Dear *Nightcap*:

I would like to share with your readers my deep satisfaction in having not had to take a drink of alcohol since August 22nd, 1983. I would appreciate your listing me as having achieved my 14 year birthday in your next issue.

I made my professional reputation, such as it was, by knowing more about the rules and regulations governing my duties and those of my contemporaries than others. I became a self-proclaimed expert, and wore that personally tailored mantle for years. Upon developing a desire to stop drinking, I was ready to incorporate my old ideas with my new way of life to gain stature within Alcoholics Anonymous. I believe only divine intervention brought to my attention that it wasn't how much I knew, it was how I used it that mattered. Thus, I cannot cite chapter and verse of the Big Book to support any contention I may have which may be supported by AA approved literature.

Still, I pay close attention to what is said and who says it in meetings, as I have been told that my life may depend on what is said there. I especially enjoy listening to people who are relatively new to our society ritually reading the beginning paragraphs from chapter five of our text. I have heard some wondrous things. One of my sponsors once read that we "humbly asked Him to restore our shortcomings." My favorite step to listen to is the twelfth, where so many of us confuse the articles "a" and "the". I believe the step, as written, intended to communicate that there was only one intended result of the first eleven, and that was to achieve a spiritual awakening.

Thank you for your continuing efforts to carry our message.

PHONE VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

The Central Service Office (CSO) maintains a 24-hour telephone so alcoholics needing help or meeting information have a central place to call. When the CSO is closed, the task of answering the AA telephone falls to volunteers from groups in the local area. Recent problems in finding responsible volunteers have caused our "24-hour AA telephone" to be manned by an answering machine (call notes) far too often. Whether this was due to people forgetting they had signed up for a time slot, didn't know how to transfer the phone, or consciously chose to ignore the time they signed up for is unknown.

To try and fix the problem and keep our 24-hour AA telephone answered by live, sober, alcoholics, a Telephone Service Committee (TSC) was set up last month at the COR meeting. The method of telephone service work (a better term than "phone duty") has not changed. It uses call forwarding, so you don't have to go down to the CSO and sit all night. Your number is never given out.

What HAS changed about telephone service work is the method of getting volunteers. We will no longer be asking four CORs to volunteer their entire group for a week of phone service (18 time slots). Now, volunteers will be on an individual basis and time slots for the entire month are up for grabs simultaneously. A group with only five people who really enjoy phone service work can now simply take five slots. The group's COR doesn't have to pad the 18 weekly time slots with people who didn't really want to do phone service. You no longer have to wait until your group is volunteered by your COR. You simply volunteer yourself. (You can still volunteer through your COR, however).

Another benefit to this method will be for those who have one night a week free, yet really enjoy doing phone service work. Let's say you have Wednesday nights free. When it was weekly, you could only sign up for one slot on one Wednesday night. Now, you can take all four Wednesday nights, if you so choose. People who like doing phone service work can take as many or as few time slots as they want.

The TSC meets the third Sunday of each month at 5PM in the same location as the COR/GSR meetings. Please call Kim C. at 522-0488 or the CSO (821-6235) for more information or to volunteer for a time slot in September.

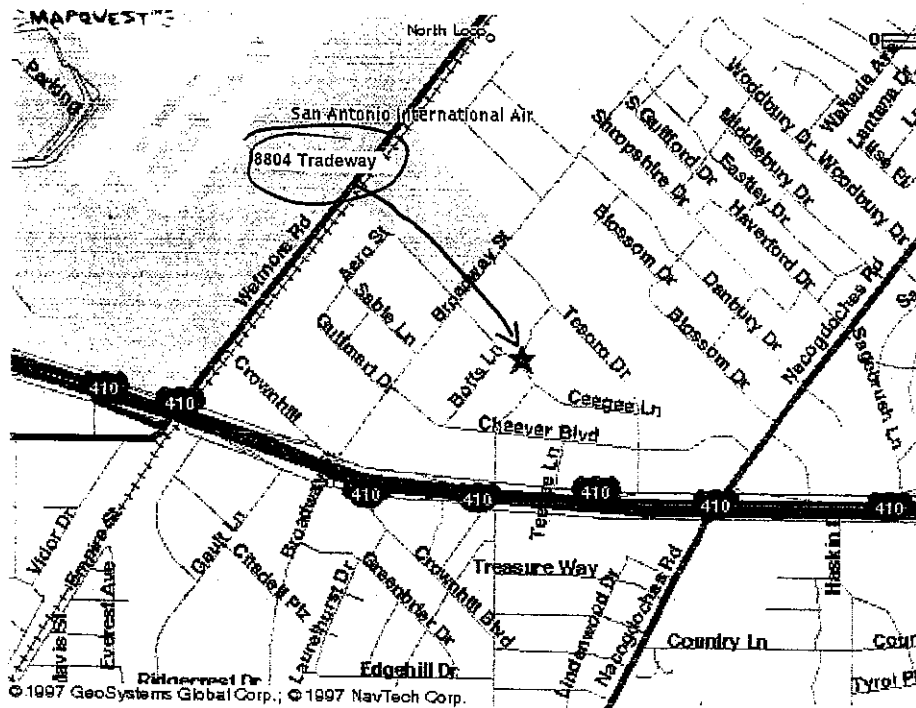
