CHAIRMAN'S CORNER

I want to share some of my experience with the results of working the Steps. Many people refer to these as the “Ninth Step Promises,” but to me, that phrase can sound a little mystical—almost magical. Practical experience, mine and others, has shown me something different: **these aren't magic. They are the results of working the Steps.**

“We are going to know a new freedom and a new happiness.” — *p. 83*

When I first came into AA, I was excited because I thought this meant I was going to be able to do anything my little heart desired. What I've come to understand is that freedom isn't anarchy. For me, freedom looks like being able to walk through H-E-B without checking around every corner before I turn down an aisle. It's the freedom to be myself, in my own skin, without constantly changing who I am to fit the people or circumstances around me. It's the freedom to take up space simply because I exist. **I don't have to earn the right to be here.**

And the happiness I experience today is more like joy. To me, happiness can be externally dependent. Someone brings me a beautiful plant, and it makes me happy. But joy is different. Joy is an internal condition. I can experience joy even if no one brings me a plant. Working these Steps has given me a kind of joy I didn't even know existed.

The Big Book also tells us, “We will not regret the past nor wish to shut the door on it.” — *p. 83* It goes on to say that no matter how far down the scale we have gone, we will see how our experience can benefit others. I guarantee you, I never thought that would become a reality for me.

From my very first drink, I was trying to forget where I was and who I was. Then I came into AA and read that I wouldn't regret my past—and that my experience could actually benefit someone else? Madness!

But guess what I found out? **It's true.** And it is a result of working the Steps.

All my bad choices, all my ridiculous behavior, and all the abuse—physical, emotional, sexual, and religious—that I once believed had only caused damage has become something I can use to help others who may be struggling. When someone in the program shares something they are going through and I recognize that pain because I've been there, I no longer feel quite so alone—and neither do they.

That's the power of the **we** in this program.

AA has given value to experiences I once thought were completely worthless, except for the damage they caused. What I once wanted desperately to erase has become part of the experience I can use to help another person.

What a gift.

Another promise says, “Fear of people and of economic insecurity will leave us.” — *p. 84*

Here’s a quick story. A couple of years ago, I received a mild reprimand at work. It wasn’t a catastrophe. It wasn’t the end of the world. But within a microsecond, my mind had me unemployed, homeless, and living in my car. My whole being was shaken by fear.

The result of working these Steps is not that I don’t feel fear anymore. I do. The difference is that the fear doesn’t have to take over. The feeling came—but it didn’t last.

The absolute terror of economic insecurity didn’t become the driving force behind my decisions. That doesn’t mean I’m rolling in money or that I never have financial worries. It means fear no longer gets to run my life.

And that, to me, is freedom.

A lot of us like to focus on the Ninth Step Promises, and they are beautiful. But I want to challenge you to look a little deeper. **Find the promises associated with each Step.**

They’re there. I’ve read them. I’ve lived them. I’ve shared them.

And the more I work the Steps, the more I realize that the promises aren’t something that magically appear at the end. They show up along the way.

They show up in the freedom to be myself. They show up in the ability to look at my past without running from it. They show up when my experience helps someone else. They show up when fear comes knocking—and I don’t have to answer the door.

For me, the Steps haven’t given me a perfect life.

They have given me a life I no longer need to escape from.

And that is a promise worth living.

GSO's *Our Primary Purpose* Podcast Returns

Most A.A. members know the General Service Office exists, but many have only a general idea of what happens there each day. The official GSO podcast, *Our Primary Purpose*, helps bridge that gap.

Alcoholics Anonymous World Services recently announced the release of Season Two of the podcast, featuring eight new episodes that take listeners behind the scenes of the Fellowship's service structure.

Rather than focusing solely on business meetings or committee work, the series shares the stories behind the services that help carry A.A.'s message every day. Listeners will hear conversations about how A.A. cooperates with professionals while maintaining its Tradition of nonaffiliation, explore fifty years of the GSO Archives, discover how the Fellowship reaches alcoholics in diverse communities, and even enjoy a creative radio drama illustrating the Twelve Traditions in action.

Other episodes explore the General Service structure, the Seventh Tradition, accessibility, literature development, and the many ways A.A. continues to reach "anyone, anywhere" who has a desire to stop drinking. Throughout the season, members share personal experience that demonstrates how service not only strengthens the Fellowship, but often deepens individual recovery as well.

Whether you've served as a GSR for years or have simply wondered what happens beyond your home group, *Our Primary Purpose* offers an engaging introduction to the work that supports Alcoholics Anonymous throughout the U.S. and Canada. Episodes are available on the major podcast platforms and can be enjoyed during a commute, walk, or quiet evening at home.



SIDEBAR: HAVE YOU READ BOX 4-5-9?

While the podcast provides an audio look at the work of the General Service Office, **Box 4-5-9** remains one of the best written resources for staying informed about A.A. service.

Published quarterly by the General Service Office, **Box 4-5-9** includes updates from trustees and GSO departments, news about literature and service activities, reports from around the Fellowship, and a calendar of upcoming events.

It offers members an easy way to stay connected with what's happening beyond the local group while gaining a better understanding of how the General Service Conference, the General Service Board, and A.A. World Services support our common welfare.

If you've never read an issue, consider making it part of your recovery reading.

It's an excellent companion to the *Our Primary Purpose* podcast and another way to see how countless trusted servants quietly help carry A.A.'s message every day.

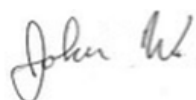

Dear A.A. Friends:

We are writing to provide an update regarding the forthcoming publication of the much-anticipated fifth edition of *Alcoholics Anonymous*. At the July 30 meeting of the A.A. World Services Board, the Publishing Committee recommended, and the full board approved, that the fifth edition hardcover be produced with a removable dust jacket and that a list price of \$20 USD be adopted. We are on track with the production process to publish the hardcover of the fifth edition, updated with 26 new stories of recovery, in February 2027.

