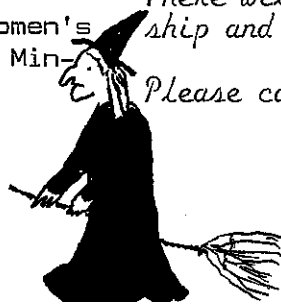

GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING MINUTES
SEPTEMBER 17, 1989

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Wilson P., Chairman, with a moment of silence acknowledging five recent deaths of AA members, which was followed by the Serenity Prayer. Bob T. read the Twelve Traditions. The Check-In Sheet was passed around and new GSRs and CORs and Alternates were asked to introduce themselves. There were six new GSRs and three Alternate GSRs. After the "Statement of Participation" was read, the Secretary read the previous meeting minutes which were accepted as read. After-hour telephone volunteers were obtained for October (see list below). There were 62 persons present!

Standing Committee reports were as follows: Wayne B., Finance, gave the financial report from 40 years ago, which was enjoyed. Then gave a detailed and comprehensive report of the current financial situation, referring to the August Balance Sheet and August Income Statement, which was followed by questions and answers. Hoyt S., Hospitals & Institutions, Various groups volunteered to take meetings for the month of October (see list, below). Don N., Public Information, reported there were 8 volunteers at the last committee meeting. They have decided to assign certain people for specific jobs, i.e., public schools, private schools, military bases, etc. Also has a 5-person sub-committee working on having a public forum during October, which is Alcohol Awareness month. The meeting location for October of this committee will be on the 2nd Wednesday, at 6:30, place of meeting is published elsewhere in the NIGHTCAP. John B., Jail, asked for more volunteers to take meetings to the low-risk inmates--need at least 4 more. This meeting will probably be held on Wed., Thurs., or Fri., depending on the volunteer's preference. Announced that the women have gotten some more volunteers, but need male volunteers--please call CSO and leave name and phone number if you have 1 year of sobriety and no felonies.

OLD BUSINESS: Doug G., reported more information on the International Convention to be held in Seattle on July 5 thru 8, 1990. Roundtrip by United Airlines is \$338 per person but a \$25.00 deposit is needed. Rennert Travel Agency now has 36 names of persons who want to go. Asked if anyone wanted to donate \$1500 for a deposit, they would get a free ticket.

NEW BUSINESS: Clara H., SASH AA Group GSR, made a plea for more "bodies" to attend their meeting. Also asked if the groups are willing to continue donating to and supporting the annual Christmas party. The response was "yes."

CSO REPORT: 1409 copies of the September NIGHTCAP were mailed with 33 being returned due to wrong address. CSO received 819 phone calls during office hours with 467 reported by the Agood Answering Service for a total of 1286 for August. The Alamo Answering Service is working very well, so far. Reminder cards for the GMM were mailed. Jim W., Convention Committee Chairman will be on the Board of Trustees agenda for October to go over the 1990 Weekend in SA Convention plans.

DCM REPORTS: 1-A: Donna T. reported on the 7th Traditions Workshop; had 46 people attend. There will be another workshop on Sponsorship on November 11, with a planning meeting to be held on Saturday, October 7, at Winners Club at 12:15 p.m.

1-B: Sam R. requested all GSRs in his district to attend the Saturday, September 23, 9:15 a.m. meeting at Club 12, since an election will be held.

1-C: Jeanne B. reported they had just had elections and now have an Alternate DCM, Tom McM.

1-D: Absent; 1-E: Absent; 1-F: Absent.

JEWELS FROM THE JAIL

"To all my fellow friends and members of AA, hello, my name is Beverly and I'm a drug addict. But now while my stay here in jail, I have found out they hold open AA meetings here. And being I have this problem, I started attending them. And at my first meeting I heard, 'If you bring the body, the mind will eventually follow.' They were so right. Since I been attending the meeting I have found alot out about myself that I didn't know. All I have to say, I really have become very fond of the ladies and look forward to seeing them as well as the meetings. I know without my AA meetings or the comfort of knowing someone else is going or has been through what I'm going through and is willing to share it with me as well as the other ladies makes me feel like I'm part of the sober society again, like a human being again, and with my sobriety I feel like I can make it, if I take it one day at a time, 'cause all I have is today."

