# CHAIRMAN'S CORNER

## The Principle of Step Four: Courage

The spiritual principle behind Step Four is courage. When I think about courage, I often remember a quote that has been attributed to several figures over the years—among them Franklin D. Roosevelt, Mark Twain, and Nelson Mandela: “*Courage is not the absence of fear, but taking action even in the face of fear.*” Whether or not we know the exact source, the message resonates deeply with my experience in recovery.

In meetings I often hear phrases like, “Faith and fear cannot co-exist,” or “God never gives us more than we can handle.” When I first heard statements like these, I felt as if I must be doing something terribly wrong in my recovery, because I still experienced fear. If faith and fear truly couldn’t exist together, then what did that say about me?

One of the first thing I had to learn was the difference between danger and fear. It's OK to be fearful in a dangerous situation. Thankfully I'm not in as many dangerous situations at this point in my life as I was growing up. Then I had to learn about self centered fear and the realization that a lot of my fear was just that. I don't want to look ridiculous, I don't want to bumble, I don't want to draw attention to myself for fear of being perceived as foolish. I had a business associate tell me that being fearful/nervous was normal and meant I cared about what I was doing. Now I was really confused.

Over time, my understanding began to change. Today I know that I can walk through whatever comes my way—even when fear is present—because I have faith. The difference is not that fear disappears, but that faith grows and allows me to move forward anyway. I have also come to believe that life often does give me more than I can handle by myself. But it is not more than I can handle **with my Higher Power**. As the *Big Book* reminds us, “*All men of faith have courage.*” It also instructs us: “*We ask Him to remove our fear and direct our attention to what He would have us be. At once, we commence to outgrow fear.*”

What I finally landed on, and what works for me, is that it's OK for me to have fear and nervousness as long as it doesn't keep me from moving forward. Heck, I'm even nervous writing these articles. I can cry (and I have), I can feel like crumbling (and I have), I can balk (and I have) as long as I then keep putting one foot in front of the other. To me that is courage. I could be wrong, but I don't ever see me completely outgrowing fear forever, but I do hope that I can continue to move forward with faith in spite of my fear in every given moment.

## GSO and AAWS Updates

### Highlights from the General Service Office and AA World Services

Regional Forums give A.A. members the opportunity to connect directly with trustees, directors, and GSO Staff while learning more about the Service Structure.

#### ***About A.A. – Winter 2026***

The General Service Office has released the Winter 2026 issue of About A.A., a newsletter prepared for professionals who work with individuals affected by alcoholism. The publication helps medical, legal, counseling, and treatment professionals better understand Alcoholics Anonymous and how they can cooperate with A.A. while respecting the Fellowship’s Traditions.

#### ***GSO Retrofit Update***

The retrofit project at the General Service Office in New York continues to move toward completion. As part of the renovation, GSO and AA Grapevine operations will be consolidated on the 11th floor of 475 Riverside Drive. Bringing departments together is expected to improve communication and collaboration among the service entities that support A.A. groups throughout the United States and Canada.

#### ***Financial Stewardship and the Seventh Tradition***

Recent communications from GSO continue to highlight the importance of self-support through the Seventh Tradition. While literature sales remain strong, contributions from members and groups remain essential to support the services that help A.A. carry its message worldwide.

#### ***New Educational Resource: Twelve Concepts Video***

AA World Services has released a new animated video explaining the Twelve Concepts for World Service. Based on the pamphlet Twelve Concepts Illustrated, the short video uses a whiteboard-style presentation to explain A.A.’s service structure and the roles shared throughout the Fellowship.
