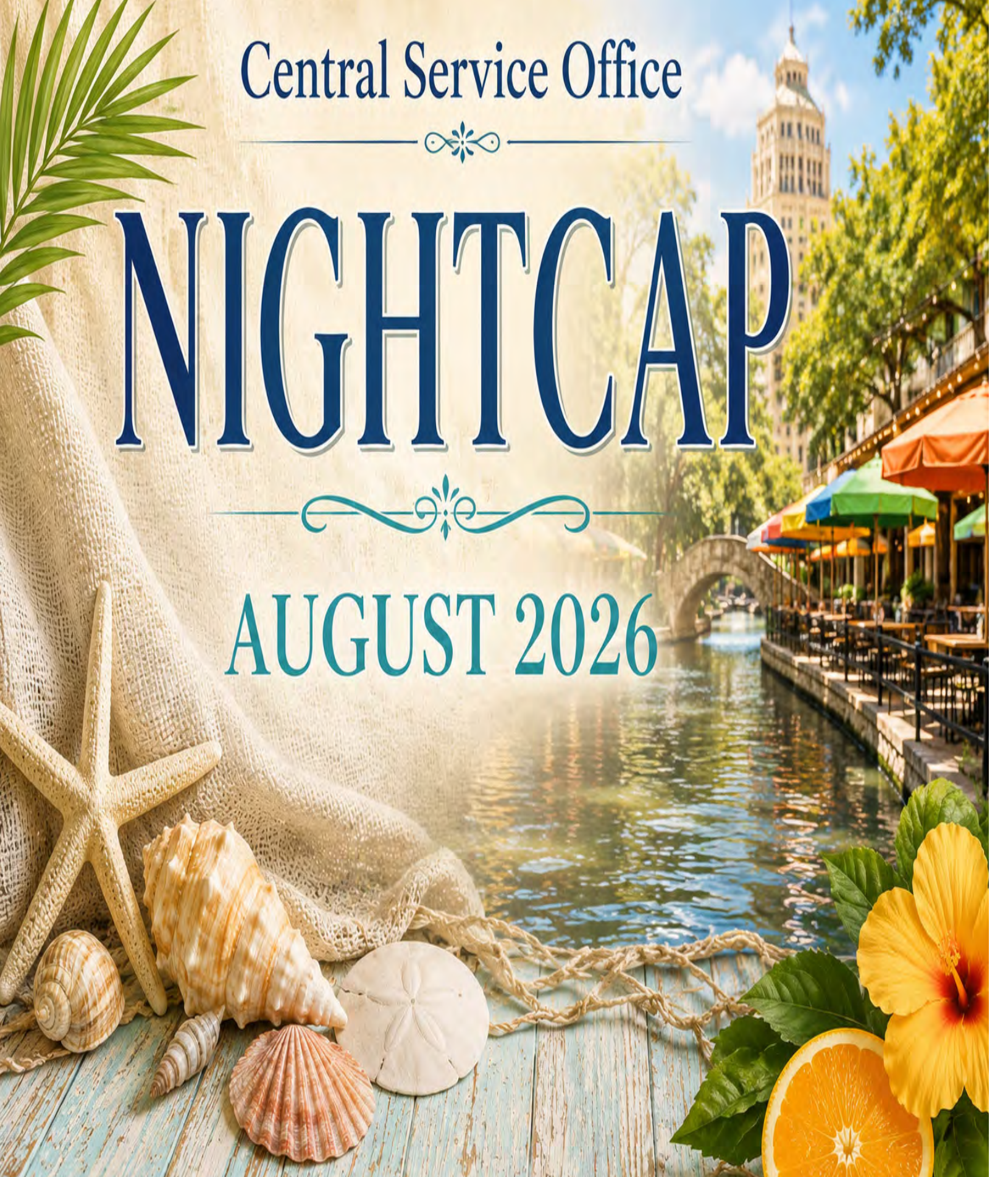

Chairman's Corner

“It doesn’t make much sense when a real tosspot calls a kettle black.” — Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions, p. 78

Hello, my name is Lori, and I’m a tosspot.

When I began my journey in AA, I was completely convinced that if the circumstances and people in my life had been different, I wouldn’t be an alcoholic. It made me drink. They made me drink. My drinking, I believed, was simply a reasonable response to unreasonable people and situations.

At one point in therapy, I shared a few experiences from my past. The therapist looked at me and said, “Well, no wonder you drink.” That comment bought me another year or two of justification. (I never said he was a good therapist.)

Then I got to Step Four. For the first time, I began to see that perhaps I wasn’t simply the victim of my life. That realization was painful enough. It challenged a story I had been telling myself for years. And then I arrived at Step Eight.

The Twelve and Twelve doesn’t let me off the hook gently. It tells me to “fetch ourselves up sharply.” It tells me to “redouble” my efforts. It reminds me that I agreed to “go to any length.” Those aren’t comforting words. They’re wake-up calls. I needed every one of them to honestly make my list of all the people I had harmed.

As I examined my resentments, something uncomfortable happened. I began seeing myself in the very people I was judging.

I was angry at those who seemed to have abandoned me—but hadn’t I isolated myself and left friends hanging when they needed me?

I grieved the childhood I wished I’d had—but hadn’t I fallen short at times with my own children?

I resented people for not giving me the respect I thought I deserved—but hadn’t I spent far too much time criticizing, bad-mouthing, and undermining those same people?

Tossplot, meet kettle.

That wasn’t an easy realization, but it was a freeing one.

Step Eight wasn’t about piling on shame. It was about becoming willing to set things right. It was about accepting responsibility for my part instead of continuing to keep score of everyone else’s failings. It invited me to stop living as a perpetual victim and begin living as a responsible human being. Today, I no longer see myself as a victim of life. I am an active participant in it.

