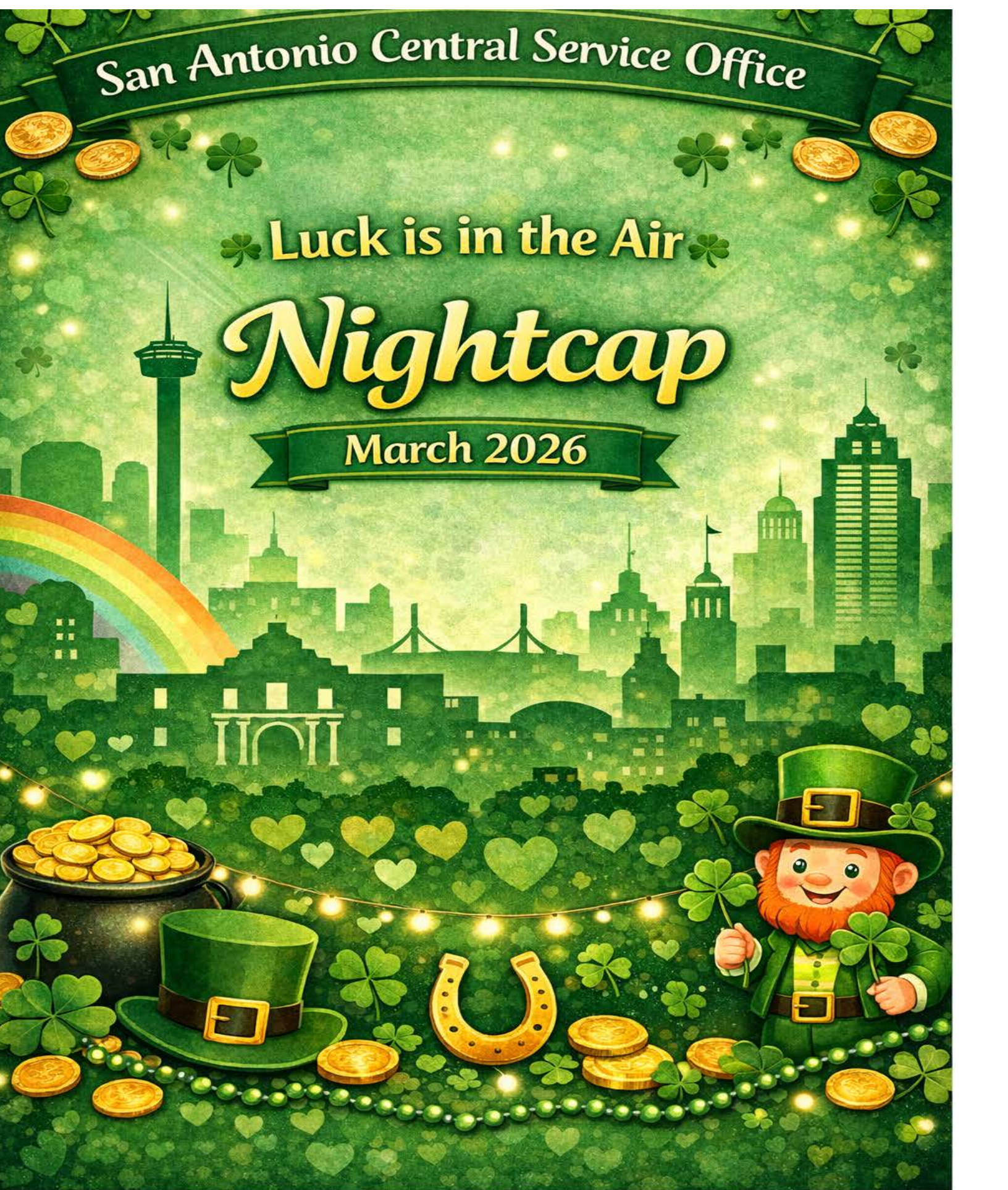

CHAIRMAN'S CORNER

****Tradition Three****

I was raised in an organization that had a lot of rules and requirements. Some were written, some were implied, and some were simply passed along as verbal teachings everyone was expected to know and follow.

All time is assigned time.

You must live out of two suitcases.

Indirect action is preferred to direct attack.

We never make a decision until it is absolutely necessary.

Every decision is checked with another colleague.