"My name is Jackie, I am an addict. I am residing in the Bexar County Jail presently, as I have done so many times in my past and I am so thankful to be able to announce that because of AA, I have a feeling of new direction this time. What the program of AA shares with us here in jail has made a major impact in my life, my outlook and inlook. I have been greatly inspired. I have been given common knowledge that I have for years refused to acknowledge, and that is, I have a choice and a will to change, all I have to do is want it bad enough and through the meetings and the reading of AA literature, I have come to believe."

Slipping into bed with various members of the opposite sex.

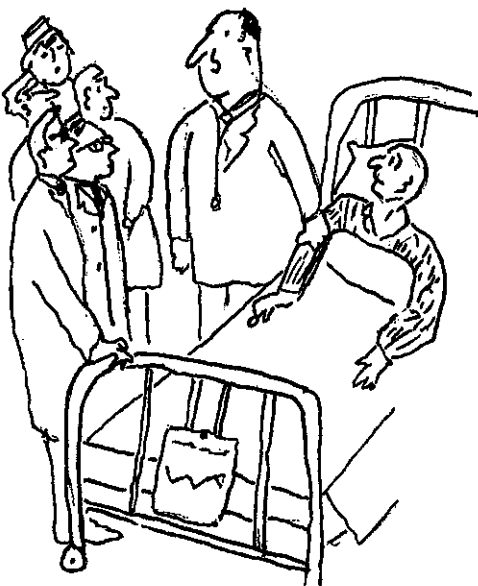

I shall explain this case more thoroughly during the autopsy.

"My recent issue of the Daily Reprieve mentioned that we all ought to support the anniversaries, and other local AA functions. Because most of us get a little tighter with our monies after we get sober, there is difficulty in getting the recovering drunks to the events.

I was reminded of standing by my sponsor at a local meeting when the basket was passed. It was evident that the man next to me on my left was new or angry or both. He shoved the basket on to me without so much as a glance. My sponsor remarked that the man did not want any. And I laughed heartily as I thought I knew what he meant.

Later that next week, over a cup of coffee I found the real meaning of passing it on. My first thought about the man not putting monies in the basket and not wanting any, was the stories that had come from the early days. Then, if someone had no money he was encouraged to take some (so the story goes), and he could put some back later when he was on his feet.

However, my sponsor said that his meaning was that the man actually did not want any, as in 'he did not want any.' We have all heard

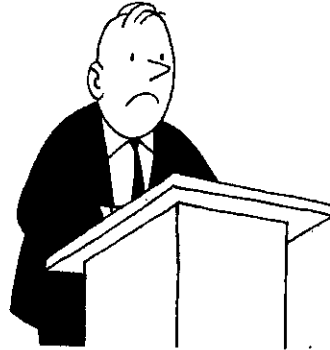

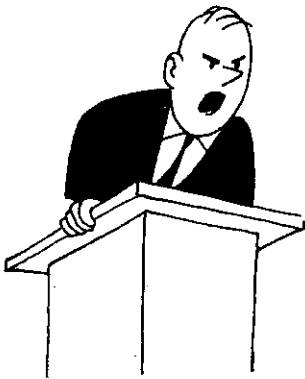

...I know I speak for all of A.A. when I protest the current legislation before the Congress! I refer to that infamous piece of rubbish known as House Bill No. X7-11-12!



