CALL TO ORDER: Virginia

SERENITY PRAYER: Virginia

MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING: Motion to accept as written; motion carried.

Mary S. read statement of purpose; Linda C. read traditions.

New CORs - Linda C. from Goliad & Shane from Downtown Group. Virginia and Bill explained the responsibilities and roles of Board and CORs.

CONFERENCE REPORT: Joc McFadden, Hospitality Chairman discussed AA in SA Conference. Just over 234 pre-registrations to date. Asked CORs to encourage pre-registrations. Asked that they insure the conference is announced at all meetings. Groups are asked to make new banners unless they made a new one within the last two years. There will be a contest judged by the conference speakers.

Also reminded us about the Cowboy Taco Breakfast Sunday morning - a new conference event.

FINANCIAL REPORT: Louie R. reviewed financial report. He is still working on improving the format. Still in process of review of the figures with the accountant and making corrections. He is concerned about the decrease in revenue, even with the major fund-raising activity just ahead.

NIGHTCAP SUBSCRIPTION: Mary S. is publicizing Nightcap and encouraging subscriptions. There will be a service table at the conference that will include the Nightcap. Will need help manning table. Asked CORs to ask their groups to volunteer for half day, excluding meetings. Mary corrected her phone number on agenda to 690-7550.

PHONE COMMITTEE REPORT: Kim absent. Virginia said to call Kim if anyone wants to take slots. 522-0488 or 603-6935 (pager). Virginia also encouraged volunteering in the Central Service Office.

OLD BUSINESS: Retain or remove line regarding counselors and employees of Treatment Centers on 12th Step sign up form. The CORs had been asked at the last meeting to take this issue to their group. There was a motion to remove this sentence from the form. Motion passed with three yes, 2 no and 2 abstained. Another motion to include the 6th tradition on the form; motioned passed with 7 yes, 3 no, 2 abstentions.

NEW BUSINESS: Nominating Committee - Louie moved Ned S. head committee; Bill H. seconded; passed unanimously.

Secy to COR meeting. Should a board member or COR act as secy to the board meetings. CORs will take back to their groups. Discussion by Randy and Bill that it is beneficial for a COR to do this function.

Basket passed and adjourned with Lord's Prayer.

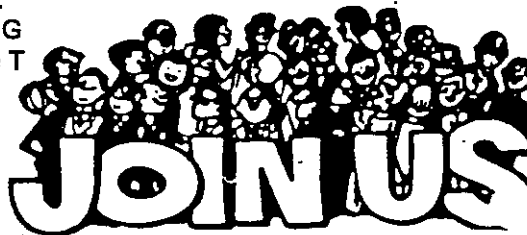
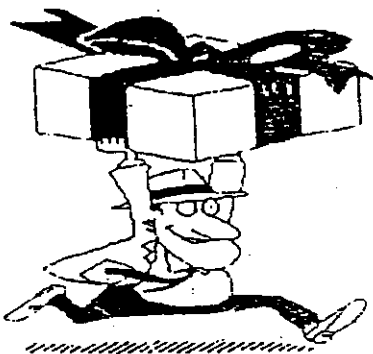
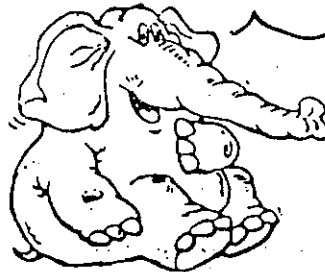

Singleness of Purpose

I recently completed the Eighth Step and have decided that my first amends should be to Alcoholics Anonymous itself, which I believe I have harmed to some extent by violating its singleness of purpose.

I used to identify myself as an alcoholic and an addict. I do not anymore because I now believe other addictions are irrelevant at AA meetings. But, aside from that, I also used to insist on talking about my other addictions beyond what was necessary to relate them to alcohol. I justified this by saying that alcohol was just another drug and so it was unfair to expect me not to talk about all my addictions. And refused to attend any other fellowship because I claimed to prefer the wisdom and sobriety in AA.

I realize now how rude and self-centered this position was. It is not a question of what is fair or whether alcohol is just another drug. The Traditions and primary purpose of AA are what they are whether I agree with them or not.

In the past, when I was active, I often had dinner at homes of people who did not use drugs, but who did drink. I never considered insisting that I had the right to smoke a joint at their dinner table because they were drinking wine. And imagine if I had, and then added insult to injury by saying: "And not only do I have a right to use any drug I want to around here if you're going to drink, but I'm going to keep coming back and I'm going to keep using any drug I want to in your home because I like the food you serve and your company better than the food and company I find in the homes of my drug addict friends. And I have a right to do this because all drugs are the same and I don't care what the rules or customs of your home are."

Such gross abuse of hospitality sounds preposterous, but that is essentially what I was doing by insisting that I had a right to violate AA's singleness of purpose. I was abusing the hospitality of this Fellowship.

This is not an apology. I was too sick to realize how selfishly I was acting, and a mere apology is not necessarily an amends. I am hoping to amend the harm I did by stating clearly what I did, for the benefit of others, and, further, by not doing it again.