We share the Fellowship's excitement about the fifth edition of our beloved Big Book—coming more than 25 years after the publication of the fourth edition. More information about the publication of the fifth edition will follow this fall.

Board of Trustees.

Reviewed and approved June minutes; with no amendments.

Financial Report: Sylvia reported that SA CSO financials are in good standing. Contributions for July were \$9,047.05. Total contributions were \$48,738.41 years to date. This has now put us over our projected contribution for the year. Sales revenue for July is \$13,736.33; totaling \$97,964.28 years to date. All non-A.A. revenue for July were \$5,039.42; totaling \$34,681.73 years to date. Total income for July was \$22,783.38; \$176,368.98 years to date. Total cost of goods sold for July is \$5,935.14. Our gross profit was \$14,151.39 for July; totaling \$110,393.00 years to date. Total expenses for the month of July \$15,454.81; totaling \$107,150.95 year to date. Net income (\$1,303.42) for the month of July; totaling \$3,343.90 years to date.

-Financial Report was approved.

Service Opportunity Reports from Inter-Service Representatives: The Inter-Service Committee Chair, Becky stated that all chair positions have been filled and now they are starting to meet. Planning to have a service workshop in Februarys, if anyone has any experience with hosting this workshop, please contact Becky. The Ninth Tradition

A.A., as such, ought never be organized but we may create service boards or committees directly responsible to those they serve.



The words “Let’s keep it simple” were the last Bill W. heard from his fellow founder of A.A., shortly before Dr. Bob’s death in 1950. Aware that “it” means our *recovery* program, Bill later wrote, “We need to distinguish sharply between spiritual simplicity and functional simplicity. ...When we get into questions of action by groups, by areas, and by A.A. as a whole, we find that we must to some extent *organize* to carry the message — or else face chaos. And chaos is not simplicity.”

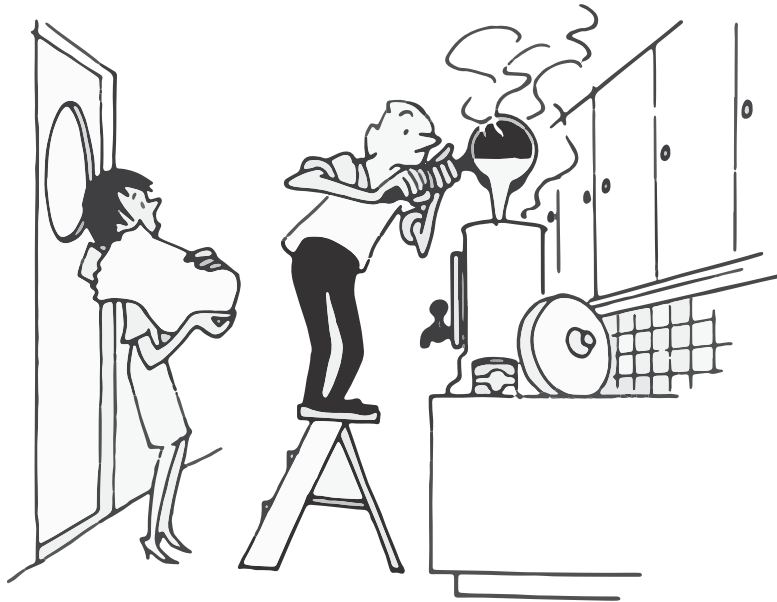
When Tradition Nine speaks of “A.A. as such,” it goes to the heart of the A.A. experience, to the “spiritual simplicity” of one alcoholic’s saying, silently perhaps, “Help!” and another alcoholic’s answering, “I know how you feel. We’re here to help you.” Such a relationship couldn’t be organized. Or could it?

A nonmember familiar with modern business procedures might examine the A.A. practice of sponsorship and see it as a haphazard operation. How about computerizing it? Then an A.A. behind an intergroup desk might say, “So you want help? First, you need the right sponsor. We have personality profiles of all our sponsors fed into our computer. We’ll match you up to the best one for you if you’ll just fill out this questionnaire. ...Where are you going? Come back!” *That* would be an attempt to organize “A.A. as such.” (Please — nobody get any ideas!)

But in “action by groups,” we find that we do need some degree of organization. If everybody thinks somebody else is going to make the coffee, what’s the result? No coffee! To avoid such a disaster, one or more members agree

But whether they make coffee. . . or help organize





to be responsible for preparing meeting refreshments. All the way from coffee-brewers to trustees on the General Service Board, those who take part in A.A. service work are assuming responsibility — *not* taking on authority. (Here, Traditions Two and Nine interlock.) Group officers are responsible to the members of the group; intergroup committees, to the groups in one locality; institutions committees, to A.A. groups in treatment facilities and correctional facilities; area committees, to all groups in their areas; Conference delegates and committees, to all groups in the U.S. and Canada; the General Service Office and Board and the board's committees, to all groups and members everywhere.

In an average business corporation, the board has final power to determine company plans and policy. Our board of trustees serves in a custodial capacity; trustees vote at the Conference — but as individuals, with one vote apiece. In industry, branch offices jump when the home office speaks. Our GSO is just a clearinghouse of A.A. information, offering *suggestions* based on experiences reported to it by groups.

And yet, with so small a degree of organization, A.A. miraculously does work! One reason may be that Tradition Five applies to each A.A. committee and board as directly as it does to each A.A. group. By cleaving to this “one primary purpose” in all its activities, the Fellowship retains “spiritual simplicity.” To diffuse that purpose, to embroil A.A. in issues apart from its true concern, would create dangerous complications....
