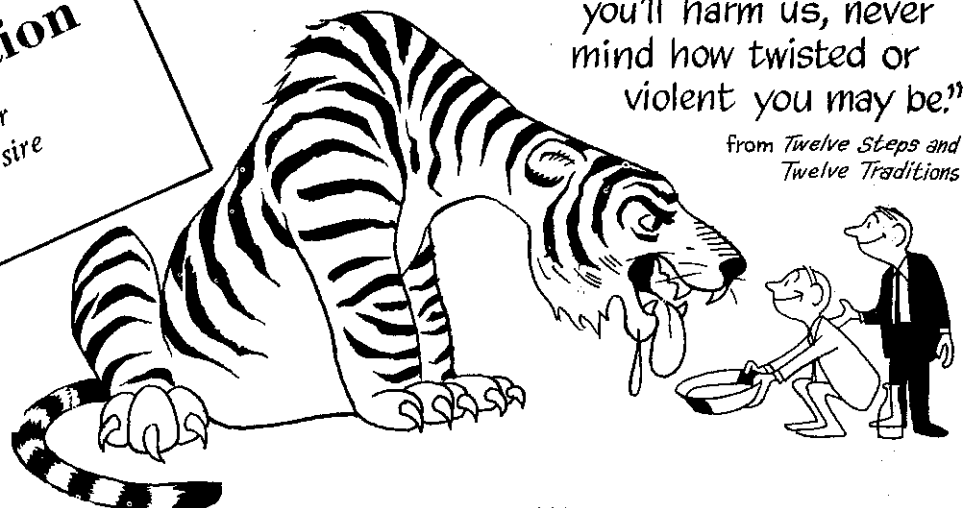

**The Third Tradition**

 to stop drinking.

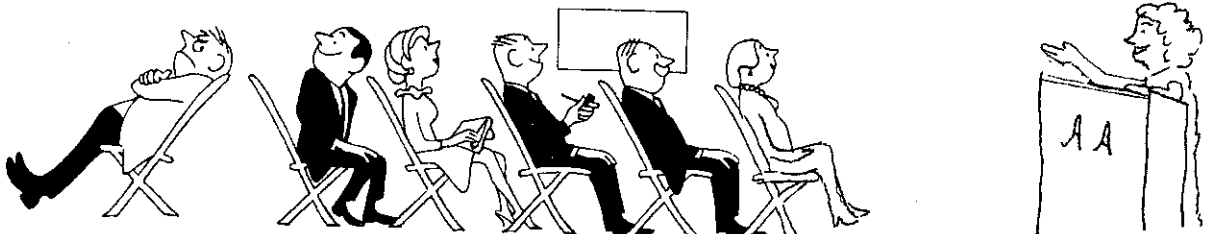

Isn't every organization entitled to have rules for membership? Why did A.A. decide to forgo this privilege, to be "inclusive . . . never exclusive"? That's easy. Early members tried it the other way, and it just didn't work. As the Fellowship was nearing its ten-year mark, the office that served as headquarters "asked the groups to list their membership rules and send them in," Bill W. recalled. "If all of these edicts had been in force everywhere at once, it would have been practically impossible for any alcoholic to have ever joined A.A. About nine-tenths of our oldest and best members could never have got by!" So the rule books went out the window and were replaced by one uncomplicated sentence: Tradition Three.

We've thrown away  
 all membership rules and  
 regulations that might keep you  
 out. We want you to have the  
 same chance for sobriety  
 that we have had.

But, somebody may ask, isn't this Tradition itself a rule? It does state *one* requirement for membership. Let's read it again, and ask another question: *Who* determines whether or not newcomers qualify, whether they do want to stop drinking? Obviously, nobody except the newcomers themselves; everybody else simply has to take their word for it. In fact, they don't even have to say it aloud. And that's fortunate for many of us who arrived at A.A. with only a halfhearted desire to stay sober. We are alive because the A.A. road stayed open to us.