And on and on.

By the time I came into the rooms of Alcoholics Anonymous, I was already weary of organizations. Joining anything new felt intimidating, if not downright threatening. I was, after all, becoming a member of **another** group. I had heard the rumors — whispers about A.A. being a cult, concerns about conformity, and of course the tricky “Higher Power” issue I knew I was going to have to confront sooner rather than later.

So, imagine my relief when I learned about Tradition Three.

**“The only requirement for A.A. membership is a desire to stop drinking.” **

That was it. No checklist. No probationary period. No rules — written, implied, or whispered in the background. You couldn’t kick me out for not doing things the “right” way, because there was no single right way. I belonged here, and frankly, there was nothing anyone could do about it.

That realization gave me a freedom I didn't even know I was craving. I was allowed to explore recovery at my own pace. I was allowed to grow — and stumble — and make mistakes along the way. Yes, there are *suggested* steps, but they are just that: suggestions. No one was standing by with a stopwatch or a clipboard. I wasn't going to be expelled for working the steps too slowly, too quickly, or for doing my Fourth Step on the wrong color paper.

Most importantly, I felt safe enough to be honest. I could share with my sponsor my reluctance to trust — and rely on — a Higher Power without fear of condemnation or exclusion. I could say, "I'm not there yet," and still be fully welcome. That kind of acceptance was new to me, and it was powerful.

It was beautiful then, and it remains beautiful now.

I am eternally grateful for Tradition Three and for all those who have upheld it over the years. By protecting this simple, radical principle, A.A. has created a safe and inclusive space where alcoholics can come as they are, recover as they are able, and find their own path forward.

That gift — the gift of belonging without conditions — is beyond anything that can be bought, enforced, or regulated. And for many of us, it makes all the difference.

AA Education Article

General Service Office & AAWS Updates – Fourth Quarter 2025

1. General Service Office Quarterly Report (Q4 2025)

The General Service Board met November 3, 2025, in New York City. Committees reported on service efforts supporting archives, corrections, public information, literature, international services, and technology. Updates included revisions to archival policies and workbooks, improvements to Cooperation with the Professional Community materials, and continued outreach efforts within correctional facilities.

Financially, contributions were below budget year-to-date, while literature sales exceeded projections. Operating expenses remain under budget, and the Reserve Fund stands at approximately 6.2 months of operating expenses. Trustees emphasized continued communication to the Fellowship regarding self-support and prudent financial stewardship.

Publishing updates include continued development of the Plain Language Big Book, including tools explaining how proposed changes are reviewed and assessed. Bulk book discounts and other pricing initiatives were also implemented to support groups and service entities.

AA Grapevine and La Viña reported improved financial performance compared to 2024, driven by growth in digital subscriptions, apps, and podcast engagement. Intergroups and central offices may now partner with Grapevine and La Viña to offer subscriptions locally, earning a commission while supporting outreach.

International committees continue preparations for upcoming World Service Meetings and ongoing review of licensing and translation efforts. Technology teams reported improvements to the Meeting Guide app and data integrity systems supporting more accurate communication across the Fellowship.

Facsimile copies of the First Edition Big Book have been permanently discontinued. According to AAWS via direct phone communication, no additional printings are planned.

2. AAWS Announcement: Twelve Concepts for World Service Video

AA World Services has announced the release of the animated “Twelve Concepts for World Service” video. Adapted from an A.A. Great Britain version and aligned with the U.S./Canada Conference structure, the video offers a lively whiteboard-style introduction to A.A.’s service structure and the roles and responsibilities within the inverted triangle of service.

Based on the pamphlet “Twelve Concepts Illustrated,” the video is available for viewing and sharing on aa.org, with French and Spanish versions forthcoming. The project was made possible through Seventh Tradition contributions to the General Service Board.

Groups are encouraged to order Conference-approved literature through their local Central Service Office whenever possible, supporting Twelfth Step services at the local level.

