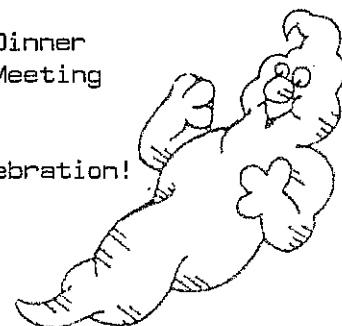

GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING MINUTES

SEPTEMBER 16, 1990

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Bob T., Chairman, with a moment of silence followed by the Serenity Prayer. The Twelve Traditions were read by John M. There were 52 persons present including four new GSR's. After the "Statement of Participation" was read, the minutes of the previous meeting were accepted as printed in the September issue of THE NIGHTCAP.

The financial Report was presented by Al D., who gave a clear and concise report. Volunteers for After-Hours Phone Duty were obtained (see list below). H&I Committee Chairman, Eileen, announced that all H&I meeting slots had been filled by Groups calling her direct. The list for October is printed below. Don N., PI Committee Chairman, reported the Inman Residential Treatment Center requested A.A. temporary sponsors, and requests for Spanish speaking speakers are coming in from west side schools. Coming up: Judson H.S. is having a health fair, Incarnate Word College school of nurses wants a booth and speakers for their health fair, S. A. College of Medical and Dental Assistants requests speakers, Channel 5 has contacted AA for Alcoholic Awareness week, and the next P.I. C.P.C. meeting is Oct 10 at 6:30 p.m. at Club 12. JAIL COMMITTEE CHAIRMAN-absent, no report.

OLD BUSINESS: Jon Kasper read the qualifications for a trustee, and stated Larry Y. was the only nominee to fill slot left vacant by Doug G. He asked for nominations from the floor. There were none. John P. moved we elect Larry by acclamation. Richard O. seconded and ayes carried. Four new Trustees will be elected in Nov., there are fourteen nominees at this time and they were asked to stand and introduce themselves.

New Business: AAWS will have a price increase effective Jan. 1, 1991.

Mac M. asked about getting 12 step list up-dated and unwilling people removed. Mary replied the GSR's should tell the volunteers to note all information on the log sheet as to whom called and who would or would not take calls.

CSO Report: Mary O. gave a brief summary on the CSO/Intergroup Seminar in Newark, N.J, and said a detailed report would be available soon. 1532 copies of THE NIGHTCAP were mailed for September; 20 returned. 1,137 telephone calls received during the month of August. The landlord has installed a light in the stock area and put a new roof on the building.

DCM Report: Knut H., 1-C reported the General Assembly is in Austin Oct 5-7. The 2nd Regional meeting will be in Albuquerque Oct. 19-21. There will be a Spanish workshop at the Unity Club Nov. 17, 12:30 p.m. He also thanked everyone for going to the P.I./C.P.C. workshop in Devine. It was well presented and enjoyed by all.

Announcements: Rush Hour Group will move to 8600 Wurzbach effective Sept. 24. Colonies North Wed midnight meeting is going so well they have added Friday and Sat. midnight meetings. These are closed meetings.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 7:15 p.m. with The Lord's Prayer.

THE 12-FOOT WALL

Having descended into the vast and not so grand canyon of alcoholism, I found myself confronted. No person confronted me, I was confronted by a sheer cliff. This cliff, this wall, stood between myself and recovery; between me and God. Others who had recovered stood above and with me, having scaled this wall upon their very own personal staircase. All of these staircases were of the same basic design, yet each was unique and only those who had built them were allowed unlimited access to them.

How strange and unusual this scene was to me. There must be an easier, softer way to arrive at my destination. Repeated attempts and elaborate schemes ended in failure. So be it. I, too, must build the stairs, but how?

I asked some of those who had built stairs of their own what I should do. A few of the staircases struck me as solid and admirable. I liked the looks of them and wanted mine to be of like quality. Those soon-to-be-trusted few gave me a fine blueprint--a Big Blue Book. In it was the information I required: A solid foundation, exact dimensions, quality of materials, tools and detailed instructions, along with a few pointers to make my job easier. The staircase was to be broad and sturdy. The banisters smooth and stout. No low-grade lumber was to be used. All materials were to be of the very best I could find, all angles precise, all steps square, all lumber true. No twists or bends. To scale this height required 12 steps--not 11, not 13, but exactly 12.

