MINUTES-COR MEETING Sunday, September 20, 1998

Ed E opened the meeting with a moment of silence followed by the **serenity prayer**. Wendy T. read the **COR guidelines**. Ron G. read the **12 Traditions**. The sign-in sheet was passed around. All CORs were asked to check the accuracy of their listing.

Noel McD. made a motion to accept the **minutes the August COR meeting** as written in the Nightcap. The motion was seconded and carried.

Financial Report: was given by Ed E. There followed a discussion of the Board's decision to introduce changes to the financial report (format) to help everyone better understand the report itself. Burt C. said his notes showed the CORs wanted to leave the report as is. Ed E said there may have been a misunderstanding on his part on this issue. Dewey S. took over as meeting chair. Much discussion on both sides ensued with no real decision reached. One compromise offered was to present both formats for the decision on which one best serves all concerned.

Telephone Service Committee: Kim C. reported that we will be adding a list of the H& I Meetings to the phone service packet and eventually to the back of the local directory. The purpose is to give phone volunteers and others information on meetings that those visitors in the downtown area might attend. She also reported discussion at the CSO board meeting about including the Al-Anon meeting schedule in our phone service packets. The board felt this was inappropriate and violated our singleness of purpose. however, anyone may get a copy as an individual member of AA and use it during their phone duty. *This month marks the one-year anniversary of the new volunteer run after hours Telephone Service Committee. An open "Thank You letter to all the volunteers who made this year possible will appear in the Nightcap.* The months are filling up early now, but there is an ongoing need for new volunteers for the Telephone Service Committee. Call Kim at **522-0488** for information or to sign up.

Old Business: 1) Stuart S brought up the proposal made at last month's meeting to have the CORs run their own meeting with a board member present to bring CSO and board news. Few of the CORs had actually discussed this with their groups. It was decided to table the discussion until next month, giving the CORs a chance to bring this to their group conscience. 2) Only 2 nominations have been received by the nominating Committee for the November elections to fill the 3 positions coming open. We need at least 6 nominations for a proper election. If you have question or a nomination, please call chairperson, Lucian D. at 494-0468 or Stuart S. at 732-5037.

New Business: A letter was received by the CSO Board regarding the loss of communication with the groups brought about by the decision by the previous board to cease sending free copies of the Nightcap to GSRs to take to their groups. Since many groups GSRs did not regularly attend the SAMSO monthly meetings to pick up a copy, a motion was made by the board by David W and passed to reinstate mailing Nightcaps. Since the Nightcaps cost less to send than to be returned undelivered, it was decided that any bad addresses would be struck from the mailing list. The GSRs and CORs are being asked to keep their addresses current with the CSO.

Announcements: Anniversary Parties in October were announced for the Marymont, Acceptance, and Alamo Heights groups. Workshops in October will be held by Group 12 and District 17. Flyers were distributed. **The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.**

We introduce ourselves at the beginners meeting with first and last names and it is suggested that after the meeting we all go to coffee. Newcomers are our lifeblood and we try to lower the relapse rate.