THINGS WE CANNOT CHANGE

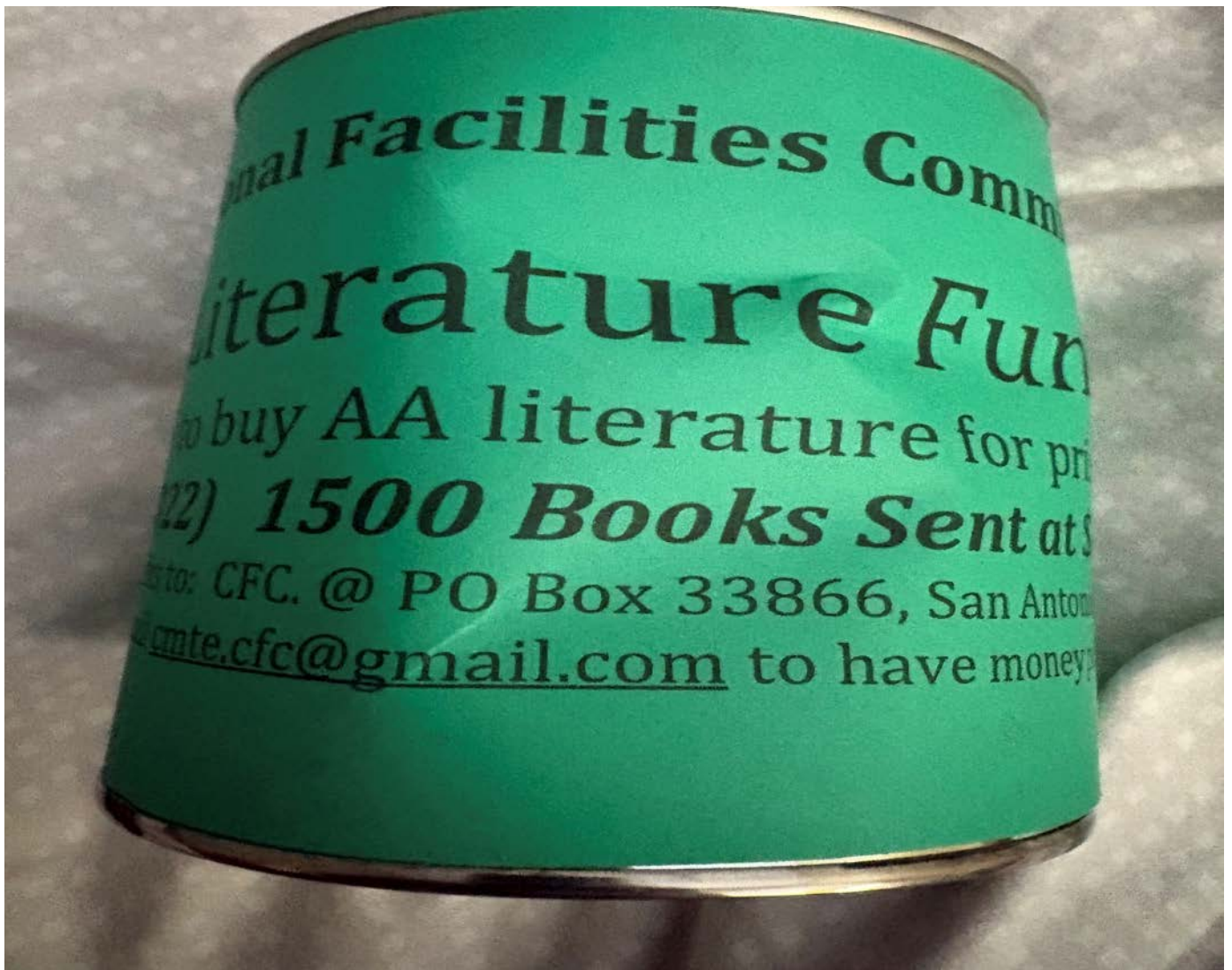
Richard G. was a very active member of the Spanish Intergroup; He was always available to talk to a newcomer going out of his way to be of service. He was instrumental in providing Spanish translations for the Central Service Office.

Danny H. very active with the Into Action Group in Lockheart. Danny had 22 years clean and sober. He was always available to help carry the message and talk to newcomers. He was also very active in-Service work, serving in many service positions.

Donna M was active member of the Rush Hour Group; she had just celebrated 53 years of sobriety. Was always ready to talk to newcomers and was involved in Group activities.

Mike M. was a member of the Serendipity Group. Mike celebrated 9 years of sobriety in September. He was always ready to lend a hand with Group activities and willing to help carry the message to newcomers.