What a task! I can't do it! I need help! Here the trusted few did all they could, but the work had to be my own or the staircase could not function. False starts, bad lumber, angry fits, frustration, and depression--slips, falls, many scrapes, bruises, and splinters are the beginner's lot.

Determination finally brought some measured progress. With this came encouragement and guidance and the occasional motivating 2 X 4. Completion of each step brought a renewed desire to finish the job. At last, success! The project was christened with tears of joy. The celebration tempered only with the realization of commitment to the maintenance of the steps. To insure access to our common recovery I began retracing the steps and maintaining them so that others could arrive at their destinations. Passing on to those who follow as best we

can, what we were taught about how to defeat the 12-foot wall.

Right now, having acquired some knowledge and experience, there is NO WALL, NO OBSTACLE, NO PROBLEMS SO BIG, that the 12 Steps won't get you over. And that, my friends, is a promise!

If you wish to get active in service work, putting your name on the 12-Step List here at CSO is a great way to do it. When a prospective AA member calls here and wants to know about AA, or wants someone to talk to him or her, we call someone on the 12-Step List and ask that person to call the prospective member. We especially need people who are available during the day time to return these calls--we do not have any women listed in the 922, 923, 924, or 927 telephone prefix numbers. If you have 6-months of continuous sobriety in AA, please consider this opportunity.

## ARE WE RESPONSIBLE?

How many of you belong to groups that are not self-supporting? Do you endorse the 24-hour hotline, buy Big Books from CSO, or use the San Antonio meeting directories, but not contribute financially to CSO? Do you believe in sending literature to jails, starting meetings in the Soviet Union, or having a General Service Office (GSO) in New York for coordinating correspondence, but not send any money to the district, area, or GSO? If you can answer yes to any of these questions then you are not self-supporting.

Did you know that almost half of CSO and GSO's income comes from literature sales and not group donations? Many of us are ill-at-ease with AA affiliations with outside organizations and especially with treatment centers, yet, almost half of our revenue comes from them. What would happen to AA if our revenues fell in half because treatment centers stopped buying literature?

Did you know that the CSO manager makes \$12,740 per year? Similar positions with most not-for-profit organizations pay between \$30 and \$40,000 per year. What would happen if we could not find a qualified person to run our administrative office at that salary? Why must we rely on the generosity of a couple of AA members to work full-time for one-third of what they are worth?

Did you know that without the AA in SA Convention every year, CSO could very easily be operating at a loss? CSO's net income for 1989 was \$7,722.79 and the AA in SA net income was \$7,281.66. What service would we have to give up if the convention lost money? The answering service? THE NIGHTCAP?

How much money did you put into the basket when you joined AA? Was it a quarter? A half-dollar? A dollar? Most AA's have put a dollar in the basket ever since they joined AA or at least since they have been able to afford it. That includes those who sobered up over 20 years ago. Now, how much did a gallon of gasoline or a quart of milk cost when you joined AA? Probably much less than it does now.

If you currently do not donate anything to the basket, consider donating something--a dime, a quarter, a dollar. The knowledge that we are contributing something, no matter how small, is great for our self-esteem. If you have been giving a dollar for a few years and your finances are in fair shape, why not give a little more--maybe a dollar-fifty or two dollars. Check the

contribution page of THE NIGHTCAP and see if your group is donating to CSO and ask your GSR or Secretary if you are donating to the district, area, and GSO. Have a group conscience meeting and decide how to best spend your money.

AA's statement of responsibility comes to mind:

I am responsible...When anyone, anywhere, reaches out for help, I want the hand of AA always to be there. And for that I am responsible.

