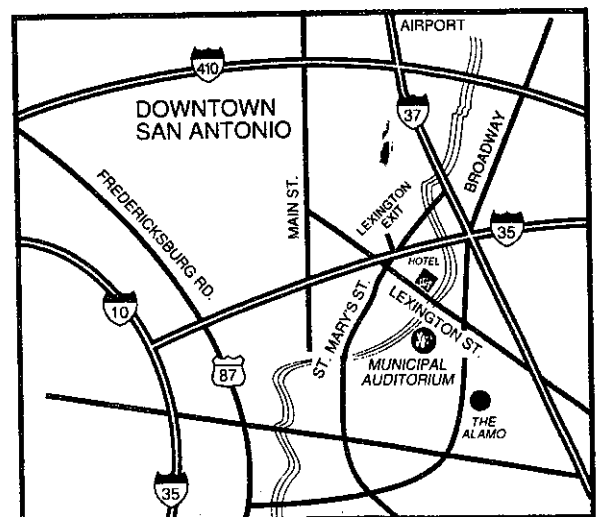

THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN OPEN AND CLOSED MEETINGS

The purpose of all AA group meetings, as the Preamble states, is for members to "share their experience, strength and hope with each other that they may solve their common problem and help others to recover from alcoholism." Toward this end, some groups hold both **open** and **closed** meetings.

The difference between the two main types is that **closed** meetings are for AA members only, or for those who have a drinking problem and "have a desire to stop drinking."

Open meetings are available to anyone interested in Alcoholics Anonymous program of recovery from Alcoholism. At both types of meetings, the AA chairperson may request that participants confine their discussion to matters pertaining to recovery from alcoholism.

Whether open or closed, AA group meetings are conducted by AA members. At open meetings, non-AAs may be invited to share, depending upon the conscience of the group.

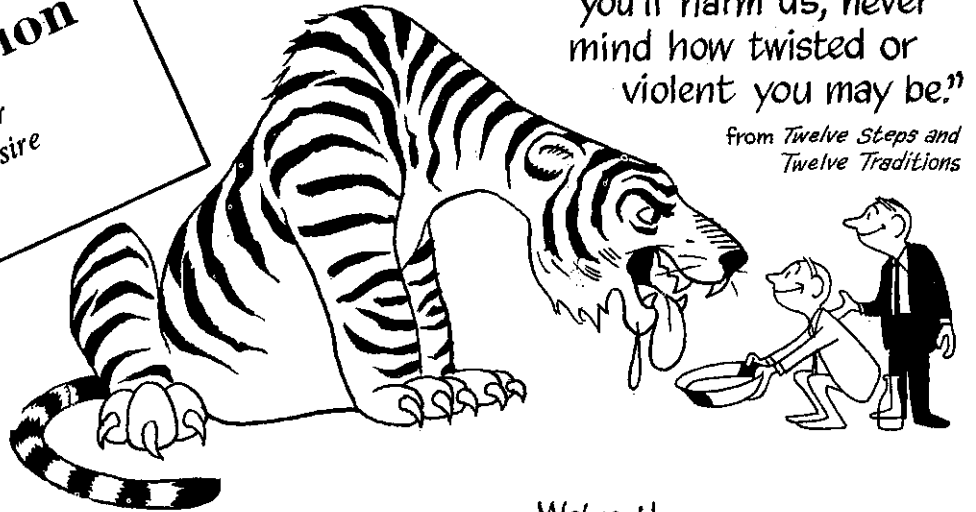

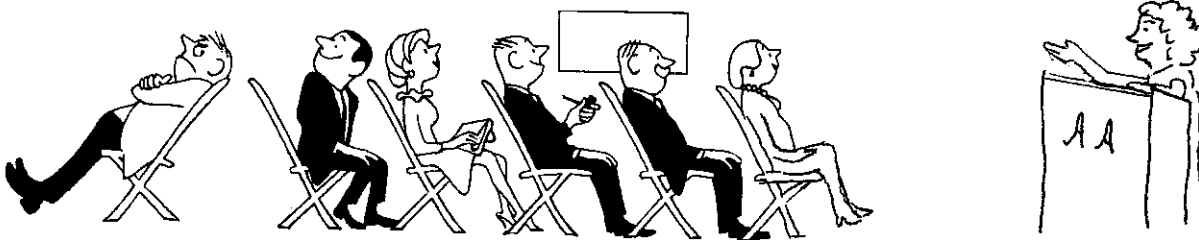
The Third Tradition
 The only requirement for
 A.A. membership is a desire
 to stop drinking.