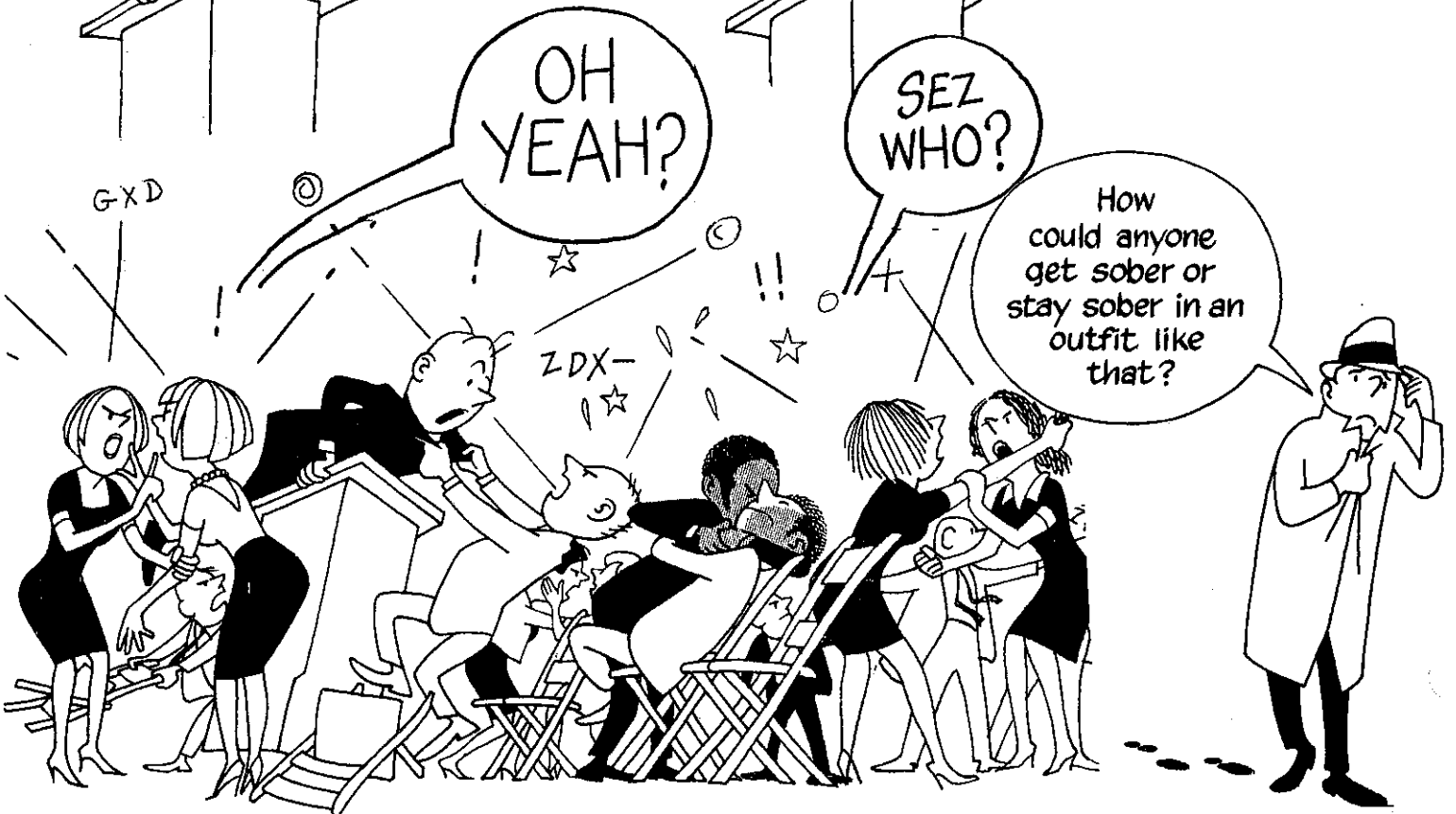

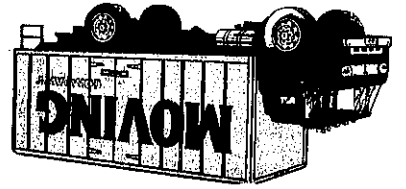