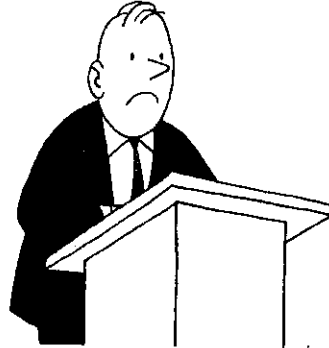

*Alcoholics Anonymous has no opinion on outside issues; hence the A.A. name ought never be drawn into public controversy.*

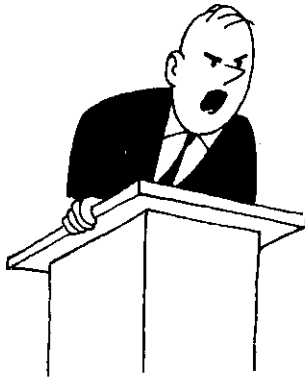
And so, thanks to A.A., I have maintained a happy sobriety for ten years. I thank you.

...I know I speak for all of A.A. when I protest the current legislation before the Congress! I refer to that infamous piece of rubbish known as House Bill No. X7-11-12!



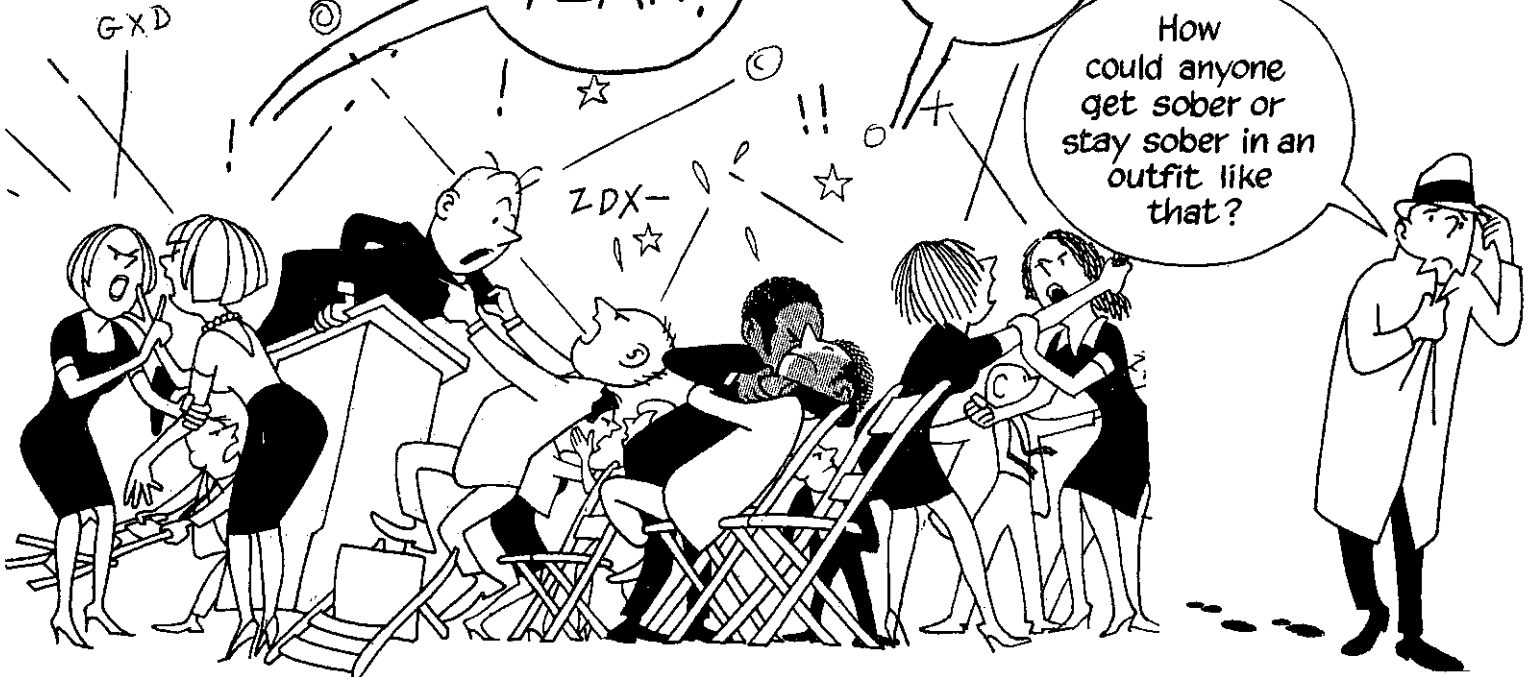
