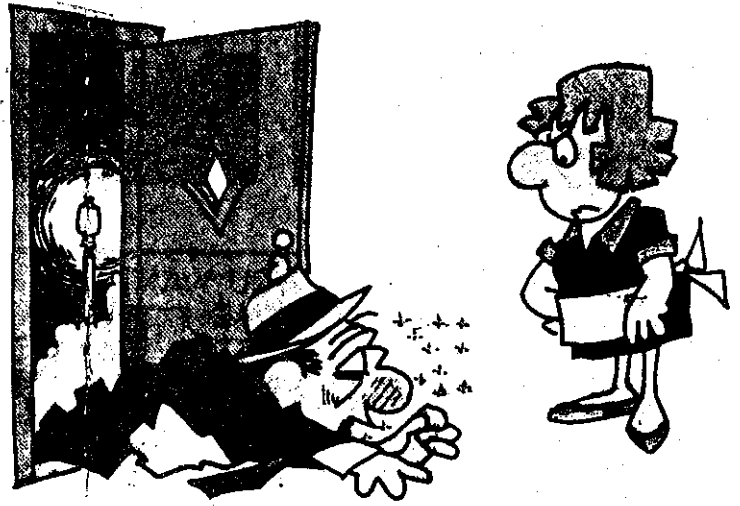

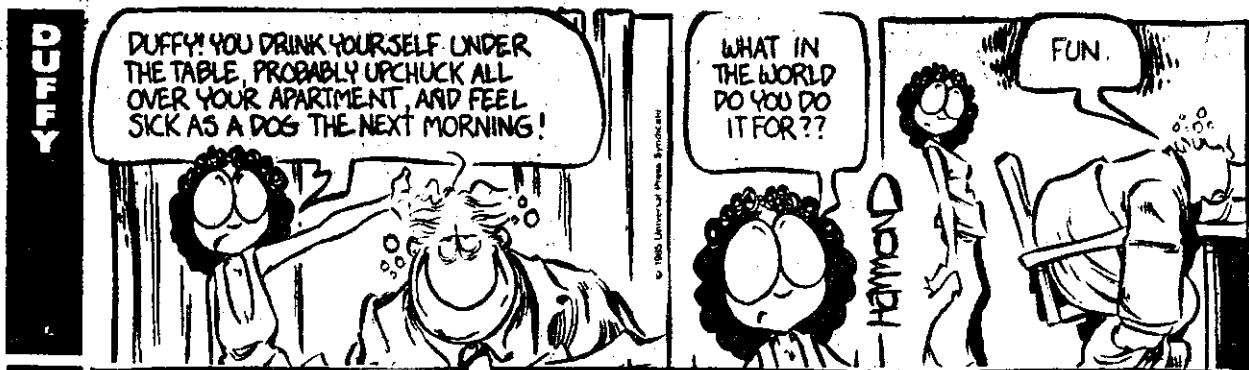

CENTRAL SERVICE OFFICE COMMITTEE MEETING  
CLUB 12, AUGUST 18, 1985

My oh my, how AA meetings differ! I suppose there are just about as many different meeting formats as there are meetings! Most meetings open in more or less the same way, with the chairman introducing him or herself, then comes the reading of a prologue of some sort--one the group has devised or the one that is found inside the GRAPEVINE (which is definitely my favorite), then the "moment of silence," followed by the Serenity Prayer, a portion of Chapter 5, etc. But, when is the collection basket passed around?

At some meetings, the basket is passed before the discussion begins or the speaker starts talking. This isn't too popular, but it does

get the money from those who have to leave before the meeting ends. Late arrivals can usually find the basket after the meeting, if they wish to donate.

Some meetings stop everything at the half-time mark, the secretary presents a report, the basket is passed, then the meeting resumes. This procedure catches everyone--the late comers and the early leavers! And, is probably the most profitable, money wise.

Other meetings leave the basket in a very conspicuous place, the chairman makes a point to say where the basket is, and it is not passed around at all. Members may drop in their donation before or after the meeting, at their convenience.

At some meetings the basket is not passed until the speaker ends his talk or the last person at the discussion completely finishes what he has to say, which is the way I, personally, feel it should be. It is my opinion that the chairman starts the basket going around the room by putting in the first donation. Also, the chairman waits until the last voice is heard before he says "there are no fees or dues but we do pass the hat." How many times have we seen someone sitting close to the basket grab it and start it around (because they are in a hurry to end the meeting, no doubt) while a member is still talking? Everyone frantically starts searching their pockets or purse for their donation--causing lots of shuffling of feet and chairs and mumbling about needing to make change, etc. This is one of the most inconsiderate and rude actions that takes place at any AA meeting.

What if the last person to speak is attending their first meeting? The last member to speak at a discussion just may be saying the exact words that you need to hear to keep you coming back. A speaker's last words may be the most important words for your sobriety that he has said during his entire talk--often the best is saved for last. But, you didn't hear it because you were searching for your donation--too bad you missed it!

If your group is guilty of inconsideration for the last speaker, you might remind them of the words found in the "Golden Rule."