I’m certainly not perfect. I still make mistakes. But today I recognize that I’m simply a card-carrying faulty human being. And so is everyone else.

totaling \$29,642.31 years to date. Total income for June was \$21,501.81; \$153,495.81 years to date. Total cost of goods sold for June is \$5,319.16. Our gross profit was \$13,696.08 for June; totaling \$96,151.82 years to date. Total expenses for the month of June \$20,641.93; totaling \$94,578.92 year to date. Net income (\$6,945.85) for the month of June; totaling \$1,652.28 years to date. Sylvia explained that the spreadsheet has changed a bit, and she explained it to the CSOR's. Also, there were a lot of anonymous donations for the month of June. If any group needs anything printed, please go to the CSO, they will give a way better price than any other place. As always, if anyone wants a more detailed report, feel free to reach out to the CSO office and ask for access, it is available to anyone in AA.

Jim stated that sales are down a little and foot traffic to the office is next to nothing and would encourage people to come down and visit. Also, if anyone would like a copy of the total expense report for Weekend in SA; just email or call Jim and he will email it to you. The Eighth Tradition

Alcoholics Anonymous should remain forever nonprofessional, but our service centers may employ special workers.



Spiritual as it is, A.A. remains very much of this world. The Eighth Tradition, like the Seventh, focuses on a vulgar five-letter word that isn't actually mentioned in either: money. Many of us have had to explain to some cynical prospect, "No, I'm not a social worker. I don't get paid for talking with you. I'm doing it because it's the best way to stay sober myself."

This does not mean, of course, that the idea of turning professional has never entered any A.A.'s mind. In the lean years, Bill W. did think of becoming a lay therapist to earn money through his experience in helping alcoholics. But, with a strong nudge from the group conscience, he soon realized that he could never hang out a shingle reading "Bill W., A.A. Therapist, \$10 an Hour"! It became clear to the early members that no A.A. should ever ask or accept payment for "carrying this message to somebody else, person to person and face to face."

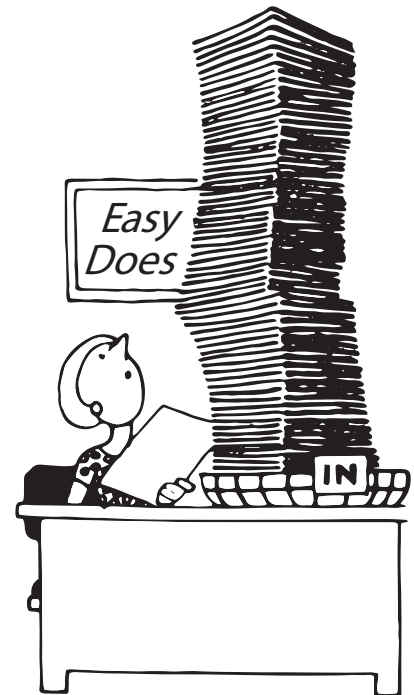


But new questions arose as membership grew and the word of hope spread, sending thousands of alcoholics in search of A.A. The first intergroups or central offices were usually manned by A.A. volunteers; now, most such offices are so busy that full-time employees are needed as well. Naturally, A.A.'s are better suited to such jobs than are nonmembers — but are these A.A.'s then being paid for doing Twelfth Step work? No. In the office, they are just paving the way for this work. Arranging to get a sick drunk into a hospital, telling a shaky newcomer where the nearest meeting is tonight, they are helping to make it possible for that alcoholic to hear the message “person to person and face to face.”

A similar development has taken place at the Fellowship's “headquarters.” Once a tiny office for one co-founder (Bill) and one secretary, it has grown into the present General Service Office, fully staffed, with a big mailroom keeping the lines of communication open throughout A.A. worldwide. The employees, both A.A. and nonalcoholic, are paid on a scale comparable to that in profit-making enterprises, so that the office force can function depend-

ably. And the A.A. staff members are in exactly the same position as the A.A. intergroup employees. Suppose you drop in at GSO one day when you're in New York. Staff members who pause to chat with you may have been working on next year's Conference or corresponding with a group in your home area, helping it to carry the message more effectively. For that, they are paid biweekly checks. But you may also hear them mention to other staff members plans for taking a newcomer to a meeting in the evening or for giving an A.A. talk to a neighborhood group the next week. For that, they are paid only with their own continuing sobriety.

In these office jobs and in other assignments, members are actually paid for their business and professional skills. Working at a GSO desk, on Conference-approved books and pamphlets, or on the Grapevine, these A.A.'s use their abilities as correspondents, managers, writers, editors, artists, proofreaders — as well as their understanding of A.A. from the inside. On occasion, volunteers have given their time and talent to all these services, and their contributions are deeply appreciated. But what if the Fellowship decided that all such assignments should be handled *only* by unpaid volunteers? In present-day A.A., there's too great a volume of work to be done in spare hours here and there, and only the rich or the retired could afford to work full-time as volunteers. If we tried to find in this limited group people qualified for particular tasks, obviously the field would be narrowed down — too often, down to nobody at all.



There would be another problem in using volunteers alone: It seems ungrateful — or, at least, it's socially awkward — to criticize or reject a job done for free. But paid jobs for A.A. get quite a going-over! Take our literature, for instance (like this pamphlet). Whatever the subject, we want to be sure that each piece expresses as clearly as possible the view of the group conscience of A.A. as a whole. So any new project must first be approved by the Conference. Once it is in process, the Literature Committee of the General Service Board keeps a careful eye on it at every stage. Frequently, drastic changes are required. The “finished” product then must be okayed both by that committee and by the Conference Literature Committee, and further revisions are often —

“Now wait a minute!” some old-timer may interrupt. “What's going on here? Didn't Dr. Bob say, ‘Let's keep it simple?’”...