Isn't every organization entitled to have rules for membership? Why did A.A. decide to forgo this privilege, to be "inclusive . . . never exclusive"? That's easy. Early members tried it the other way, and it just didn't work. As the Fellowship was nearing its ten-year mark, the office that served as headquarters "asked the groups to list their membership rules and send them in," Bill W. recalled. "If all of these edicts had been in force everywhere at once, it would have been practically impossible for any alcoholic to have ever joined A.A. About nine-tenths of our oldest and best members could never have got by!" So the rule books went out the window and were replaced by one uncomplicated sentence: Tradition Three.

We've thrown away
 all membership rules and
 regulations that might keep you
 out. We want you to have the
 same chance for sobriety
 that we have had.

But, somebody may ask, isn't this Tradition itself a rule? It does state *one* requirement for membership. Let's read it again, and ask another question: *Who* determines whether or not newcomers qualify, whether they do want to stop drinking? Obviously, nobody except the newcomers themselves; everybody else simply has to take their word for it. In fact, they don't even have to say it aloud. And that's fortunate for many of us who arrived at A.A. with only a halfhearted desire to stay sober. We are alive because the A.A. road stayed open to us.

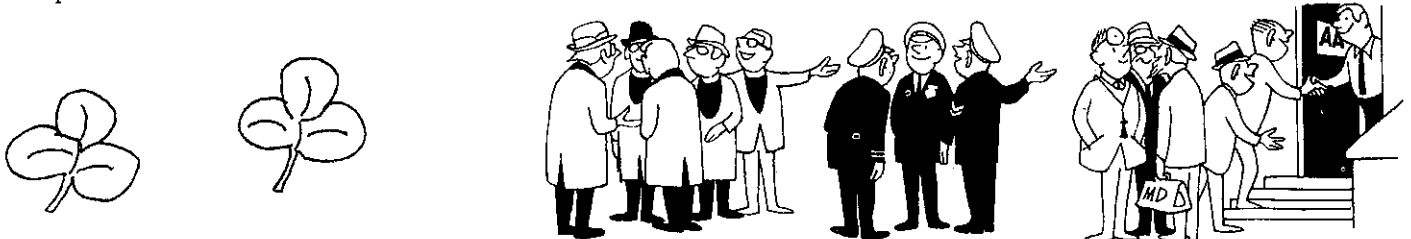

The problem faced by this Tradition isn't just past A.A. history. It keeps coming up—for instance, when a group debates whether to exclude alcoholics who are also hooked on other drugs. The Tradition mentions no such *negative* requirements, no demand that the prospective member must *not* be a "pill" addict, a homosexual, an ex-convict, a person with a record of mental illness. All alcoholics are welcome.

What about the group that seems to impose extra *positive* requirements, beyond "a desire to stop drinking"? This might be a "special interest" group or collection of groups in which, for example, each member must be a physician—or a young person, a man, a woman, a priest, or a law-enforcement officer. By their own account, those who belong to International Doctors in A.A. or Young People in A.A. consider themselves A.A. members *first*, and they attend general-membership meetings as well as those that fill their other individual needs, while remaining devoted to A.A.'s primary purpose.

These "special interest" groups offer only one instance of the wide variety within the Fellowship. Our Traditions allow unparalleled freedom, not only to every A.A. member, but to every A.A. group. . . .



DEAR GOD, WHERE ARE ALL THE OLD TIMERS?

Dear God:

I've been sober a little over three years and I need help.

I need the experience, strength and hope of the old-timers and I can't find them. There seems to be this incredible gap between 5 and 10 years of sobriety, so there are just a few people with this kind of time and yet they are too busy for me, to share with me or to guide me in times of trouble, and God, I know three people with between 10 and 20 years of sobriety and yet I rarely get to see them at my home group.

I love my home group, but where are the old-timers? We need them. Some meetings I go to feel like I'm the only one with some time, experience, strength and hope. There are so many newcomers and not enough old-timers. Where are they? Do they not care what happens to newer members of Alcoholics Anonymous?

I'm willing to go to any lengths to get what they have, only if I could find them and get to know what they've got. Our membership of Alcoholics Anonymous depends on the experience, strength and hope of our old-timers. I look around and rarely is a newcomer taken aside and presented with the first step, like it used to be done in Bill W's day. If we are not showing the newcomers what the first step is all about and the old timers don't show us what it is all about, our fellowship is going to be flooded with non-alcoholics.

Dear God, that scares me. Has the real fellowship gone underground and not told us about it? Have we been left alone with no hope? Where are all the old timers?

Dear God, please answer this plea for help. It is truly scary, so please remove my fear and show me what you would rather have me be. Thank you God for this wonderful fellowship and another day of sobriety.

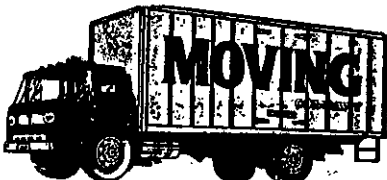