Jesse G was a active member of Group 12. Jesse had 37 years of sobriety. Was always involved in Group functions and could be counted on to volunteer for service work, especially carrying the message to outside facilities.



THE CORRECTIONS COMMITTEE OF AA NEEDS YOUR HELP

The mission of the CFC Committee is to carry the message of recovery behind the walls of our jails and prisons. We do this by attending their meetings and sharing our experience and providing them AA Big Books and literature. We are completely dependent on the generosity of local members to provide them literature.

Post COVID in 2023, when we resumed meetings inside the prisons and jails, we had a major push on fund raising, (During all of COVID (2022-2023) we did not ask for funds. When we raised funds, this time, we had four members agree to match up to \$1,000 of the funds raised. The result was we raised slightly over \$9,000. Due to this, we did not push the use of green cans during the meetings. In 2024 we were allowed to bring in cases of books for the inmates attending AA meetings. This was a change from mailing books in and the result has been we have distributed over 850 Big Books with the funds raised. WE have been using the small Big Book, the stories in the back, at a cost of \$11.00 per book. (Now going up to \$14.00 per book. We also provide Big Books in Spanish and in Large Print on special occasions.

In 2025 TDCJ introduced tablets and arranged with Securus to provide secure access. Alcoholics Anonymous contracted with Securus Technologies to provide free access to the Big Book, the 12&12, As Bill Sees It, and The Daily Reflections, Inmates can only use the tablets in their Pods and if the malfunction or break the inmate needs to purchase his or her own if he/she wishes to use it. The tablets are ageing. Access to AA Literature requires you to be a little computer literate. You need to spell out correctly the exact title you are looking for. It is a frustrating process for many of them and we have begun giving specific written instructions of how to access the information better,

Since Securus has been instituted, the CFC Committee has agreed to pass out the pocket edition Big Book with the first 164 pages given that if they want access to the stories or Pod Cast, they can get them through Securus access. The cost per book has gone up from \$6.00 to \$9.00 so in this case we are saving \$2.00 over current prices and \$5.00 off new price.

From 1939 well into the 1940's, the Big Book was the only source of introduction to Alcoholism or recovery anyone had. This is much like the inmates we carry the message to. They are lucky if they get one meeting a week, sometimes only one meeting every two weeks. Big Book is their only source and connection to AA.

We desperately need your help in re-instituting the Green Can collections at meetings. We are asking you to pass it at least monthly and mail the check to PO BOX 33866 78265. If there is cash to be turned in call Mike C at 617-285-6453 and arrange for the money to be picked up or you can leave it at Central Service Office and we will forward to the CFC.

Green cans can be picked up at the CSOR meeting in March at the Alamo Hights Methodist Church at 6:30PM (Church entrance closest to Treeline Park and E Basse.) Also available at Central Service Office.

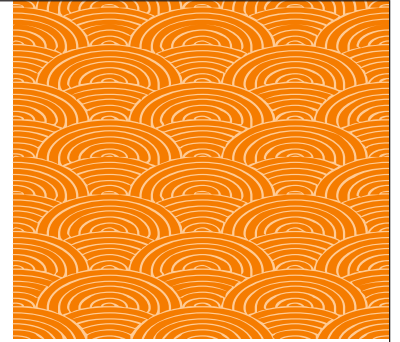

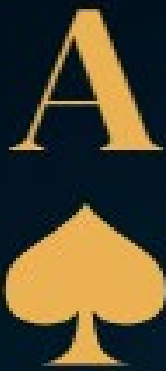

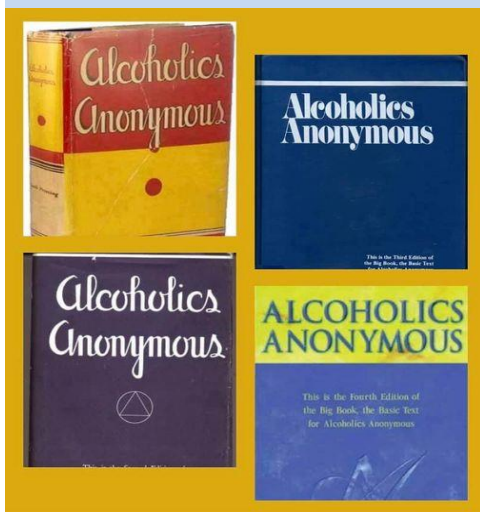
