GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING
MINUTES
8404 SPEEDWAY, SEPTEMBER 18, 1988

The meeting was opened at 6:30 p.m. by Darlene B., Vice-Chairman, with the Serenity Prayer. The Twelve Traditions were read by Bob T.; there were 42 persons present. New GSR's and COR's were recognized and reminded to contact their DCM's. Literature on the table was called to everyone's attention; Statement of Participation was read. The minutes of the August meeting were approved as printed in the September issue of THE NIGHTCAP. Telephone volunteers for after-hour duty in October were obtained (see list below). Committee reports were as follows:

Finance Chairman, Wayne B., gave a very thorough and comprehensive financial report, explaining any variation in detail. He also commended the CSO staff for their work in preparing input for the financial statement.

H&I Chairman, James H., asked for groups to volunteer to carry the message to various facilities. (See list below.)

CPC/PI Chairman, Tom B., was welcomed as new chairman of this committee since it has been combined as one. He asked for volunteers to man the table of literature that will be set up at the National Association of Social Workers and Counselors conference to be held at the Gunter Hotel on September 29, 30, and October 1. He also asked for volunteers to help with CPC and PI work.

Jail Chairman, John B., who is the new chairman of this committee was unable to attend this meeting.

Editorial Chairman, Dee S., thanked everyone for news articles for NIGHTCAP and reported that CSO had received 766 telephone calls in August; 26 more than in July.

Convention Chairman, Jim W., was absent.

Mailing Chairman, Jack S., reported that 1211 bulk-rate newsletters were mailed out for September issue and 5 went by first class out of the U.S. 930 issues were mailed at .076 cents each; 281 issues were mailed at .084, which made a savings of approximately \$8.00; however, six have come back for improper address which cost \$1.50. He asked GSRs to try to impress on their group members the importance of keeping us informed of their correct address.

THE NONALCOHOLIC ADDICT

Many treatment centers today combine alcohol and other drug addiction under "substance abuse" or "chemical dependence." Patients (both alcoholic and nonalcoholic) are introduced to A.A. and encouraged to attend A.A. on the "outside" when they leave. As stated earlier, anyone may attend open A.A. meetings. But only persons with a drinking problem may attend closed meetings or become A.A. members. Dually or multiply addicted people are eligible for A.A. membership only if one of their addictions is to alcohol.

Dr. Vincent Dole, a pioneer in methadone treatment for heroin addicts and for several years a trustee on the General Service Board of A.A., made the following statement: "The source of strength in A.A. is its single-mindedness. The mission of A.A. is to help alcoholics. A.A. limits what it is demanding of itself and its associates, and its success lies in its limited target. To believe that the process that is successful in one line guarantees success for another would be a very serious mistake." Consequently, we welcome the opportunity to share A.A. experience with those who would like to develop self-help programs for the nonalcoholic addict using A.A. methods perhaps, but using the experience of the nonalcoholic addict during drug addiction and recovery.

SPANISH AA LITERATURE

Since the First Asamblea Estatal Hispana held in San Antonio, in 1980, in which all Hispanic AA Groups from Texas were represented and attended by GSRs, DCMs, and intergrupal representatives, it was stressed at each workshop that Hispanic Groups should buy Spanish literature from AA World Services, Inc., in New York.

Vincente M., Spanish Services General Service staff officer, has always strongly urged that all Spanish literature be purchased from GSO at various Asambleas Estatal Hispana. Just recently he happily announced that the first printing of the Spanish AA Big Book has been sold out--and that is, for sure, good news! This could have only happened if the majority of Hispanic AA groups were ordering Spanish AA literature from AA World Services in New York!

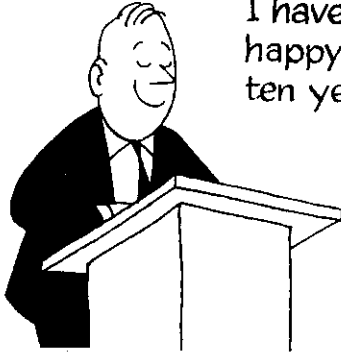

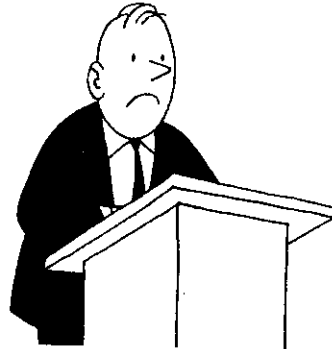
The Tenth Tradition

Alcoholics Anonymous has no opinion on outside issues; hence the A.A. name ought never be drawn into public controversy.