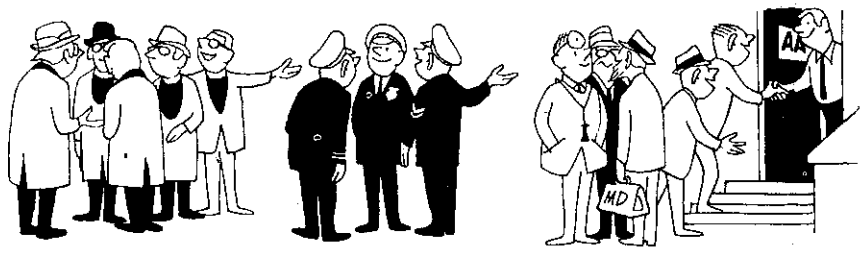

The problem faced by this Tradition isn't just past A.A. history. It keeps coming up—for instance, when a group debates whether to exclude alcoholics who are also hooked on other drugs. The Tradition mentions no such *negative* requirements, no demand that the prospective member must *not* be a "pill" addict, a homosexual, an ex-convict, a person with a record of mental illness. All alcoholics are welcome.

What about the group that seems to impose extra *positive* requirements, beyond "a desire to stop drinking"? This might be a "special interest" group or collection of groups in which, for example, each member must be a physician—or a young person, a man, a woman, a priest, or a law-enforcement officer. By their own account, those who belong to International Doctors in A.A. or Young People in A.A. consider themselves A.A. members *first*, and they attend general-membership meetings as well as those that fill their other individual needs, while remaining devoted to A.A.'s primary purpose.

These "special interest" groups offer only one instance of the wide variety within the Fellowship. Our Traditions allow unparalleled freedom, not only to every A.A. member, but to every A.A. group. . . .

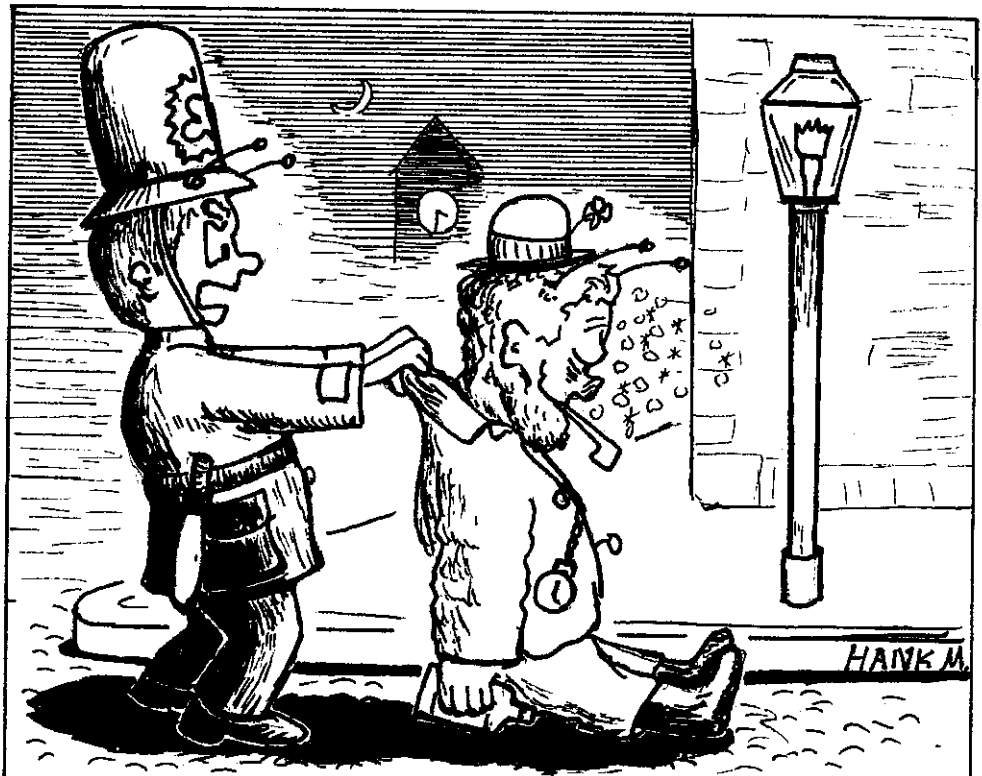

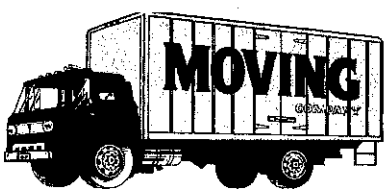
