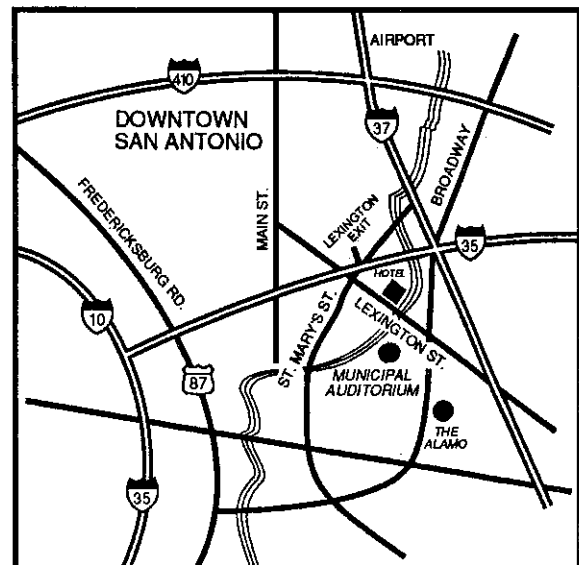

GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING MINUTES

February 17, 1991

The meeting was opened with the Serenity Prayer by Lalo A., Chairman, at 6:38 p.m. The Twelve Traditions were read by Tom McM. The check-in sheet was circulated and 66 persons were present, including two new GSR's and one Alternate GSR. After the Statement of Participation was read, the minutes of the previous meeting were accepted as printed in the February issue of THE NIGHTCAP. The financial report was given by Al D. explaining the new format and the loss shown in January was a result of large literature purchases. Volunteers for after-hour phone duty were obtained (see list below).

Committee reports were as follows: Eileen, H&I Chairman, asked for volunteers to go to various hospitals and institutions (see list below). Anyone wanting to sign up for an April time, in advance, is welcome to call Eileen before the next meeting. Don N., PI Chairman, reported that his committee has been busy--visited several schools, SAC Health Science Fair, and Ft. Sam Houston's 5th Army Annual Convention which was so well-received that they were asked to come back. Events coming up will be at St. Phillips College, Baptist Hospital Critical Care Nurses; St. Matthews Catholic Church Camp-Out; Holy Cross; Nimitz Middle School and many more. The Medical Center Hospital mental ward needs more literature to give patients and alcoholic family members. Flynn J., Jail Chairman, reported all is going smoothly and several people are seeking clearances. The women's meetings are going okay. Reminded all of the workshop on March 2 with the "Behind the Walls" theme. Bill T., Convention Chairman, brought fliers for the Weekend in SA Convention and asked persons calling to sign-up as helpers to please call him before 11 p.m. (828-7865). He reported that he hopes to have T-shirts for sale again; all meeting chairmen slots are filled; Ray A. will be the Voice of the Conference.

Old Business: Copies of the revised Policies and Procedures were made available to all present.

New Business: None.

CSO Report: 1540 copies (February issue) of THE NIGHTCAP were mailed with 20 being returned due to subscriber moving and failing to notify CSO. 101 reminder cards were mailed on 2-12-91 for the General Membership Meeting. CSO received 948 calls during the month of January and 324 reported by the answering service, making a total of 1,272--this is 182 more than were received in December.

Interdistrict Report: Richard O., DCM, 1-B reported that a workshop on "How to Chair a Meeting" will be held on Saturday, March 16, at the Winners Club from 8:30 to 10:30 a.m. He also said the Fresh Start Group needs help and reported a new group in his district, the New Hope Group.

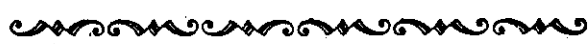

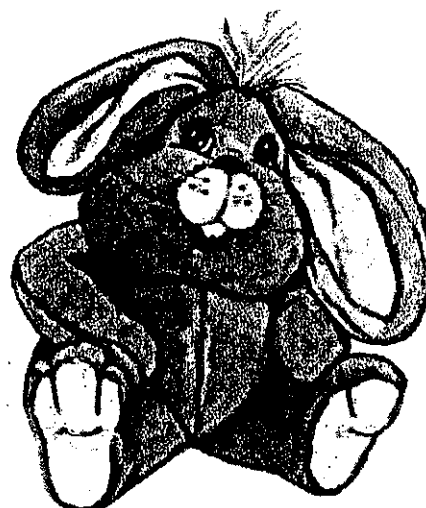
If anyone prefers to stay in the Banquet and Exhibit Area during the speaker meetings, there will be audio so the speaker can be heard.

Concept III

As a traditional means of creating and maintaining a clearly defined working relation between the groups, the Conference, the A.A. General Service Board and its several service corporations, staffs, committees and executives, and of thus insuring their effective leadership, it is here suggested that we endow each of these elements of world service with a traditional "Right of Decision."



As background for this Concept, you should be familiar with the Conference Charter and the Bylaws of the General Service Board, both of which are found in *The A.A. Service Manual*. For, except for the specific directions in these documents, every trusted servant and every A.A. entity—at all levels of service—has the right "to decide...how they will interpret and apply their own authority and responsibility to each particular problem or situation as it arises." That is, they can "decide which problems they will dispose of themselves and upon which matters they will report, consult, or ask specific directions." This is "the essence of 'The Right of Decision.'"

But this right also means the Fellowship must have trust in its "trusted servants." If the groups *instruct* their G.S.R.s rather than giving them a "Right of Decision," then the area conference is hamstrung. If the G.S.R.s *instruct* the area delegates rather than giving them a "Right of Decision," then the General Service Conference is hamstrung. As Bill points out, "our Conference delegates are *primarily* the servants of A.A. as they should...cast their votes...according to the best dictates of their own judgment and conscience at that time."

Similarly, if the General Service Board, acting through its subsidiary boards, "were to attempt to manage" the General Service Office and the A.A. *Grapevine* "in detail, then...the staff members... would quickly become demoralized; they would be turned into buck-passers and rubber stamps; their choice would be to rebel and resign, or to submit and rot."

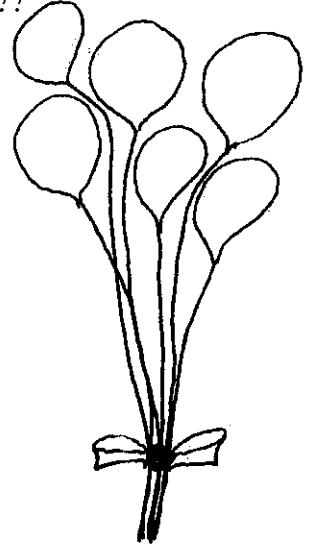
Bill warns against using "The Right of Decision" as an excuse for failure to make the proper reports of actions taken; or for exceeding a clearly defined authority; or for failing to consult the proper people before making an important decision. But he concludes:

"Our entire A.A. program rests squarely upon the principle of mutual trust. We trust God, we trust A.A., and we trust each other."