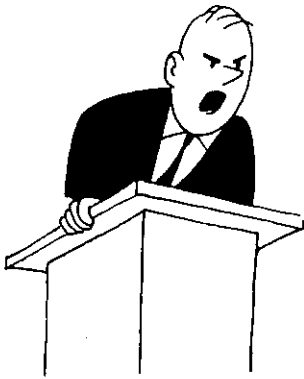
And so, thanks to A.A., I have maintained a happy sobriety for ten years. I thank you.

...I know I speak for all of A.A. when I protest the current legislation before the Congress! I refer to that infamous piece of rubbish known as House Bill No. X7-11-12!



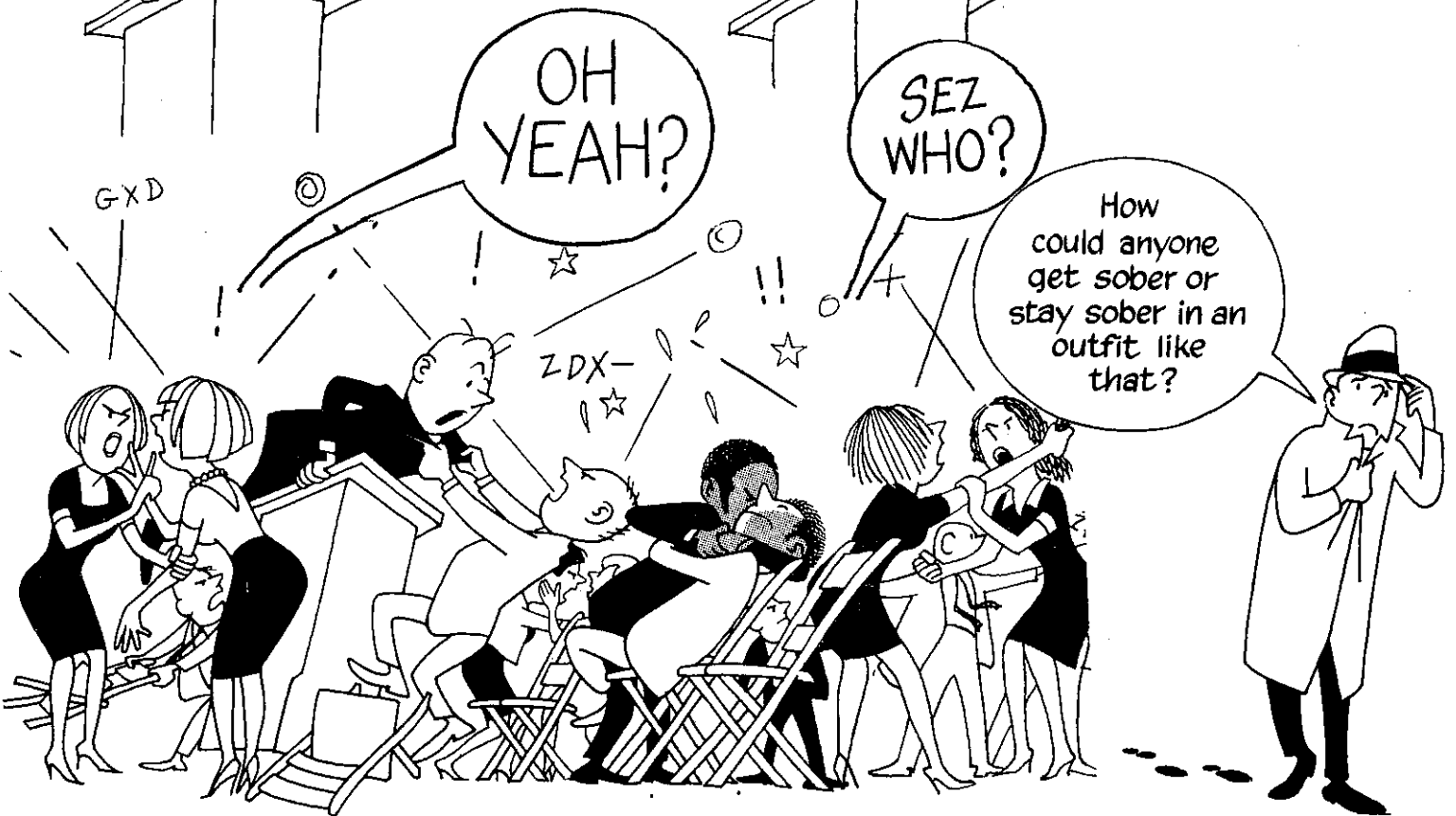

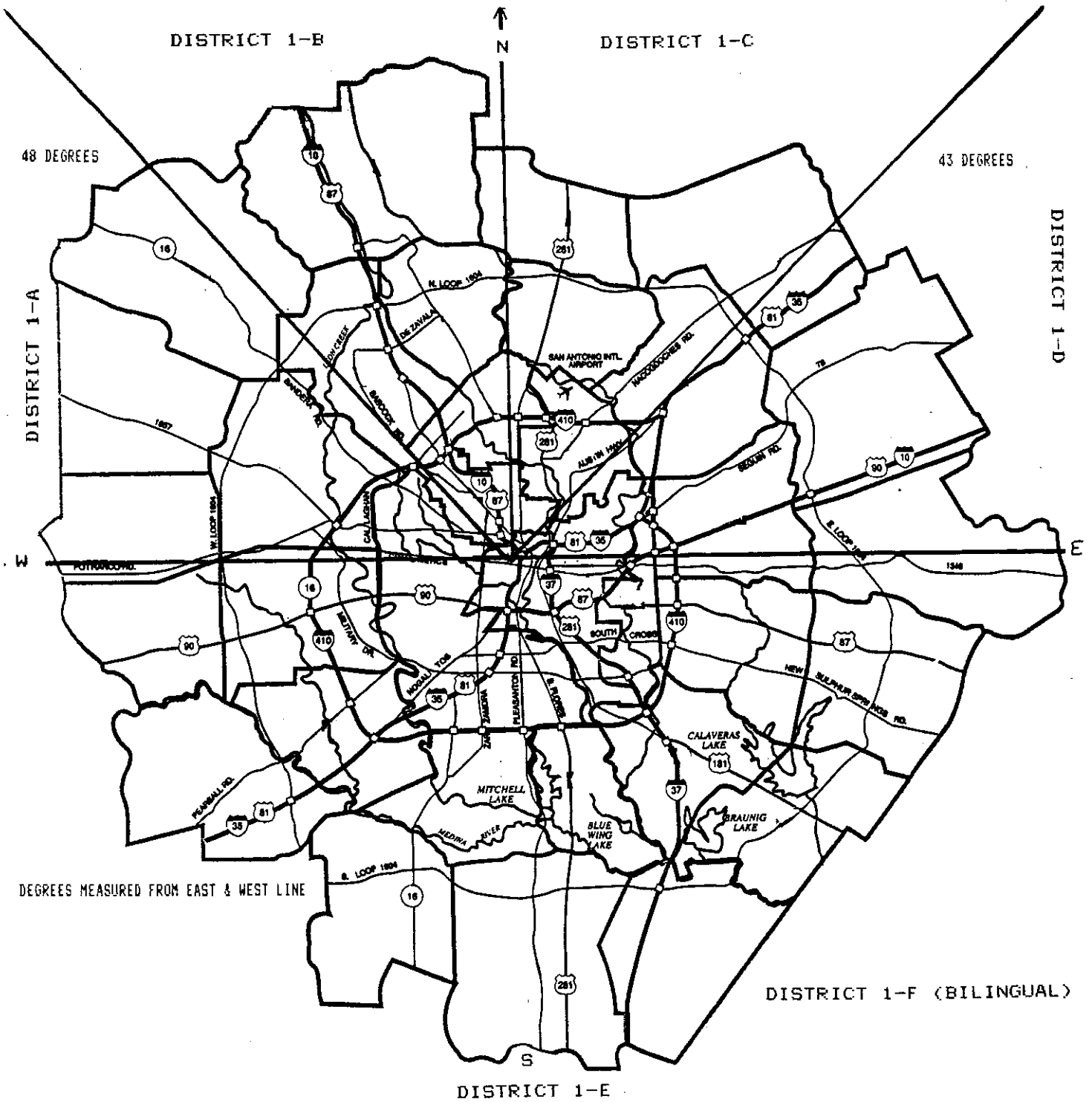

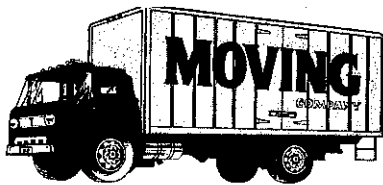
